- 4 Section 5. The Higher Education Student Assistance Act is
- 5 amended by adding Section 65.70 as follows:
- 6 (110 ILCS 947/65.70 new)
- 7 <u>Sec. 65.70. Optometric Education Scholarship Program.</u>
- 8 (a) The General Assembly finds and declares that the
- 9 provision of graduate education leading to a doctoral degree
- 10 <u>in optometry for persons of this State who desire such an</u>
- 11 <u>education is important to the health and welfare of this</u>
- 12 <u>State and Nation and, consequently, is an important public</u>
- 13 purpose. Many qualified potential optometrists are deterred
- 14 by financial considerations from pursuing their optometric
- 15 <u>education with consequent irreparable loss to the State and</u>
- 16 Nation of talents vital to health and welfare. A program of
- 17 <u>scholarships, repayment of which may be excused if the</u>
- 18 <u>individual practices professional optometry in this State,</u>

- 1 (c) Each year the Commission shall award 10 scholarships 2 under this Section among applicants qualified pursuant to subsection (b). Two of these scholarships each shall be 3 4 awarded to eligible applicants enrolled in their first year, second year, third year, and fourth year. The remaining 2 5 scholarships shall be awarded to any level of student. The 6 Commission shall receive funding for the scholarships through 7 8 appropriations from the Optometric Licensing and Disciplinary 9 Board Fund. If in any year the number of qualified applicants exceeds the number of scholarships to be awarded, the 10 11 Commission shall give priority in awarding scholarships to students demonstrating exceptional merit and who are in 12 financial need. A scholarship shall be in the amount of 13 \$5,000 each year applicable to tuition and fees. 14 (d) The total amount of scholarship assistance awarded 15 16 by the Commission under this Section to an individual in any given fiscal year, when added to other financial assistance 17 awarded to that individual for that year, shall not exceed 18
- 21 (e) A recipient may receive up to 8 semesters or 12 22 quarters of scholarship assistance under this Section.

- (f) Subject to a separate appropriation made for such purposes, payment of any scholarship awarded under this Section shall be determined by the Commission. All scholarship funds distributed in accordance with this Section shall be paid to the institution on behalf of the recipients. Scholarship funds are applicable toward 2 semesters or 3 quarters of enrollment within an academic year.
- 30 (g) The Commission shall administer the Optometric
 31 Education Scholarship Program established by this Section and
 32 shall make all necessary and proper rules not inconsistent
 33 with this Section for its effective implementation.
- 34 (h) Prior to receiving scholarship assistance for any

1 academic year, each recipient of a scholarship awarded under 2 this Section shall be required by the Commission to sign an agreement under which the recipient pledges that, within the 3 4 one-year period following the termination of the academic program for which the recipient was awarded a scholarship, 5 the recipient shall practice in this State as a licensed 6 optometrist under the Illinois Optometric Practice Act of 7 8 1987 for a period of not less than one year for each year of 9 scholarship assistance awarded under this Section. Each recipient shall, upon request of the Commission, provide the 10 Commission with evidence that he or she is fulfilling or has 11 fulfilled the terms of the practice agreement provided for in 12 13 this subsection. (i) If a recipient of a scholarship awarded under this 14 Section fails to fulfill the practice obligation set forth in 15 16 subsection (h) of this Section, the Commission shall require the recipient to repay the amount of the scholarships 17 received, prorated according to the fraction of the 18 obligation not completed, plus interest at a rate of 5% and, 19 if applicable, reasonable collection fees. The Commission is 20 authorized to establish rules relating to its collection 21 activities for repayment of scholarships under this Section. 22 (j) A recipient of a scholarship awarded by the 23 Commission under this Section shall not be in violation of 24 25 the agreement entered into pursuant to subsection (h) if the recipient (i) is serving as a member of the armed services of 26 the United States; (ii) is enrolled in a residency program 27 following graduation at an approved institution; (iii) is 28 temporarily totally disabled, as established by sworn 29 affidavit of a qualified physician; or (iii) cannot fulfill 30 the employment obligation due to his or her death, 31 disability, or incompetency, as established by sworn 32 affidavit of a qualified physician. No claim for repayment 33 may be filed against the estate of such a decedent or 34

- 1 incompetent. Any extension of the period during which the
- 2 <u>employment requirement must be fulfilled shall be subject to</u>
- 3 <u>limitations of duration as established by the Commission.</u>
- 4 Section 10. The Illinois Optometric Practice Act of 1987
- is amended by changing Section 20 as follows:
- 6 (225 ILCS 80/20) (from Ch. 111, par. 3920)
- 7 (Section scheduled to be repealed on January 1, 2007)
- 8 Sec. 20. Fund. All moneys received by the Department
- 9 pursuant to this Act shall be deposited in the Optometric
- 10 Licensing and Disciplinary Board Fund, which is hereby
- 11 created as a special fund in the State Treasury, and shall be
- 12 used only for the administration of this Act, including: (a)
- 13 by the Board in the exercise of its powers and performance of
- 14 its duties, as such use is made by the Department with full
- 15 consideration of all recommendations of the Board; (b) for
- 16 costs directly related to license renewal of persons licensed
- 17 under this Act; and (c) for direct and allocable indirect

- 30 Fund may be invested and reinvested, with all earnings
- 31 received from such investment to be deposited in the
- 32 Optometric Licensing and Disciplinary Board Fund and used for

- 1 the same purposes as fees deposited in such fund.
- 2 Any monies in the Optometric Examining and Disciplinary
- 3 Board Fund on the effective date of this Act shall be
- 4 transferred to the Optometric Licensing and Disciplinary
- 5 Board Fund.
- 6 Any obligations of the Optometric Examining and
- 7 Disciplinary Board Fund unpaid on the effective date of this
- 8 Act shall be paid from the Optometric Licensing and
- 9 Disciplinary Board Fund.
