1 AN ACT to amend the General Obligation Bond Act by

- 2 changing Sections 2, 3 and 6.
- 3 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,
- 4 Section 5. The General Obligation Bond Act is amended by
- 5 changing Sections 2, 3 and 6 as follows:
- 6 (30 ILCS 330/2) (from Ch. 127, par. 652)
- 7 Sec. 2. Authorization for Bonds. The State of Illinois
- 8 is authorized to issue, sell and provide for the retirement
- 9 of General Obligation Bonds of the State of Illinois for the
- 10 categories and specific purposes expressed in Sections 2
- through 8 of this Act, in the total amount of \$14,923,144,846
- 12 \$14,197,632,592.
- 13 The bonds authorized in this Section 2 and in Section 16
- of this Act are herein called "Bonds".
- Of the total amount of Bonds authorized in this Act, up
- to \$2,200,000,000 in aggregate original principal amount may
- 17 be issued and sold in accordance with the Baccalaureate
- 18 Savings Act in the form of General Obligation College Savings
- 19 Bonds.
- Of the total amount of Bonds authorized in this Act, up
- 21 to \$300,000,000 in aggregate original principal amount may be
- 22 issued and sold in accordance with the Retirement Savings Act
- in the form of General Obligation Retirement Savings Bonds.
- 24 The issuance and sale of Bonds pursuant to the General
- Obligation Bond Act is an economical and efficient method of
- 26 financing the capital needs of the State. This Act will
- 27 permit the issuance of a multi-purpose General Obligation
- 28 Bond with uniform terms and features. This will not only
- 29 lower the cost of registration but also reduce the overall
- 30 cost of issuing debt by improving the marketability of
- 31 Illinois General Obligation Bonds.

- 5 Sec. 3. Capital Facilities. The amount of \$6,078,847,592
- 6 is authorized to be used for the acquisition, development,
- 7 construction, reconstruction, improvement, financing,
- 8 architectural planning and installation of capital facilities
- 9 within the State, consisting of buildings, structures,
- 10 durable equipment, land, and interests in land for the
- 11 following specific purposes:
- 12 (a) \$1,950,614,200 \$1,710,255,446 for educational
- purposes by State universities and colleges, the Illinois
- 14 Community College Board created by the Public Community
- 15 College Act and for grants to public community colleges
- as authorized by Sections 5-11 and 5-12 of the Public
- 17 Community College Act;
- 18 (b) \$1,724,244,968 \$1,542,970,168 for correctional
- 19 purposes at State prison and correctional centers;
- 20 (c) $\frac{$506,497,826}{}$ -- $\frac{$470,941,786}{}$ for open spaces,
- 21 recreational and conservation purposes and the protection
- of land;
- 23 (d) \$561,001,246 \$536,280,486 for child care
- facilities, mental and public health facilities, and
- 25 facilities for the care of disabled veterans and their
- 26 spouses;
- 27 (e) \$1,301,491,241 \$1,129,599,341 for use by the
- State, its departments, authorities, public corporations,
- 29 commissions and agencies;
- 30 (f) \$818,100 for cargo handling facilities at port
- 31 districts and for breakwaters, including harbor
- 32 entrances, at port districts in conjunction with

facilities for small boats and pleasure crafts;

- (g) <u>\$198,777,796</u> \$186,657,796 for water resource management projects;
- (h) \$16,940,269 for the provision of facilities for food production research and related instructional and public service activities at the State universities and public community colleges;
- (i) \$36,000,000 for grants by the Secretary of State, as State Librarian, for central library facilities authorized by Section 8 of the Illinois Library System Act and for grants by the Capital Development Board to units of local government for public library facilities;
- (j) \$25,000,000 for the acquisition, development, construction, reconstruction, improvement, financing, architectural planning and installation of capital facilities consisting of buildings, structures, durable equipment and land for grants to counties, municipalities or public building commissions with correctional facilities that do not comply with the minimum standards of the Department of Corrections under Section 3-15-2 of the Unified Code of Corrections;
- (k) \$5,000,000 for grants in fiscal year 1988 by the Department of Conservation for improvement or expansion of aquarium facilities located on property owned by a park district;
- (1) \$337,584,200 to State agencies for grants to local governments for the acquisition, financing, architectural planning, development, alteration, installation, and construction of capital facilities consisting of buildings, structures, durable equipment, and land; and
- (m) \$121,200,000 \$80,800,000 for the Illinois Open

 Land Trust Program as defined by the Illinois Open Land

 Trust Act.

- 1 The amounts authorized above for capital facilities may
- 2 be used for the acquisition, installation, alteration,
- 3 construction, or reconstruction of capital facilities and for
- 4 the purchase of equipment for the purpose of major capital
- 5 improvements which will reduce energy consumption in State
- 6 buildings or facilities.

- 12 (a) The amount of \$282,005,000 \$262,815,000 is
- 13 authorized for allocation by the Environmental Protection
- 14 Agency for grants or loans to units of local government in
- 15 such amounts, at such times and for such purpose as the
- 16 Agency deems necessary or desirable for the planning,
- 17 financing, and construction of municipal sewage treatment
- 18 works and solid waste disposal facilities and for making of
- 19 deposits into the Water Revolving Fund and the U.S.
- 20 Environmental Protection Fund to provide assistance in
- 21 accordance with the provisions of Title IV-A of the
- 22 Environmental Protection Act.
- 23 (b) The amount of \$160,500,000 is authorized for
- 24 allocation by the Environmental Protection Agency for payment
- of claims submitted to the State and approved for payment
- 26 under the Leaking Underground Storage Tank Program
- 27 established in Title XVI of the Environmental Protection Act.
