AN ACT concerning criminal law.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 5. The Criminal Code of 1961 is amended by 5 adding Section 12-7.5 as follows:

6 (720 ILCS 5/12-7.5 new)

7 <u>Sec. 12-7.5.</u> Cyberstalking.

8 <u>(a) A person commits cyberstalking when he or she,</u> 9 <u>knowingly and without lawful justification, on at least 2</u> 10 <u>separate occasions, harasses another person through the use</u> 11 <u>of electronic communication and:</u>

12 <u>(1) at any time transmits a threat of immediate or</u> 13 <u>future bodily harm, sexual assault, confinement, or</u> 14 <u>restraint and the threat is directed towards that person</u> 15 <u>or a family member of that person, or</u>

16 (2) places that person or a family member of that
 17 person in reasonable apprehension of immediate or future
 18 bodily harm, sexual assault, confinement, or restraint.

19 (b) As used in this Section:

20 <u>"Harass" means to engage in a knowing and willful course</u>
21 of conduct directed at a specific person that alarms, annoys,
22 torments, or terrorizes that person.

23 <u>"Electronic communication" means any transfer of signs,</u> 24 <u>signals, writings, sounds, data, or intelligence of any</u> 25 <u>nature transmitted in whole or in part by a wire, radio,</u> 26 <u>electronmagnetic, photoelectric, or photo-optical system.</u> 27 <u>"Electronic communication" includes transmissions by a</u> 28 <u>computer through the Internet to another computer.</u>

29 (c) Sentence. Cyberstalking is a Class 4 felony. A
30 second or subsequent conviction for cyberstalking is a Class
31 <u>3 felony.</u>

Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon
 becoming law.
