SENATE RESOLUTION 88

SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 89

WHEREAS, The State is in need of substantial support for private equity, technology and economic development; and

WHEREAS, Private equity is a vital aspect of the Illinois economy providing needed private capital to early and late stage companies in various industries, including but not limited to: retail, restaurant, manufacturing, biotechnology, pharmaceutical, medical devices, homeland security, software, wireless communications, transportation, and agriculture; and

WHEREAS, The development of the private equity sector of the Illinois economy offers the best opportunity for long-term economic vitality, for the expansion of jobs, for the improvement of productivity and a quality standard of living, and for providing the greatest number of citizens with genuine opportunity; and

WHEREAS, Significant functions of government are to increase opportunities for gainful employment, to encourage the flow of private capital for investment in small and large enterprises, and to otherwise improve the prosperity, health, and general welfare of the inhabitants of the State; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE NINETY-THIRD GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that there is created the Private Equity Task Force consisting of 6 members, 3 appointed by the President of the Senate, 2 appointed by the Senate Minority Leader, and one appointed by the Governor, all of whom shall serve without compensation but shall be reimbursed for their reasonable and necessary expenses from funds appropriated for that purpose; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Task Force shall study various issues relating to private equity in Illinois and the needs of businesses receiving private capital investment; the Task Force shall examine, among any other issues it chooses to investigate with respect to venture capital, private equity, and technology, the following issues:

1) the appropriate role of public and private collaboration in private equity investing,

- 2) the relationship between public limited partners and Illinois private equity partnerships,
- 3) the opportunities for employment in private equity-backed businesses and industries,
- 4) the review of existing State resources and programs that assist in the development of biotechnology and homeland security,
- 5) the status and successes of technology transfer and entrepreneurial development in Illinois and the United States; and
 - 6) the tax structure affecting Illinois private equity and portfolio companies; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Task Force shall receive the assistance of legislative staff, may employ skilled experts with the approval of the President of the Senate, and shall report its findings to the General Assembly on or before March 1, 2004.
