- 1 AN ACT relating to education.
- 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,
- 3 represented in the General Assembly:
- 4 Section 5. The School Code is amended by adding Section
- 5 2-3.131 as follows:
- 6 (105 ILCS 5/2-3.131 new)
- 7 <u>Sec. 2-3.131. Certified Teacher Retention Bonus Program.</u>
- 8 (a) The General Assembly finds and declares the
- 9 <u>following:</u>
- 10 (1) There is a growing shortage of high-quality,
- 11 <u>certified, veteran classroom teachers who remain teaching</u>
- 12 <u>at low-performing schools.</u>
- 13 (2) An incentive retention bonus is appropriate to
- 14 <u>ensure that these experienced teachers will continue to</u>
- 15 <u>teach at low-performing schools.</u>
- 16 (b) In this Section, "Program" means the Certified
- 17 <u>Teacher Retention Bonus Program.</u>
- 18 <u>(c) There is hereby established the Certified Teacher</u>
- 19 Retention Bonus Program. Beginning with the 2002-2003 school
- 20 year, if a school district, with the agreement of the
- 21 <u>exclusive bargaining representative, if any, of the certified</u>
- 22 <u>teachers of that district, chooses to participate in the</u>
- 23 Program, then the school district may apply for a grant each
- 24 school year from the State Board of Education on behalf of
- 25 any schools in the district that are eligible under
- 26 <u>subsection (d) of this Section and elect to participate in</u>
- 27 <u>the Program. The amount of the grant shall be sufficient to</u>
- 28 <u>award bonuses to participating teachers under subsection (g)</u>
- of this Section and shall be used exclusively to award these
- 30 <u>bonuses</u>.
- 31 (d) A school is eligible to participate in the Program

- 1 <u>if the school is currently on the State Board of Education's</u>
- 2 Academic Watch List or Early Academic Warning List. Priority
- 3 <u>shall be given to schools with a high rate of teacher</u>
- 4 <u>turnover</u>, as defined by the State Board of Education.
- 5 <u>(e) To participate in the Program, a teacher at the</u>
- 6 participating school must hold an Illinois teaching
- 7 <u>certificate. A teacher is ineligible to participate in the</u>
- 8 Program if he or she meets any of the following conditions:
- 9 <u>(1) The teacher has 2 or less years of teaching</u>
- 10 <u>experience</u>, unless a majority of teachers at the
- 11 participating school have 2 or less years of teaching
- 12 <u>experience</u>.
- 13 (2) The teacher is on probation for any reason.
- 14 (3) The teacher has received an "unsatisfactory"
- 15 rating on his or her evaluation conducted pursuant to
- 16 <u>Article 24A of this Code.</u>
- 17 (4) The teacher has already received a bonus under
- 18 <u>this Section.</u>

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- 19 <u>(f) The maximum number of teachers that may participate</u>
- 20 <u>in the Program at a participating school shall be no more</u>
- 21 than 20% of the certified teachers at that school, with a
- 22 <u>priority given to the more experienced teachers who exhibit</u>
- 23 <u>exemplary teaching ability, as defined by the State Board of</u>

Education. However, if a teacher has 2 or less years of

teaching experience and a majority of teachers at the

- 26 participating school have 2 or less years of teaching
- 27 <u>experience</u>, then the teacher may participate if the teacher
- 28 <u>has demonstrated exemplary ability as defined by the State</u>
- 29 Board of Education. Priority for participation in the Program
- 30 <u>shall be given to teachers who receive certification from the</u>
- 31 <u>National Board for Professional Teaching Standards.</u>
- 32 (g) A teacher who participates in the Program shall
- 33 receive a one-time bonus equal to 25% of the teacher's base
- 34 salary for the school year, excluding any other bonuses. Any

- 1 bonus received under this Section shall not be included in
- 2 the base pay calculation for any year. The bonus shall be
- 3 paid to the teacher on a prorated basis as part of the
- 4 teacher's annual salary payment plan, beginning with the
- 5 <u>first pay period of the school year.</u>
- 6 (h) Each participating teacher shall agree to teach at
- 7 the participating school for an additional 4 school years.
- 8 Teachers failing to meet this requirement for reasons other
- 9 than death, disability, or anything else deemed appropriate
- 10 by the State Board of Education as determined by rule shall
- 11 repay to the participating school the full amount of the
- 12 bonus received. The participating school shall use all such
- 13 returned money to increase the bonus amount for the other
- 14 participating teachers.
- (i) Funding for the Program is subject to annual
- 16 appropriation by the General Assembly for that purpose. If
- 17 the amount appropriated in a given fiscal year is
- 18 <u>insufficient to pay in full the amount of all of the grants</u>
- 19 to school districts that are entitled to grants, the sum
- 20 <u>shall</u> be prorated among those districts, which in turn shall
- 21 <u>be prorated among those teachers in each district that are</u>
- 22 <u>entitled to bonuses.</u>
- 23 (j) The State Board of Education shall conduct an annual
- 24 <u>evaluation of the Program. A report on each evaluation shall</u>
- 25 <u>be submitted to the General Assembly and shall document</u>
- 26 whether and the extent to which the Program has contributed
- 27 <u>to pupil performance and teacher retention.</u>
- 28 (k) The State Board of Education shall adopt any rules
- 29 <u>consistent with the requirements of this Section that are</u>
- 30 necessary to implement and administer the Program.
- 31 (1) This Section is repealed on July 1, 2007.
- 32 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect on
- 33 July 1, 2002.
