- A staff assistant shall not be awarded any compensatory time off if it is the intention or expectation of the person awarding that time off that it be used by the staff assistant to participate in any of the activities restricted by this subsection.
- A staff assistant shall not be required at any time to participate in any of the activities restricted by this subsection in return for that staff assistant being awarded any additional compensation or employee benefit, in the form of a bonus or otherwise.
- A staff assistant shall not be awarded any additional compensation or employee benefit, in the form of a bonus or otherwise, if it is the intention or expectation of the person awarding the additional compensation or employee benefit that, in return, the staff assistant will participate in any of the activities restricted by this subsection.
- A person is guilty of a Class 1 felony if that person intentionally violates any provision of this subsection with respect to a staff assistant under that person's supervision or control.
- In addition to any other penalty that may apply, whether

 criminal or civil, (i) a member of the General Assembly who

 intentionally violates any provision of this subsection is
