- 1 AN ACT with regard to education.
- 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,
- 3 represented in the General Assembly:
- 4 Section 5. The School Code is amended by changing
- 5 Section 10-17a and adding Section 27-23.6 as follows:
- 6 (105 ILCS 5/10-17a) (from Ch. 122, par. 10-17a)
- 7 Sec. 10-17a. Better schools accountability.
- 8 (1) Policy and Purpose. It shall be the policy of the
- 9 State of Illinois that each school district in this State,
- 10 including special charter districts and districts subject to
- 11 the provisions of Article 34, shall submit to parents,
- 12 taxpayers of such district, the Governor, the General
- 13 Assembly, and the State Board of Education a school report
- 14 card assessing the performance of its schools and students.
- 15 The report card shall be an index of school performance
- 16 measured against statewide and local standards and will
- 17 provide information to make prior year comparisons and to set
- 18 future year targets through the school improvement plan.
- 19 (2) Reporting Requirements. Each school district shall
- 20 prepare a report card in accordance with the guidelines set
- 21 forth in this Section which describes the performance of its
- 22 students by school attendance centers and by district and the
- 23 district's use of financial resources. Such report card
- shall be presented at a regular school board meeting subject
- 25 to applicable notice requirements, and such report cards
- shall be made available to a newspaper of general circulation
- 27 serving the district and shall be sent home to parents. In
- 28 addition, each school district shall submit the completed
- 29 report card to the office of the district's Regional
- 30 Superintendent which shall make copies available to any
- 31 individuals requesting them.

- The report card shall be completed and disseminated prior to October 31 in each school year. The report card shall contain, but not be limited to, actual local school attendance center, school district and statewide data indicating the present performance of the school, the State norms and the areas for planned improvement for the school and school district.
- The report card shall include the following 8 (3) (a) 9 applicable indicators of attendance center, district, statewide student performance: percent of students who 10 11 exceed, meet, or do not meet standards established by the State Board of Education pursuant to Section 2-3.25a; 12 composite and subtest means on nationally normed achievement 13 tests for college bound students; student attendance rates; 14 15 chronic truancy rate; dropout rate; graduation rate; and 16 student mobility, turnover shown as a percent of transfers out and a percent of transfers in. 17
- The report card shall include the following 18 (b) 19 descriptions for the school, district, and State: average class size; amount of time per day devoted to mathematics, 20 2.1 science, English and social science at primary, middle and junior high school grade levels; number of students taking 22 the Prairie State Achievement Examination under subsection 23 (c) of Section 2-3.64, the number of those students who 24 received a score of excellent, and the average score by 25 school of students taking the examination; pupil-teacher 26 ratio; pupil-administrator ratio; operating expenditure per 27 pupil; district expenditure by fund; average administrator 28 29 salary; and average teacher salary.
- 30 (c) The report card shall include applicable indicators
  31 of parental involvement in each attendance center. The
  32 parental involvement component of the report card shall
  33 include the percentage of students whose parents or guardians
  34 have had one or more personal contacts with the students'

- 1 teachers during the school year concerning the students'
- 2 education, and such other information, commentary, and
- 3 suggestions as the school district desires. For the purposes
- 4 of this paragraph, "personal contact" includes, but is not
- 5 limited to, parent-teacher conferences, parental visits to
- 6 school, school visits to home, telephone conversations, and
- 7 written correspondence. The parental involvement component
- 8 shall not single out or identify individual students,
- 9 parents, or guardians by name.
- 10 (c-5) For the 2002-2003, 2003-2004, and 2004-2005 school
- 11 years, the report card shall include information in the
- 12 <u>following format, which shall be filled out by the school</u>
- 13 <u>district:</u>
- 14 <u>Does your school district incorporate anti-bias education</u>
- 15 and intergroup conflict resolution as part of its activities?
- 16 <u>yes ... no ...</u>
- 17 <u>If yes, please check all that apply:</u>
- 18 ... teacher training
- 19 ... classroom instruction
- 20 <u>... student groups</u>
- 21 <u>... other</u>
- 22 (d) The report card form shall be prepared by the State
- 23 Board of Education and provided to school districts.

- 26 <u>Sec. 27-23.6. Anti-bias education.</u>
- 27 <u>(a) The General Assembly finds that there is a</u>
- 28 <u>significant increase in violence in the schools and that much</u>
- of that violence is the result of intergroup tensions. The
- 30 <u>General Assembly further finds that anti-bias education and</u>
- 31 <u>intergroup conflict resolution are effective methods for</u>
- 32 preventing violence and lessening tensions in the schools.
- 33 (b) Beginning with the 2002-2003 school year, public

- 1 <u>elementary and secondary schools may incorporate activities</u>
- 2 to address intergroup conflict, with the objectives of
- 3 <u>improving intergroup relations on and beyond the school</u>
- 4 <u>campus, defusing intergroup tensions, and promoting peaceful</u>
- 5 resolution of conflict. Such activities may include, but not
- 6 <u>be limited to, instruction and teacher training programs.</u>
- 7 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon
- 8 becoming law.
