#### **PROCLAMATION**

04-196

WHEREAS, the Department of Human Services has proposed the transition of payment methodology for certain health care and social service providers from a grant methodology to a fee-for-service methodology; and

WHEREAS, the General Assembly has proposed legislative action addressing this issue;

THEREFORE, pursuant to Article IV, Section 5 (b) of the Illinois Constitution of 1970, I hereby call and convene the 93<sup>rd</sup> General Assembly in a special session to commence on July 2, 2004, at 12:00 p.m., to consider any legislation (new or pending), which will address directly any fee-for-service initiatives proposed to be implemented by the Department of Human Services.

#### SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 3

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE NINETY-THIRD GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, AT THE SIXTH SPECIAL SESSION THEREOF, that a Committee of three (3) members of the Senate be appointed, two (2) members to be appointed by the President and one (1) member to be appointed by the Minority Leader, to approve any and all Journals of the Senate for all days of the Sixth Special Session of the Ninety-Third General Assembly where such Journals, prior to adjournment SINE DIE, have not been approved by the body as a whole.
