

Youth Fire Setting Interventions in Illinois (2024-1)

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Purpose

Under provisions of the Fire Investigation Act (425 ILCS 25/13.2) established by Public Act 103-0307, the Office of the State Fire Marshal (OSFM) is tasked with providing semiannual and annual reports on Youth Fire Setting Interventions.

Background

The Youth Fire Setter Intervention Program is a statewide standardized program to provide prevention education and intervention, and referrals, if warranted, for the children and families of Illinois to reduce the frequency and severity of fires set by youths. The Office of the State Fire Marshal (OSFM) receives requests for Interventionists from fire departments, law enforcement, social service organizations, and members of the public to conduct an assessment of youth exhibiting fire setting interest or behaviors. Properly targeted, designed, and delivered prevention education, as well as other interventions, can address youth fire setting interest or behaviors.
