AN ACT relating to education.

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:
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Section 5. The School Code is amended by adding Section 2-3.131 as follows:
(105 ILCS 5/2-3.131 new)
Sec. 2-3.131. Certified Teacher Retention Bonus Program. (a) The General Assembly finds and declares the following:
(1) There is a growing shortage of high-quality, certified, veteran classroom teachers who remain teaching at low-performing schools.
(2) An incentive retention bonus is appropriate to ensure that these experienced teachers will continue to teach at low-performing schools.
(b) In this Section, "Program" means the Certified Teacher Retention Bonus Program.
(c) There is hereby established the Certified Teacher Retention Bonus Program. Beginning with the 2002-2003 school year, if a school district, with the agreement of the exclusive bargaining representative, if any, of the certified teachers of that district, chooses to participate in the Program, then the school district may apply for a grant each school year from the State Board of Education on behalf of any schools in the district that are eligible under subsection (d) of this Section and elect to participate in the Program. The amount of the grant shall be sufficient to award bonuses to participating teachers under subsection (g) of this section and shall be used exclusively to award these bonuses.
(d) A school is eligible to participate in the Program
if the school is currently on the State Board of Education's Academic Watch List or Early Academic Warning List. Priority shall be given to schools with a high rate of teacher turnover, as defined by the State Board of Education.
(e) To participate in the Program, a teacher at the participating school must hold an Illinois teaching certificate. A teacher is ineligible to participate in the Program if he or she meets any of the following conditions:
(1) The teacher has 2 or less years of teaching experience, unless a majority of teachers at the participating school have 2 or less years of teaching experience.
(2) The teacher is on probation for any reason.
(3) The teacher has received an "unsatisfactory" rating on his or her evaluation conducted pursuant to Article 24A of this Code.
(4) The teacher has already received a bonus under this Section.
(f) The maximum number of teachers that may participate in the Program at a participating school shall be no more than $20 \%$ of the certified teachers at that school, with a priority given to the more experienced teachers who exhibit exemplary teaching ability, as defined by the state Board of Education. However, if a teacher has 2 or less years of teaching experience and a majority of teachers at the participating school have 2 or less years of teaching experience, then the teacher may participate if the teacher has demonstrated exemplary ability as defined by the state Board of Education. Priority for participation in the Program shall be given to teachers who receive certification from the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards.
(g) A teacher who participates in the Program shall receive a one-time bonus equal to $25 \%$ of the teacher's base salary for the school year, excluding any other bonuses. Any
bonus received under this Section shall not be included in the base pay calculation for any year. The bonus shall be paid to the teacher on a prorated basis as part of the teacher's annual salary payment plan, beginning with the first pay period of the school year.
(h) Each participating teacher shall agree to teach at the participating school for an additional 4 school years. Teachers failing to meet this requirement for reasons other than death, disability, or anything else deemed appropriate by the State Board of Education as determined by rule shall repay to the participating school the full amount of the bonus received. The participating school shall use all such returned money to increase the bonus amount for the other participating teachers.
(i) Funding for the Program is subject to annual appropriation by the General Assembly for that purpose. If the amount appropriated in a given fiscal year is insufficient to pay in full the amount of all of the grants to school districts that are entitled to grants, the sum shall be prorated among those districts, which in turn shall be prorated among those teachers in each district that are entitled to bonuses.
(j) The State Board of Education shall conduct an annual evaluation of the Program. A report on each evaluation shall be submitted to the General Assembly and shall document whether and the extent to which the Program has contributed to pupil performance and teacher retention.
( $k$ ) The State Board of Education shall adopt any rules consistent with the requirements of this Section that are necessary to implement and administer the Program.
(l) This Section is repealed on July 1, 2007.

Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect on July 1, 2002.
