1 STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION

2 Section 15. The sum of \$500,000,000, or so much thereof
3 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the School
4 Construction Fund to the Capital Development Board for school
5 construction grants pursuant to the School Construction Law,
6 in addition to amounts previously appropriated for such
7 purposes.

8 Section 16. The sum of \$25,000,000, or so much thereof
9 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital
10 Development Fund to the Board of Trustees of the University
11 of Illinois to plan and construct an Education and Research
12 facility for the College of Medicine in Chicago, including
13 planning, land acquisition, demolition, construction,
14 remodeling, landscaping, site improvements, equipment,
15 extension or modification of campus utility systems,
16 relocation of programs, and such expenses as may be necessary
17 to complete the facility. This appropriation is in addition
18 to funds previously appropriated.

19 Section 17. The sum of \$55,000,000, or so much thereof
20 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital
21 Development Fund to the Capital Development Board for the use
22 by the Department of Central Management Services for the
23 acquisition of real property and related expenses in and
24 around the Capitol Complex, in Springfield, Illinois, the
25 purchase price to be set at fair market value, as determined
26 by independent appraisal, pre-existing option, exercise of
27 right of first refusal or other appropriate means of
28 determining fair market value when the acquisition of such
29 property is deemed by the Director of the Department of
30 Central Management Services to be in the best interest of the
31 state.

1 Section 18. The sum of \$2,992,000, or so much thereof as
2 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital
3 Development Fund to the Board of Trustees of Northeastern
4 Illinois University to purchase equipment and remodel
5 buildings A, B and E. This appropriation is in addition to
6 any funds previously appropriated.

7 Section 19. The sum of \$6,000,000, or so much thereof as
8 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital
9 Development Fund to the Board of Trustees of Eastern Illinois
10 University to purchase equipment, renovate and expand Fine
11 Arts Center. This appropriation is in addition to any funds
12 previously appropriated.

13 Section 20. The sum of \$2,400,000, or so much thereof as
14 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital
15 Development Fund to the Board of Trustees of Chicago State
16 University to purchase equipment to complete the construction
17 of the Convocation Center. This appropriation is in addition
18 to any funds previously appropriated.

19 Section 21. The sum of \$3,944,000, or so much thereof as
20 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital
21 Development Fund to the Board of Trustees of Northern
22 Illinois University to purchase equipment for the College of
23 Business Building (Barsema Hall). This appropriation is in
24 addition to any funds previously appropriated.

25 Section 22. The sum of \$800,000, or so much thereof as
26 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital
27 Development Fund to the Board of Trustees of Southern
28 Illinois University at Carbondale to purchase equipment for
29 Altgeld Hall and the Old Baptist Foundation Building. This
30 appropriation is in addition to any funds previously

1 appropriated.

2 Section 23. The sum of \$15,000,000, or so much thereof
3 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital
4 Development Fund to the Board of Trustees of the University
5 of Illinois to plan and construct a Classroom and Office
6 Building at the Springfield Campus and related utility
7 systems, including planning, land acquisition, demolition,
8 construction, remodeling, landscaping, site improvements,
9 equipment, extension or modification of campus utility
10 systems, and such expenses as may be necessary to complete
11 the facility. This appropriation is in addition to funds
12 previously appropriated.

13 Section 24. The sum of \$3,600,000, or so much thereof as
14 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital
15 Development Fund to the Capital Development Board for
16 miscellaneous capital improvements at various educational
17 facilities statewide, in addition to funds previously
18 appropriated.

19 ARTICLE 1a

20 Section 1. The sum of \$1,000,000, or so much thereof as
21 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital
22 Development Fund to the Department of Commerce and Community
23 Affairs for a grant to Cypress Elementary School to repair
24 tornado damage to the school.

25 Section 2. The sum of \$1,000,000, or so much thereof as
26 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital
27 Development Fund to the Department of Commerce and Community
28 Affairs for a grant to the City of Sparta for sewer
29 construction and/or improvements at the American Trap

1 Shooters facility.

2 Section 3. The sum of \$150,000, or so much thereof as
3 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital
4 Development Fund to the Department of Commerce and Community
5 Affairs for a grant to Teutopolis High School for electrical
6 work and track lighting.

7 Section 4. The sum of \$200,000, or so much thereof as
8 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital
9 Development Fund to the Department of Commerce and Community

11 County for roof and other structural improvements.

12 Section 5. The sum of \$4,250,000, or so much thereof as
13 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital
14 Development Fund to the Department of Commerce and Community
15 Affairs for a grant to William Rainey Harper College for
16 bondable infrastructure improvements.

17 Section 6. The sum of \$1,000,000, or so much thereof as
18 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital
19 Development Fund to the Department of Commerce and Community
20 Affairs for a grant to the Village of Herscher for bondable
21 improvements associated with Phase 2 of a water main project.

22 Section 7. The sum of \$1,250,000, or so much thereof as
23 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital
24 Development Fund to the Department of Commerce and Community
25 Affairs for a grant to the City of Markham for bondable
26 street and drainage improvements.

27 Section 8. The amount of \$9,800,000, or so much thereof
28 as may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of

1 Commerce and Community Affairs from the Capital Development
 2 Bond Fund for grants to units of local government and
 3 educational facilities for municipal, recreational,
 4 educational and public safety infrastructure improvements and
 5 other expenses, including but not limited to planning,
 6 construction, reconstruction, renovation, utilities,
 7 equipment, public safety vehicles and related costs.

13 forth below.

14 Section 10A. The amount of \$8,387,599, or so much
15 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended on June
16 30, 2002, from appropriations heretofore made for such
17 purposes in Article 57, Division FY89, Section 10A of Public
18 Act 92-8, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build
19 Illinois Bond Fund to the Environmental Protection Agency for
20 grants to units of local government for sewer systems and
21 wastewater treatment facilities pursuant to rules and
22 procedures established under the Anti-Pollution Bond Act.

23 Section 10B. The amount of \$70,529,539, or so much
24 thereof as may be necessary, and remains unexpended on June
25 30, 2002, from appropriations heretofore made for such
26 purposes in Article 57, Division FY90, Section 10B of Public
27 Act 92-8, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build
28 Illinois Bond Fund to the Environmental Protection Agency for
29 wastewater compliance grants to units of local government or
30 sewer systems and wastewater treatment facilities pursuant to
31 procedures and rules established under the Anti-Pollution

1 Bond Act. These grants are limited to projects for which the
2 local government provides at least 30% of the project cost.
3 There is an approved project compliance plan, and there is an
4 enforceable compliance schedule prior to the grant award. The
5 grant award will be based on eligible project cost contained
6 in the approved compliance plan.

7 Section 10E. The amount of \$162,168, or so much thereof
8 as may be necessary, and remains unexpended on June 30, 2002
9 from appropriations heretofore made for such purposes in
10 Article 57, Division FY91, Section 10E of Public Act 92-8, as
11 amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
12 to the Capital Development Board for the University of
13 Illinois for miscellaneous capital improvements including
14 construction, reconstruction, remodeling, improvement, repair
15 and installation of capital facilities, costs of planning,
16 supplies, equipment, materials, services, and all other
17 expenses required to complete the work. This appropriation
18 shall be in addition to any other appropriated amounts which
19 can be expended for these purposes.

20 Section 10G. The amount of \$1,009,995, or so much
21 thereof as may be necessary, and remains unexpended on June
22 30, 2002 from appropriations heretofore made for such
23 purposes in Article 57, Division FY91, Section 10G of Public
24 Act 92-8, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build
25 Illinois Bond Fund to the Capital Development Board for the
26 Illinois Community College Board for grants to community
27 colleges repair, renovation, and miscellaneous capital
28 improvements including construction, reconstruction,
29 remodeling, improvement, repair and installation of capital
30 facilities, costs of planning, supplies, equipment,
31 materials, services, and all other expenses required to
32 complete the work. This appropriation shall be in addition

1 to any other appropriated amounts which can be expended for
2 these purposes.

3 Division 9999. This Division contains provisions
4 governing the expenditure of funds appropriated in these
5 Articles.

6 No contract shall be entered into or obligation incurred
7 for any expenditures from the appropriations made in this
8 Article until after the purposes and amounts have been
9 approved in writing by the Governor.

ARTICLE 4

11 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect on
12 July 1, 2002.
