"New residential construction" means any original construction of a single-family home or a dwelling containing 2 or fewer apartments, condominiums, or town houses.

"Residential building code" means an ordinance, resolution, law, housing or building code, or zoning ordinance that establishes, for residential building contractors, construction-related activities applicable to single-family or 2-family residential structures.

"Residential building contractor" means any individual, corporation, or partnership that constructs a fixed building or structure for sale or use by another as a residence or that, for a price, commission, fee, wage, or other compensation, undertakes or offers to undertake the construction of any building or structure to be used by another as a residence, if the individual, corporation, or partnership reasonably expects to earn a financial profit from that activity.

Section 15. Adoption of Code. The International Residential Code is incorporated and adopted by reference as though fully set forth in this Act.

Section 20. Applicability of Code. The International Residential Code applies to every area of this State that is not otherwise subject to a residential building code adopted by a county or municipality.

Section 25. Administration. The Office of Banks and Real Estate shall administer this Act and shall adopt all rules necessary for that administration.

Section 30. Illinois Building Commission. The Illinois Building Commission shall advise the Office of Banks and Real Estate concerning the administration of this Act.

Section 90. The Illinois Building Commission Act is amended by adding Section 37 as follows: (20 ILCS 3918/37 new)

Sec. 37. Residential Building Code Act. The Commission shall advise the Office of Banks and Real Estate concerning the administration of the Residential Building Code Act.

Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect on January 1, 2004.".
