If a public water district issues a boil order, temporary water shut-off for commercial users, or other Tier 1 notification concerning the potability or safety of water, the district must give written notification to any certified local health department that serves an area subject to the order or warning as soon as is practical, but no later than 2 hours after the district learns of the violation or situation. The notification must include the estimated duration of the order or warning and the geographic area covered by the order or warning.

Section 10. The Water Service District Act is amended by adding Section 5.2 as follows: (70 ILCS 3710/5.2 new)

Sec. 5.2. Boil order, temporary shutoff, or Tier 1 notification; notification of certified local health department required. If a water service district issues a boil order, temporary water shut-off for commercial users, or other Tier 1 notification concerning the potability or safety of water, the district must give written notification to any certified local health department that serves an area subject to the order or warning as soon as is practical, but no later than 2 hours after the district learns of the violation or situation. The notification must include the estimated duration of the order or warning and the geographic area covered by the order or warning.

Section 15. The Water Authorities Act is amended by adding Section 6c as follows: (70 ILCS 3715/6c new)

Sec. 6c. Boil order, temporary shut-off, or Tier 1 notification; notification of certified local health department required. If a water authority issues a boil order, temporary water shut-off for commercial users, or other Tier 1 notification concerning the potability or safety of water, the authority must give written notification to any certified local health department that serves an area subject to the order or warning as soon as is practical, but no later than 2 hours after the authority learns of the violation or situation. The notification must include the estimated duration of the order or warning and the geographic area covered by the order or warning.

Section 20. The Water Commission Act of 1985 is amended by adding Section 2.5 as follows: (70 ILCS 3720/2.5 new)

Sec. 2.5. Boil order, temporary shut-off, or Tier 1 notification; notification of certified local health department required. If a water commission issues a boil order, temporary water shut-off for commercial users, or other Tier 1 notification concerning the potability or safety of water, the commission must give written notification to any certified local health department that serves an area subject to the order or warning as soon as is practical, but no later than 2 hours after the commission learns of the violation or situation. The notification must include the estimated duration of the order or warning and the

# geographic area covered by the order or warning.

Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon becoming law.".

WHEREAS, The Social Security Fairness Act of 2003 amends title II of the Social Security Act to repeal the Government Pension Offset and the Windfall Elimination Provision; and

WHEREAS, The Government Pension Offset was enacted in 1977 and the Windfall Elimination Provision was enacted in 1983; and

WHEREAS, The majority of public employees affected by the Government Pension Offset lost their entire spousal benefit despite the fact that their spouses paid Social Security contributions for many years; and

WHEREAS, An affected public employee loses an average of \$3,000 per year because of the Government Pension Offset; and

WHEREAS, The Windfall Elimination Provision causes public employees to lose up to 60% of the benefits that they earned; and

WHEREAS, According to the Social Security Administration's actuaries, the long-term cost of eliminating both of these provisions is negligible while the loss of income to affected employees caused by these provisions forces some civil servants into poverty; and

WHEREAS, These provisions discriminate against teachers, police, firefighters, social workers, and other civil servants; and

WHEREAS, The State and national shortage of teachers, police officers, and firefighters is exacerbated by these provisions because they discourage people from entering and staying in these professions; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE NINETY-THIRD GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge the U.S. Congress to pass the Social Security Fairness Act of 2003 or other legislation that eliminates both the Government Pension Offset and the Windfall Elimination Provision; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to the President pro tempore of the U.S. Senate, the Speaker of the U.S. House of Representatives, and each member of the Illinois Congressional delegation.
