- 1 AN ACT concerning higher education.
- 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,
- 3 represented in the General Assembly:
- 4 Section 5. The Board of Higher Education Act is amended
- 5 by adding Section 9.30 as follows:
- 6 (110 ILCS 205/9.30 new)
- 7 <u>Sec. 9.30. Reciprocal pilot program with Mexico.</u>
- 8 (a) The Board of Higher Education shall, in coordination
- 9 <u>with appropriate Mexican authorities</u>, <u>develop a 5-year</u>
- 10 reciprocal pilot program that would enable 1,000 Illinois
- 11 residents to attend institutions of higher education in
- 12 <u>Mexico each academic year and 1,000 Mexican residents to</u>
- 13 <u>attend public universities in Illinois each academic year.</u>
- 14 The program must include without limitation all of the
- 15 <u>following provisions:</u>
- 16 <u>(1) A provision requiring students to obtain</u>
- 17 <u>admission to a participating institution of higher</u>
- 18 <u>education in accordance with the standards and procedures</u>
- 19 <u>of that institution in order to participate in the</u>

- 4 (b) The Board of Higher Education must submit a written
- 5 <u>evaluation of the program to the General Assembly and the</u>
- 6 Governor on or before January 1, 2008.
- 7 (c) This Section is repealed on January 1, 2009.
- 8 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon
- 9 becoming law.
