READING BILLS FROM THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES A SECOND TIME

On motion of Senator Jacobs, **House Bill No. 378** having been printed, was taken up and read by title a second time.

Committee Amendment No. 1 was held in the Committee on Rules.

Senator Jacobs offered the following amendment and moved its adoption:

AMENDMENT NO. 2

AMENDMENT NO. ____2__. Amend House Bill 378 on page 1, by replacing all of line 5 with the following:

"Sections 6-142 and 6-210.1 as follows:

(40 ILCS 5/6-142) (from Ch. 108 1/2, par. 6-142)

- Sec. 6-142. Wives and widows not entitled to annuities.
- (A) Except as provided in subsection (B), the following wives or widows have no right to annuity from the fund:
 - (a) A wife or widow married subsequent to the effective date of a fireman who dies in service if she was not married to him before he attained age 63;
 - (b) A wife or widow of a fireman who withdraws, whether or not he enters upon annuity, and dies while out of service, if the marriage occurred after the effective date and she was not his wife while he was in service and before he attained age 63;
 - (c) A wife or widow of a fireman who (1) has served 10 or more years, (2) dies out of service after he has withdrawn from service, and (3) has withdrawn or applied for refund of the sums to his credit for annuity to which he had a right to refund;
 - (d) A wife or widow of a fireman who dies out of service after he has withdrawn before age 63, and who has not served at least 10 years;
 - (e) A wife whose marriage was dissolved or widow of a fireman whose judgment of dissolution of marriage from her fireman husband is annulled, vacated or set aside by proceedings in court subsequent to the death of the fireman, unless (1) such proceedings are filed within 5 years after the date of the dissolution of marriage and within one year after the death of the fireman and (2) the board is made a party to the proceedings;
 - (f) A wife or widow who married the fireman while he was in receipt of disability benefit or disability pension from this fund, unless he returned to the service subsequent to the marriage and remained therein for a period or periods aggregating one year, or died while in service.
- (B) Beginning on <u>January 16, 2004</u> the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 93rd General Assembly, the limitation on marriage after withdrawal under subdivision (A)(b) and the limitation on

marriage during disability under subdivision (A)(f) no longer apply to a widow who was married to the deceased fireman before the fireman begins to receive a retirement annuity and for at least one year immediately preceding the date of death, regardless of whether the deceased fireman is in service on or after the effective date of Public Act 93-654 or this amendatory Act of the 93rd General Assembly; except that this subsection (B) does not apply to the widow of a fireman who received a refund of contributions for widow's annuity under Section 6-160, unless the refund is repaid to the Fund, with interest at the rate of 4% per year, compounded annually, from the date of the refund to the date of repayment.

If the widow of a fireman who died before <u>January 16, 2004</u> the effective date of this amendatory Act becomes eligible for a widow's annuity because of <u>Public Act 93-654</u> this amendatory Act, the annuity shall begin to accrue on the date of application for the annuity, but in no event sooner than <u>January 16</u>, 2004 the effective date of this amendatory Act.

The changes to this Section made by this amendatory Act of the 93rd General Assembly apply without regard to whether the deceased fireman was in service on or after its effective date. If the widow of a fireman who died before the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 93rd General Assembly becomes eligible for a widow's annuity because of this amendatory Act, the annuity shall begin to accrue on the date of application for the annuity, but in no event sooner than January 16, 2004. (Source: P.A. 93-654, eff. 1-16-04.)".

On motion of Senator Silverstein, **House Bill No. 2028** having been printed, was taken up and read by title a second time.

The following amendment was offered in the Committee on Licensed Activities, adopted and ordered printed:

AMENDMENT NO. 1

AMENDMENT NO. $\underline{}$ Amend House Bill 2028 by replacing everything after the enacting clause with the following:

"Section 5. The Illinois Plumbing License Law is amended by changing Section 13.1 as follows: (225 ILCS 320/13.1)

Sec. 13.1. Plumbing contractors; registration; applications.

- (1) On and after May 1, 2002, all persons or corporations desiring to engage in the business of plumbing contractor, other than any entity that maintains an audited net worth of shareholders' equity equal to or exceeding \$100,000,000, shall register in accordance with the provisions of this Act.
- (2) Application for registration shall be filed with the Department each year, on or before the last day of April, in writing and on forms prepared and furnished by the Department. All plumbing contractor registrations expire on the last day of April of each year.
- (3) Applications shall contain the name, address, and telephone number of the person and the plumbing license of (i) the individual, if a sole proprietorship; (ii) the partner, if a partnership; or (iii) an officer, if a corporation. The application shall contain the business name, address, and telephone number, a current copy of the plumbing license, and any other information the Department may require by rule.
- (4) Applicants shall submit an original certificate of insurance documenting that the contractor carries general liability insurance with a minimum of \$100,000 per occurrence, bodily injury insurance with a minimum of \$300,000 aggregate for bodily injury per occurrence, property damage insurance with a minimum of \$50,000 or a minimum of \$300,000 combined single limit, and workers compensation insurance with a minimum \$500,000 employer's liability. No registration may be issued in the absence of this certificate. Certificates must be in force at all times for registration to remain valid.
- (5) Applicants shall submit, on a form provided by the Department, an indemnification bond in the amount of \$20,000 or a letter of credit in the same amount for work performed in accordance with this Act and the rules promulgated under this Act.
- (6) All employees of a registered plumbing contractor who engage in plumbing work shall be licensed plumbers or apprentice plumbers in accordance with this Act.
- (7) Plumbing contractors shall submit an annual registration fee in an amount to be established by rule.
 - (8) The Department shall be notified in advance of any changes in the business structure, name, or

location or of the addition or deletion of the owner or officer who is the licensed plumber listed on the application. Failure to notify the Department of this information is grounds for suspension or revocation of the plumbing contractor's registration.

(9) In the event that the plumber's license on the application for registration of a plumbing contractor is a license issued by the City of Chicago, it shall be the responsibility of the applicant to forward a copy of the plumber's license to the Department, noting the name of the registered plumbing contractor, when it is renewed.

Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon becoming law.".

on page 2, replacing line 12 with the following

"consultation with the Department, shall adopt the Code as minimum"; and

on page 2, by replacing lines 14 through 17 with the following:

"and additions to all commercial buildings in the State. The Board may".

AMENDMENT NO. 2 ... Amend House Bill 4135 on page 1, line 15, by inserting "or", after ":"; and

on page 1, line 18, by replacing "; or" with "."; and

on page 1, by deleting lines 19 through 21.

The motion prevailed.

And the amendment was adopted, and ordered printed.

There being no further amendments, the bill, as amended, was ordered to a third reading.

On motion of Senator del Valle, **House Bill No. 4176** was taken up, read by title a second time and ordered to a third reading.

On motion of Senator Righter, **House Bill No. 4247** having been printed, was taken up and read by title a second time.

Senator Righter offered the following amendment and moved its adoption:

AMENDMENT NO. 1

AMENDMENT NO. 1 . Amend House Bill 4247 on page 2, in line 11, by deleting "or judicial".

The motion prevailed.

And the amendment was adopted, and ordered printed.

There being no further amendments, the bill, as amended, was ordered to a third reading.

On motion of Senator Link, **House Bill No. 4870** was taken up, read by title a second time and ordered to a third reading.

On motion of Senator Winkel, **House Bill No. 6574** having been printed, was taken up and read by title a second time.

Senator Winkel offered the following amendment and moved its adoption:

AMENDMENT NO. 1

AMENDMENT NO.___1__. Amend House Bill 6574 by replacing everything after the enacting clause with the following:

"Section 5. The University of Illinois Act is amended by adding Section 1g as follows:

"(110 ILCS 305/1g new)

Sec. 1g. Disclosure of electronic mail addresses.

(a) Except as otherwise provided by law, the University may not disclose the electronic mail addresses of any University employee or student if the disclosure is likely to result in the employee or student receiving an unsolicited mass communication.

(b) Single or consecutive requests for the electronic mail addresses of more than 25 employees or students are presumed to be made for the purpose of unsolicited mass communications. Requests for electronic mail addresses by the news media, however, are not considered to be made for the purpose of unsolicited mass communications regardless of the amount of the addresses requested if the requests are made to access and disseminate information regarding the health, safety, welfare, or legal rights of the general public."

The motion prevailed.

And the amendment was adopted, and ordered printed.

There being no further amendments, the bill, as amended, was ordered to a third reading.

On motion of Senator Sieben, House Bill No. 6583 was taken up, read by title a second time.

Floor Amendment No. 1 was tabled in the Committee on Revenue.

Floor Amendment No. 2 was held in the Committee on Rules.

There being no further amendments the bill was ordered to a third reading.

On motion of Senator Winkel, **House Bill No. 6683** having been printed, was taken up and read by title a second time.

Senator Winkel offered the following amendment and moved its adoption:

AMENDMENT NO. 1

AMENDMENT NO. $_$ 1 $_$. Amend House Bill 6683 on page 1, line 13, by replacing " $\underline{7}$ " with " $\underline{3}$ "; and

on page 1, line 13, by replacing "30" with "3"; and

on page 1, line 16, after the period, by inserting "This Section is repealed 3 years after the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 93rd General Assembly.".

The motion prevailed.

And the amendment was adopted, and ordered printed.

There being no further amendments, the bill, as amended, was ordered to a third reading.

On motion of Senator Jacobs, House Bill No. 7015 was taken up, read by title a second time.

Floor Amendment No. 1 was held in the Committee on Rules. There being no further amendments the bill was ordered to a third reading.

On motion of Senator Trotter, **House Bill No. 7030** was taken up, read by title a second time and ordered to a third reading.

On motion of Senator Obama, **House Bill No. 2268** having been printed, was taken up and read by title a second time.

The following amendment was offered in the Committee on Insurance and Pensions, adopted and ordered printed:

AMENDMENT NO. 1

AMENDMENT NO. __1__. Amend House Bill 2268 on page 2 by replacing lines 28 through 33 with the following:

"the Secretary of Human Services or his designee, all of whom shall be ex-officio non-voting members. Voting members of the Commission shall include one member appointed by the President of the Senate, one member appointed by the Minority Leader of the Senate, one member appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and one member appointed by the Minority Leader of the House of Representatives. The remaining 21 members shall be appointed by the Governor and shall include health care consumers including individuals with disabilities, and persons over the age of 65, advocates for health care consumers, health care providers, physicians including family physicians, health care administrators, representatives from the business community, economists, representatives of organized labor, nurses, social workers, representatives of statewide advocacy organizations for persons with disabilities, and representatives of statewide advocacy organizations for senior citizens. Appointment of members of the Commission shall ensure proportional representation with respect to geography, ethnicity, race, gender, and age. The Commission shall have a chairperson and a vice-chairperson who shall be elected by the voting members at the first meeting of the Commission. The members of the Commission shall be appointed within 90 days of the effective date of this Act. The State agencies represented on the Commission shall work cooperatively to provide administrative support for the Commission."; and

on page 3 by deleting lines 1 through 23; and

on page 4 by replacing line 2 with the following:

"Department of Public Health, subject to appropriation or the availability of other funds for such purposes and using a public request for"; and

on page 4 by replacing line 33 with the following:

"make recommendations that shall be considered by the General Assembly as the basis for a health".

There being no further amendments, the bill, as amended, was ordered to a third reading.

Senator Halvorson asked and obtained unanimous consent to recess for the purpose of a Democrat caucus.

Senator Burzynski announced there would be a Republican caucus immediately following recess.

The State Treasurer and Comptroller shall transfer the amounts designated under this Section as soon as may be practicable after receiving the direction to transfer from the Director of the Governor's Office of Management and Budget.
