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AN ACT in relation to vehicles.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Illinois Vehicle Code is amended by
changing Section 6-303 as follows:

6 (625 ILCS 5/6-303) (from Ch. 95 1/2, par. 6-303)

Sec. 6-303. Driving while driver's license, permit or 7 8 privilege to operate a motor vehicle is suspended or revoked. (a) Any person who drives or is in actual physical 9 control of a motor vehicle on any highway of this State at a 10 time when such person's driver's license, permit or privilege 11 to do so or the privilege to obtain a driver's license or 12 13 permit is revoked or suspended as provided by this Code or the law of another state, except as may be specifically 14 15 allowed by a judicial driving permit, family financial 16 responsibility driving permit, probationary license to drive, or a restricted driving permit issued pursuant to this Code 17 18 or under the law of another state, shall be guilty of a Class 19 A misdemeanor.

20 The Secretary of State upon receiving a report of (b) the conviction of any violation indicating a person was 21 22 operating a motor vehicle during the time when said person's driver's license, permit or privilege was suspended by the 23 Secretary, by the appropriate authority of another state, or 24 25 pursuant to Section 11-501.1; except as may be specifically allowed by a probationary license to drive, judicial driving 26 27 permit or restricted driving permit issued pursuant to this Code or the law of another state; shall extend the suspension 28 29 for the same period of time as the originally imposed suspension; however, if the period of suspension has then 30 expired, the Secretary shall be authorized to suspend said 31

1 person's driving privileges for the same period of time as 2 the originally imposed suspension; and if the conviction was upon a charge which indicated that a vehicle was operated 3 4 during the time when the person's driver's license, permit or privilege was revoked; except as may be allowed by a 5 б restricted driving permit issued pursuant to this Code or the 7 law of another state; the Secretary shall not issue a driver's license for an additional period of one year from 8 the date of such conviction indicating such person was 9 operating a vehicle during such period of revocation. 10

11 (c) Any person convicted of violating this Section shall 12 serve a minimum term of imprisonment of 10 consecutive days 13 or 30 days of community service when the person's driving 14 privilege was revoked or suspended as a result of:

(1) a violation of Section 11-501 of this Code or a similar provision of a local ordinance relating to the offense of operating or being in physical control of a vehicle while under the influence of alcohol, any other drug or any combination thereof; or

(2) a violation of paragraph (b) of Section 11-401
of this Code or a similar provision of a local ordinance
relating to the offense of leaving the scene of a motor
vehicle accident involving personal injury or death; or

24 (3) a violation of Section 9-3 of the Criminal Code
25 of 1961, as amended, relating to the offense of reckless
26 homicide; or

27 (4) a statutory summary suspension under Section
28 11-501.1 of this Code.

29 Such sentence of imprisonment or community service shall 30 not be subject to suspension in order to reduce such 31 sentence.

32 (c-1) Except as provided in subsection (d), any person 33 convicted of a second violation of this Section shall be 34 ordered by the court to serve a minimum of 100 hours of

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1 community service.

2 (c-2) In addition to other penalties imposed under this
3 Section, the court may impose on any person convicted a
4 fourth time of violating this Section any of the following:

5 (1) Seizure of the license plates of the person's 6 vehicle.

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(2) Immobilization of the person's vehicle for a period of time to be determined by the court.

9 Any person convicted of a second violation of this (d) Section shall be guilty of a Class 4 felony and shall serve a 10 11 minimum term of imprisonment of 30 days or 300 hours of community service, as determined by the court, if the 12 revocation or suspension was for a violation of Section 13 11-401 or 11-501 of this Code, or a similar out-of-state 14 offense, or a similar provision of a local ordinance, a 15 violation of Section 9-3 of the Criminal Code of 1961, 16 relating to the offense of reckless homicide, or a similar 17 out-of-state offense, or a statutory summary suspension under 18 19 Section 11-501.1 of this Code.

20 (d-1) Except as provided in subsection (d-2) and 21 subsection (d-3), any person convicted of a third or 22 subsequent violation of this Section shall serve a minimum 23 term of imprisonment of 30 days or 300 hours of community 24 service, as determined by the court.

25 (d-2) Any person convicted of a third violation of this Section is guilty of a Class 4 felony and must serve a 26 minimum term of imprisonment of 30 days if the revocation or 27 suspension was for a violation of Section 11-401 or 11-501 of 28 this Code, or a similar out-of-state offense, or a similar 29 30 provision of a local ordinance, a violation of Section 9-3 of the Criminal Code of 1961, relating to the offense of 31 32 reckless homicide, or a similar out-of-state offense, or a statutory summary suspension under Section 11-501.1 of this 33 34 Code.

(d-3) Any person convicted of a fourth or subsequent 1 2 violation of this Section is guilty of a Class 4 felony and must serve a minimum term of imprisonment of 180 days if the 3 4 revocation or suspension was for a violation of Section 5 11-401 or 11-501 of this Code, or a similar out-of-state 6 offense, or a similar provision of a local ordinance, a violation of Section 9-3 of the Criminal Code of 1961, 7 relating to the offense of reckless homicide, or a similar 8 9 out-of-state offense, or a statutory summary suspension under Section 11-501.1 of this Code. 10

(e) Any person in violation of this Section who is also 11 in violation of Section 7-601 of this Code relating to 12 mandatory insurance requirements, in addition to other 13 penalties imposed under this Section, shall have his or her 14 15 motor vehicle immediately impounded by the arresting law 16 enforcement officer. The motor vehicle may be released to any licensed driver upon a showing of proof of insurance for the 17 vehicle that was impounded and the notarized written consent 18 for the release by the vehicle owner. 19

20 (f) For any prosecution under this Section, a certified 21 copy of the driving abstract of the defendant shall be 22 admitted as proof of any prior conviction.

23 (g) The motor vehicle used in a violation of this Section is subject to seizure and forfeiture as provided in 24 25 Sections 36-1 and 36-2 of the Criminal Code of 1961 if the 26 person's driving privilege was revoked or suspended as a 27 result of a violation listed in paragraph (1), (2), or (3) of subsection (c) of this Section or as a result of a summary 28 29 suspension as provided in paragraph (4) of subsection (c) of 30 this Section.

32 Section 10. The Criminal Code of 1961 is amended by 33 changing Section 36-1 as follows: SB1730 Engrossed

2 Sec. 36-1. Seizure. Any vessel, vehicle or aircraft used with the knowledge and consent of the owner in the 3 4 commission of, or in the attempt to commit as defined in 5 Section 8-4 of this Code, an offense prohibited by (a) б Section 9-1, 9-3, 10-2, 11-6, 11-15.1, 11-19.1, 11-19.2, 11-20.1, 12-4.1, 12-4.2, 12-4.2-5, 12-4.3, 12-4.6, 12-7.3, 7 12-7.4, 12-13, 12-14, 18-2, 19-1, 19-2, 19-3, 20-1, 8 20-2, 9 20.5-6, 24-1.2, 24-1.2-5, 24-1.5, or 28-1 of this Code, paragraph (a) of Section 12-4 of this Code, paragraph (a) of 10 11 Section 12-15 or paragraphs (a), (c) or (d) of Section 12-16 of this Code, or paragraph (a)(6) or (a)(7) of Section 24-1 12 of this Code; (b) Section 21, 22, 23, 24 or 26 of the 13 Cigarette Tax Act if the vessel, vehicle or aircraft contains 14 more than 10 cartons of such cigarettes; (c) Section 28, 15 29 16 or 30 of the Cigarette Use Tax Act if the vessel, vehicle or aircraft contains more than 10 cartons of such cigarettes; 17 (d) Section 44 of the Environmental Protection Act; (e) 18 19 11-204.1 of the Illinois Vehicle Code; or (f) the offenses described in the following provisions of the Illinois Vehicle 20 21 Code: Section 11-501 subdivisions (c-1)(1), (c-1)(2), 22 (c-1)(3), (d)(1)(A), or (d)(1)(D); or (q) an offense 23 described in subsection (g) of Section 6-303 of the Illinois Vehicle Code; may be seized and delivered forthwith to the 24 25 sheriff of the county of seizure.

Within 15 days after such delivery the sheriff shall give 26 notice of seizure to each person according to the following 27 method: Upon each such person whose right, title or interest 28 is of record in the office of the Secretary of State, the 29 30 Secretary of Transportation, the Administrator of the Federal Aviation Agency, or any other Department of this State, or 31 any other state of the United States if such vessel, vehicle 32 or aircraft is required to be so registered, as the case may 33 be, by mailing a copy of the notice by certified mail to the 34

address as given upon the records of the Secretary of State, the Department of Aeronautics, Department of Public Works and Buildings or any other Department of this State or the United States if such vessel, vehicle or aircraft is required to be so registered. Within that 15 day period the sheriff shall also notify the State's Attorney of the county of seizure about the seizure.

In addition, any mobile or portable equipment used in the 8 9 commission of an act which is in violation of Section 7g of the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District Act shall be 10 subject to seizure and forfeiture under the same procedures 11 provided in this Article for the seizure and forfeiture of 12 vessels, vehicles and aircraft, and any such equipment shall 13 be deemed a vessel, vehicle or aircraft for purposes of this 14 15 Article.

16 When a person discharges a firearm at another individual from a vehicle with the knowledge and consent of the owner of 17 the vehicle and with the intent to cause death or great 18 bodily harm to that individual and as a result causes death 19 or great bodily harm to that individual, the vehicle shall be 20 21 subject to seizure and forfeiture under the same procedures provided in this Article for the seizure and forfeiture of 22 23 vehicles used in violations of clauses (a), (b), (c), or (d) of this Section. 24

25 If the spouse of the owner of a vehicle seized for an offense described in subsection (g) of Section 6-303 of the 26 Illinois Vehicle Code, a violation of subdivision (c-1)(1), 27 (c-1)(2), (c-1)(3), (d)(1)(A), or (d)(1)(D) of Section 11-501 28 of the Illinois Vehicle Code, or Section 9-3 of this Code 29 30 makes a showing that the seized vehicle is the only source of transportation and it is determined that the financial 31 hardship to the family as a result of the seizure outweighs 32 the benefit to the State from the seizure, the vehicle may be 33 forfeited to the spouse or family member and the title to the 34

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1 vehicle shall be transferred to the spouse or family member 2 who is properly licensed and who requires the use of the vehicle for employment or family transportation purposes. A 3 written declaration of forfeiture of a vehicle under this 4 Section shall be sufficient cause for the title to be 5 6 transferred to the spouse or family member. The provisions of this paragraph shall apply only to one forfeiture per 7 vehicle. If the vehicle is the subject of a subsequent 8 9 forfeiture proceeding by virtue of a subsequent conviction of either spouse or the family member, the spouse or family 10 11 member to whom the vehicle was forfeited under the first forfeiture proceeding may not utilize the provisions of this 12 paragraph in another forfeiture proceeding. If the owner of 13 the vehicle seized owns more than one vehicle, the procedure 14 set out in this paragraph may be used for only one vehicle. 15

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16 Property declared contraband under Section 40 of the 17 Illinois Streetgang Terrorism Omnibus Prevention Act may be 18 seized and forfeited under this Article.
