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AN ACT in relation to public health.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Department of Public Health Powers and
Duties Law of the Civil Administrative Code of Illinois is
amended by changing Section 2310-315 as follows:

9 Sec. 2310-315. Prevention and treatment of AIDS. To 10 perform the following in relation to the prevention and 11 treatment of acquired immunodeficiency syndrome (AIDS):

(1) Establish a State AIDS Control Unit within the
Department as a separate administrative subdivision, to
coordinate all State programs and services relating to the
prevention, treatment, and amelioration of AIDS.

16 (2) Conduct a public information campaign for physicians, hospitals, health facilities, public health 17 departments, law enforcement personnel, public employees, 18 19 laboratories, and the general public on acquired 20 immunodeficiency syndrome (AIDS) and promote necessary measures to reduce the incidence of AIDS and the mortality 21 22 from AIDS. This program shall include, but not be limited to, the establishment of a statewide hotline and a State AIDS 23 information clearinghouse that will provide periodic reports 24 and releases to public officials, health professionals, 25 26 community service organizations, and the general public 27 regarding new developments or procedures concerning prevention and treatment of AIDS. 28

The 16 Department shall prescribe by rule minimum criteria, standards and procedures for the establishment and operation 17 18 of such services, which shall include, but not be limited to 19 requirements for the provision of information, counseling and 20 referral services that ensure appropriate counseling and 21 referral for persons whose blood is tested and shows evidence 22 of exposure to the human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) or 23 other identified causative agent of acquired immunodeficiency 24 syndrome (AIDS).
