- 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,
- 3 represented in the General Assembly:
- 4 Section 5. The Humane Care for Animals Act is amended by
- 5 adding Section 3.03-1 as follows:
- 6 (510 ILCS 70/3.03-1 new)
- 7 <u>Sec. 3.03-1. Depiction of animal cruelty.</u>
- 8 (a) "Depiction of animal cruelty" means any visual or
- 9 <u>auditory depiction, including any photograph, motion-picture</u>
- 10 film, video recording, electronic image, or sound recording,
- 11 that would constitute a violation of Section 3.01, 3.02,
- 12 <u>3.03</u>, or 4.01 of the Humane Care for Animals Act or Section
- 13 <u>26-5 of the Criminal Code of 1961.</u>
- (b) No person may knowingly create, sell, market, offer
- to market or sell, or possess a depiction of animal cruelty.
- 16 No person may place that depiction in commerce for commercial
- 17 gain or entertainment. This Section does not apply when the
- 18 <u>depiction has religious, political, scientific, educational,</u>
- 19 <u>law enforcement or humane investigator training</u>,
- 20 journalistic, artistic, or historical value; or involves
- 21 rodeos, sanctioned livestock events, or normal husbandry
- 22 practices.
- 23 <u>The creation, sale, marketing, offering to sell or</u>
- 24 <u>market</u>, or <u>possession</u> of the depiction of animal cruelty is
- 25 <u>illegal regardless of whether the maiming, mutilation,</u>
- 26 torture, wounding, abuse, killing, or any other conduct took
- 27 place in this State.
- (c) Any person convicted of violating this Section is
- 29 guilty of a Class A misdemeanor. A second or subsequent
- 30 <u>violation is a Class 4 felony. In addition to any other</u>
- 31 penalty provided by law, upon conviction for violating this

1 Section, the court may order the convicted person to undergo 2 a psychological or psychiatric evaluation and to undergo any 3 treatment at the convicted person's expense that the court 4 determines to be appropriate after due consideration of the 5 evaluation. If the convicted person is a juvenile, the court 6 shall order the convicted person to undergo a psychological 7 or psychiatric evaluation and to undergo treatment that the court determines to be appropriate after due consideration of 8
