- 1 AN ACT in relation to bicycles and bicycle safety.
- 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,
- 3 represented in the General Assembly:
- 4 Section 5. The Illinois Vehicle Code is amended by
- 5 changing Section 11-1502 as follows:
- 6 (625 ILCS 5/11-1502) (from Ch. 95 1/2, par. 11-1502)
- 7 Sec. 11-1502. Traffic laws apply to persons riding
- 8 bicycles.
- 9 (a) Every person riding a bicycle upon a highway shall
- 10 be granted all of the rights and shall be subject to all of
- 11 the duties applicable to the driver of a vehicle by this
- 12 Code, except as to special regulations in this Article XV and
- 13 except as to those provisions of this Code which by their
- 14 nature can have no application.
- 15 (b) A person riding a bicycle is an intended and
- 16 permitted user of any street or highway in Illinois except
- 17 <u>for a street or highway on which bicycle use has been</u>
- 18 specifically prohibited by law. This subsection (b) does not
- 19 <u>create liability for any public entity for the failure to</u>
- 20 remedy any surface condition of a public right-of-way that is
- 21 <u>not hazardous to a motor vehicle even though it may be</u>
- 22 <u>hazardous to a person riding a bicycle. Except as expressly</u>
- 23 provided by law, this subsection (b) does not impose an
- obligation to upgrade, widen, or reengineer existing public
- 25 <u>right-of-ways</u> for use by bicyclists, or to impose an
- 26 <u>obligation to maintain streets and highways to a higher</u>
- 27 <u>standard for bicyclists. For purposes of this subsection (b),</u>
- 28 <u>conditions that are not hazardous to a motor vehicle even</u>
- 29 though they may be hazardous to a person riding a bicycle
- 30 <u>include</u> but are not limited to: (1) potholes smaller than
- 31 <u>both 3 inches deep and 30 inches in diameter; (2) irregular</u>

- 1 surfaces on gravel, dirt, clay, and oil and chip roads and
- 2 <u>shoulders; (3) pavement stress cracks; (4) speed bumps; (5)</u>
- 3 <u>expansion joints; (6) normal accumulations of gravel, debris,</u>
- 4 <u>ice</u>, <u>snow</u>, <u>and water on road and shoulder surfaces</u>; <u>and</u> (7)
- 5 <u>sewer and drain covers.</u>

- 7 Section 10. The Local Governmental and Governmental
- 8 Employees Tort Immunity Act is amended by adding Section
- 9 3-111 as follows:
- 10 (745 ILCS 10/3-111 new)
- 11 <u>Sec. 3-111. Bicyclists using streets and highways that</u>
- 12 <u>have special improvements for bicyclists. Neither a local</u>
- 13 public entity nor a public employee is liable for any injury
- 14 to a bicyclist if the liability is based on the existence of
- 15 <u>a condition of a segment or portion of a street or highway</u>
- 16 that has been improved for bicycle use unless the local
- 17 <u>public entity or public employee is guilty of willful and</u>
- 18 <u>wanton misconduct proximately causing the injury. For the</u>
- 19 purposes of this Section, a street or highway has been
- 20 <u>improved for bicycle use when: (1) it has been designated</u>
- 21 <u>with appropriate signs and (2) it contains one of the</u>
- 22 <u>following features: (i) additional lane width, (ii) a paved</u>
- 23 shoulder, (iii) a striped bicycle lane, or (iv) a marked
- 24 <u>crossing of a bicycle trail.</u>
- 25 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon
- 26 becoming law.
