AN ACT in relation to criminal law.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 2 3 represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 5. The Criminal Code of 1961 is amended by changing Section 24-9 as follows: 5

б (720 ILCS 5/24-9)

Sec. 24-9. Firearms; Child Protection. 7

8 (a) Except as provided in subsection (c), it is unlawful for any person to store or leave, within premises under his 9 or her control, a firearm if the person knows or has reason 10 to believe that a minor under the age of 16 14 years who does 11 not have a Firearm Owners Identification Card is likely to 12 13 gain access to the firearm without the lawful permission of the minor's parent, guardian, or person having charge of the 14 15 minor, and the minor causes death or great bodily harm with 16 the firearm, unless the firearm is:

(1) secured by a device or mechanism, other than the 17 18 firearm safety, designed to render a firearm temporarily 19 inoperable; or

(2) placed in a securely locked box or container; or (3) placed in some other location that a reasonable 21 22 person would believe to be secure from a minor under the 23 age of 16 14 years.

Sentence. A person who violates this Section is 24 (b) guilty of a Class $\underline{A} \in m$ isdemeanor and shall be fined not less 25 26 than \$1,000. A second or subsequent violation of this 27 Section is a Class <u>4 felony</u> A-misdemeaner.

(c) Subsection (a) does not apply:

(1) if the minor under 16 14 years of age gains 29 access to a firearm and uses it in a lawful act of 30 self-defense or defense of another; or 31

1 (2) to any firearm obtained by a minor under the 2 age of <u>16</u> <u>14</u> because of an unlawful entry of the premises 3 by the minor or another person.

4 (d) For the purposes of this Section, "firearm" has the
5 meaning ascribed to it in Section 1.1 of the Firearm Owners
6 Identification Card Act.
