1 AN ACT in relation to vehicles.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 2 3 represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 5. The Illinois Vehicle Code is amended by changing Section 11-1201 as follows: 5

б (625 ILCS 5/11-1201) (from Ch. 95 1/2, par. 11-1201) Sec. 11-1201. Obedience to signal indicating approach of 7 8 train.

(a) Whenever any person driving a vehicle approaches a 9 10 railroad grade crossing where the driver is not always required to stop, the person must exercise due care and 11 caution as the existence of a railroad track across a highway 12 13 is a warning of danger, and under any of the circumstances stated in this Section, the driver shall stop within 50 feet 14 but not less than 15 feet from the nearest rail of the 15 railroad and shall not proceed until the tracks are clear and 16 he or she can do so safely. The foregoing requirements shall 17 18 apply when:

19 1. A clearly visible electric or mechanical signal 20 device gives warning of the immediate approach of a railroad train; 21

22 2. A crossing gate is lowered or a human flagman gives or continues to give a signal of the approach or 23 passage of a railroad train; 24

3. A railroad train approaching a highway crossing 25 26 emits a warning signal and such railroad train, by reason 27 of its speed or nearness to such crossing, is an immediate hazard; 28

4. An approaching railroad train is plainly visible 29 and is in hazardous proximity to such crossing; 30 31

5. A railroad train is approaching so closely that

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an immediate hazard is created.

2 (a-5) Whenever a person driving a vehicle approaches a railroad grade crossing where the driver is not always 3 4 required to stop but must slow down, the person must exercise 5 due care and caution as the existence of a railroad track 6 across a highway is a warning of danger, and under any of the 7 circumstances stated in this Section, the driver shall slow down within 50 feet but not less than 15 feet from the 8 9 nearest rail of the railroad and shall not proceed until he or she checks that the tracks are clear of an approaching 10 11 train.

12 (b) No person shall drive any vehicle through, around or 13 under any crossing gate or barrier at a railroad crossing 14 while such gate or barrier is closed or is being opened or 15 closed.

16 (c) The Department, and local authorities with the the Department, are hereby authorized to 17 approval of designate particularly dangerous highway grade crossings of 18 19 railroads and to erect stop signs thereat. When such stop signs are erected the driver of any vehicle shall stop within 20 50 feet but not less than 15 feet from the nearest rail of 21 22 such railroad and shall proceed only upon exercising due 23 care.

At any railroad grade crossing provided 24 (d) with 25 railroad crossbuck signs, without automatic, electric, or mechanical signal devices, crossing gates, or a human flagman 26 giving a signal of the approach or passage of a train, the 27 driver of a vehicle shall in obedience to the railroad 28 29 crossbuck sign, yield the right-of-way and slow down to a 30 speed reasonable for the existing conditions and shall stop, if required for safety, at a clearly marked stopped line, or 31 32 if no stop line, within 50 feet but not less than 15 feet from the nearest rail of the railroad and shall not proceed 33 until he or she can do so safely. If a driver is involved in 34

a collision at a railroad crossing or interferes with the
movement of a train after driving past the railroad crossbuck
sign, the collision or interference is prima facie evidence
of the driver's failure to yield right-of-way.

5 (d-1) No person shall, while driving a commercial motor 6 vehicle, fail to negotiate a railroad-highway grade railroad 7 crossing because of insufficient undercarriage clearance.

(d-5) (Blank).

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(e) It is unlawful to violate any part of this Section.

10 (1) A violation of this Section is a petty offense 11 for which a fine of \$250 shall be imposed for a first 12 violation, and a fine of \$500 shall be imposed for a 13 second or subsequent violation. The court may impose 25 14 hours of community service in place of the \$250 fine for 15 the first violation.

16 (2) For a second or subsequent violation, the 17 Secretary of State <u>shall</u> may suspend the driving privileges of the offender for a minimum of 6 months. The 18 Secretary shall, as a condition of reinstating the 19 driving privileges of the offender, require the offender 20 21 to participate in a driver remedial or rehabilitative 22 program.

(f) Corporate authorities of municipal corporations regulating operators of vehicles that fail to obey signals indicating the presence, approach, passage, or departure of a train shall impose fines as established in subsection (e) of this Section.
