16 WHEREAS, Mrs. Moisa worked during World War II to produce 17 artillery shells while her husband served in the U.S. Army; 18 following the sudden death of her husband, she worked at the 19 Stephens-Adamson factory in Aurora to support her three sons, 20 Gerald, John and James, and to pay off her home; her primary 21 hobby was gardening; and

22 WHEREAS, Her passing has been felt by many, especially 23 her sons, Gerald (Kathleen) Moisa, John (Christine) Moisa, 24 and James Moisa; her sister, Cornelia "Nellie" Johnson; her 25 grandchildren, David, Lisa, John and Nicole; her 26 great-grandchild, Kyle; and many nieces and nephews; 27 therefore, be it
