AN ACT making appropriations.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,represented in the General Assembly:

ARTICLE 1

5 Section 1. The following named amounts, or so much 6 thereof as may be necessary, respectively, are appropriated 7 for the objects and purposes hereinafter named, to meet the 8 ordinary and contingent expenses of the Historic Preservation 9 Agency:

The sum of \$225,000 or so much thereof as 4 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Historic 5 Sites Fund to the Historic Preservation Agency for the 6 ordinary and contingent expenses of the Historical Library 7 including microfilming Illinois newspapers and manuscripts 8 and performing genealogical research.

9 Section 3. The following named sums, or so much thereof 10 as may be necessary, respectively, for the objects and 11 purposes hereinafter named, are appropriated to meet the 12 ordinary and contingent expenses of the Historic Preservation 13 Agency:

The sum of \$150,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Historic 21 22 Sites Fund to the Historic Preservation Agency for awards and 23 grants for historic preservation programs made either independently or in cooperation with the Federal Government 24 25 or any agency thereof, any municipal corporation, or political subdivision of the State, or with any public or 26 private corporation, organization, or individual. 27

Section 3b. The sum of \$150,000, new appropriation, and the sum of \$103,324, or so much thereof as may be necessary and as remains unexpended at the close of business on June 30, 2002, from appropriations and reappropriations heretofore made in Article 70, Section 3c of Public Act 92-8, as

1 amended, is reappropriated from the Illinois Historic Sites 2 Fund to the Historic Preservation Agency for awards and for historic preservation programs made either 3 grants 4 independently or in cooperation with the Federal Government 5 agency thereof, any municipal corporation, or or any б political subdivision of the State, or with any public or 7 private corporation, organization, or individual.

The sum of \$312,900, or so much thereof as 8 Section 3c. may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue 9 10 Fund to the Historic Preservation Agency to make Illinois 11 Heritage Grants for the purpose of planning, survey, rehabilitation, restoration, reconstruction, landscaping and 12 acquisition of Illinois properties designated on the National 13 14 Register of Historic Places or as a landmark based on a 15 county or municipal ordinance or those located within certain historic districts deemed historically significant. 16

17 Section 3d. The sum of \$370,300, new appropriation, and the sum of \$425,341, or so much thereof as may be necessary 18 19 and as remains unexpended at the close of business on June 20 30, 2002, from reappropriations heretofore made in Article 21 70, Section 3e of Public Act 92-8, as amended, is reappropriated from the General Revenue Fund to the Historic 22 23 Preservation Agency to make Illinois Heritage Grants for the 24 purpose of planning, survey, rehabilitation, restoration, landscaping and acquisition of 25 reconstruction, Illinois properties designated on the National Register of 26 Historic 27 Places or as a landmark based on a county or municipal 28 ordinance or those located within certain historic districts deemed historically significant. 29

30 Section 4. The following named amounts, or so much 31 thereof as may be necessary, respectively, are appropriated

Section 5a. The sum of \$600,000, or so much thereof as 5 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Historic 6 7 Sites Fund to the Historic Preservation Agency for operations, maintenance, repairs, permanent improvements, 8 special events, and all other costs related to the operation 9 10 of Illinois Historic Sites and only to the extent which donations are received at Illinois State Historic Sites. 11

Section 5b. The sum of \$679,000, or so much thereof as 12 13 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Historic 14 Preservation Agency from the General Revenue Fund for programs and purposes including repairing, maintaining, 15 reconstructing, rehabilitating, replacing, fixed 16 assets, 17 construction and development, studies, all costs for supplies, materials, labor, land acquisition and its related 18 19 costs, services and other expenses at historic sites.

20 Section 5c. The sum of \$1,600,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, and as remains unexpended at the close of 21 22 business on June 30, 2002, from appropriations heretofore made in Article 70, Section 5c of Public Act 92-8, as 23 amended, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund 24 to the Historic Preservation Agency for a grant to the Lake 25 26 County Forest Preserve District for planning, construction 27 and renovation of the Adlai Stevenson Home State Historic Site. 28

29 Section 6. The sum of \$70,490, or so much thereof as may 30 be necessary and as remains unexpended at the close of

business on June 30, 2002, from appropriations heretofore made in Article 70, Section 7 of Public Act 92-8, as amended, is reappropriated from the General Revenue Fund to the Historic Preservation Agency for the restoration of the Jarrot Mansion.

6 Section 7. The amount of \$31,400, or so much thereof as 7 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of 8 business on June 30, 2002, from a reappropriation heretofore 9 made for such purpose in Article 70, Section 8 of Public Act 10 92-8, as amended, is reappropriated from the General Revenue 11 Fund to the Historic Preservation Agency for planning a new 12 historical library and Lincoln Center.

13 Section 8. The amounts appropriated for repairs and 14 maintenance and other capital improvements in Section 5b of Article for repairs and/or replacements, 15 this and miscellaneous capital improvements at the agency's various 16 17 historical sites, and are to include construction, 18 reconstruction, improvements, repairs and installation of 19 capital facilities, costs of planning, supplies, materials, 20 and all other types of repairs and maintenance, and capital 21 improvements.

No contract shall be entered into or obligation incurred for repairs and maintenance and other capital improvements from appropriations made in Section 5c of this Article until after the purposes and amounts have been approved in writing by the Governor.

27 Section 9. The sum of \$46,867, or so much thereof as may 28 be necessary, and remains unexpended at the close of business 29 on June 30, 2002, from an appropriation heretofore made in 30 Article 70, Section 12 of Public Act 92-8, as amended, is 31 reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund to the

Historic Preservation Agency for improvements to the Galena
 State Historic Sites for the Ulysses S. Grant Visitors
 Center.

Section 10. The sum of \$171,551, or so much thereof as 4 5 may be necessary, and remains unexpended at the close of business on June 30, 2002, from an appropriation heretofore 6 made in Article 70, Section 13 of Public Act 92-8, as 7 amended, is reappropriated from the Fund for Illinois' Future 8 to the Historic Preservation Agency for grants to units of 9 10 local government, educational facilities, and not-for-profit 11 organizations for infrastructure improvements, including but 12 not limited to planning, construction, reconstruction, renovation, equipment, utilities and vehicles. 13

14 Section 11. The sum of \$15,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, and remains unexpended at the close of 15 business on June 30, 2002, from an appropriation heretofore 16 17 made in Article 70, Section 15 of Public Act 92-8, as amended, is reappropriated from the Fund for Illinois' Future 18 19 to the Historic Preservation Agency for grants to units of 20 local government and not-for-profit organizations for 21 infrastructure improvements, including but not limited to 22 planning, construction, renovation, restoration and 23 equipment.

Section 12. The sum of \$437,800, or so much thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business on June 30, 2002, from an appropriation heretofore made in Article 70, Section 16 of Public Act 92-8, as amended, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund to the Historic Preservation Agency for costs associated with the acquisition of Sugar Loaf and/or Fox Mounds.
