- 4 Section 5. The Children and Family Services Act is
- 5 amended by adding Section 5.25 as follows:

- 7 <u>Sec. 5.25. Child on ventilator; discharge from hospital.</u>
- 8 If (i) a child is medically ready to be discharged from a
- 9 <u>hospital and is dependent upon a ventilator to support</u>
- 10 <u>breathing</u> and (ii) the Department is responsible for placing
- 11 the child upon discharge from the hospital but cannot place
- 12 the child immediately upon discharge, with the result that
