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AN ACT in relation to vehicles.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Illinois Vehicle Code is amended by
changing Section 11-605 as follows:

6 (625 ILCS 5/11-605) (from Ch. 95 1/2, par. 11-605)
7 Sec. 11-605. Special speed limit while passing schools
8 or while traveling through highway construction or
9 maintenance zones.

10 (a) For the purpose of this Section, "school" means the 11 following entities:

12 (1) A public or private primary or secondary13 school.

14 (2) A primary or secondary school operated by a15 religious institution.

16 (3) A public, private, or religious nursery school. On a school day when school children are present and so 17 18 close thereto that a potential hazard exists because of the close proximity of the motorized traffic, no person shall 19 20 drive a motor vehicle at a speed in excess of 20 miles per hour while passing a school zone or while traveling upon any 21 22 public thoroughfare where children pass going to and from 23 school.

For the purpose of this Section a school day shall begin at seven ante meridian and shall conclude at four post meridian.

This Section shall not be applicable unless appropriate signs are posted upon streets and highways under their respective jurisdiction and maintained by the Department, township, county, park district, city, village or incorporated town wherein the school zone is located. With 1 regard to the special speed limit while passing schools, such 2 signs shall give proper due warning that a school zone is 3 being approached and shall indicate the school zone and the 4 maximum speed limit in effect during school days when school 5 children are present.

6 (b) No person shall operate a motor vehicle in a 7 construction or maintenance zone at a speed in excess of the 8 posted speed limit when workers are present and so close to 9 the moving traffic that a potential hazard exists because of 10 the motorized traffic.

11 (c) Nothing in this Chapter shall prohibit the use of electronic speed-detecting devices within 500 feet of signs 12 within a special school speed zone or a construction or 13 maintenance zone indicating such zone, as defined in this 14 Section, nor shall evidence obtained thereby be inadmissible 15 16 in any prosecution for speeding provided the use of such device shall apply only to the enforcement of the speed limit 17 in such special school speed zone or a construction or 18 19 maintenance zone.

(d) For the purpose of this Section, a construction or 20 21 maintenance zone is an area in which the Department, Toll 22 Highway Authority, or local agency has determined that the 23 preexisting established speed limit through а highway construction or maintenance project 24 is greater than is 25 reasonable or safe with respect to the conditions expected to exist in the construction or maintenance zone and has posted 26 27 a lower speed limit with a highway construction or maintenance zone special speed limit sign. 28

Highway construction or maintenance zone special speed limit signs shall be of a design approved by the Department. The signs shall give proper due warning that a construction or maintenance zone is being approached and shall indicate the maximum speed limit in effect. The signs shall also state the amount of the minimum fine for a violation when

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1 workers are present.

2 (e) A first violation of this Section is a petty offense
3 with a minimum fine of \$150. A second or subsequent
4 violation of this Section is a petty offense with a minimum
5 fine of \$300.

6 (f) When a fine for a violation of subsection (a) is 7 \$150 or greater, the person who violates subsection (a) shall be charged an additional \$50 to be paid to the unit school 8 9 district where the violation occurred for school safety purposes. If the violation occurred in a dual school 10 11 district, \$25 of the surcharge shall be paid to the elementary school district for school safety purposes and \$25 12 of the surcharge shall be paid to the high school district 13 for school safety purposes. Notwithstanding any other 14 provision of law, the entire \$50 surcharge shall be paid to 15 16 the appropriate school district or districts.

For purposes of this subsection (f), "school safety purposes" includes the costs associated with school zone safety education and the purchase, installation, and maintenance of caution lights which are mounted on school speed zone signs.

(g) A person who violates subsection (b) shall be charged an additional \$50 to be paid to the Department of Transportation and used to pay police officers hired to patrol construction or maintenance zones. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the entire \$50 surcharge shall be paid to the Department of Transportation.
