As drafted, House Bill 826 will allow corporate authorities to impose up to a 1% sales tax to pay for the implementation of business district redevelopment plans in blighted areas. However, the bill authorizes the sales tax increase without a referendum. Pursuant to Article IV, Section 9(e) of the Illinois Constitution of 1970, I hereby return House Bill 826 entitled "AN ACT in relation to municipal government," with the following specific recommendations for change:

on page 4, line 9, by deleting "by ordinance"; and

on page 5, immediately below line 19, by inserting the following:

"(5) Any tax imposed under subsection (12) or (13) of Section 11-74.3-3 may not be levied until the question of levying the tax has been submitted to the electors of the municipality at a regular election and approved by a majority of the electors voting on the question. The corporate authorities must certify the question to the proper election authority, which must submit the question at an election in accordance with the Election Code.

The election authority must submit the question concerning the tax under subsection (12) of Section 11-74.3-3 in substantially the following form:

Shall the corporate authorities of (name of municipality) be authorized to levy a retailers' occupation tax and a service occupation tax in the (business district) at a rate of (rate) % for the planning, execution, and implementation of business district plans and to pay the business district project costs as set forth in the business district plan approved by the municipality.

The election authority must submit the question concerning the tax under subsection (13) of Section 11-74.3-3 in substantially the following form:

Shall the corporate authorities of (name of municipality) be authorized to levy a hotel operators' occupation tax in the (business district) at a rate of (rate) % for the planning, execution, and implementation of business district plans and to pay the business district project costs as set forth in the business district plan approved by the municipality.

The election authority must record the votes as "Yes" or "No".

If a majority of the electors voting on the question vote in the affirmative, the corporate authorities may thereafter levy the tax."; and

on page 6, line 15, by changing "by ordinance or resolution, impose" to "after approval at a referendum conducted in accordance with item (5) of Section 11-74.3-5, impose, under the authority granted by subsection (12) of Section 11-74.3-3,"; and

on page 14, line 25, by changing "By ordinance," to "After approval at a referendum conducted in accordance with item (5) of Section 11-74.3-5,"

on page 14, line 26, after "impose", by inserting ", under the authority granted by subsection (13) of Section 11-74.3-3,".

With these changes, House Bill 826 will have my approval. I respectively request your concurrence.

Pursuant to Article IV, Section 9(e) of the Illinois Constitution of 1970, I hereby return House Bill 2220 entitled "AN ACT in relation to public aid," with the following specific recommendations for change:

on page 5, line 6, by replacing the phrase "July 1, 2004" with the phrase "January 1, 2005". As currently drafted, House Bill 2220 will have a detrimental effect on federal matching funds. Changes in rates (or rate methodology) require a state plan amendment, which in turn requires a thirty-day public notice. Without an approved state plan amendment, no federal financial participation (FFP) can be collected. An effective date of January 1, 2005, rather than the current date of July 1, 2004, would provide sufficient time to insure federal compliance with the requirements to obtain FFP.

With this change, House Bill 2220 will have my approval. I respectively request your concurrence.

Pursuant to Article IV, Section 9(b) of the Illinois Constitution of 1970, I hereby veto House Bill 4651, entitled "AN ACT concerning mobile homes." This bill reduces minimum setback requirements for mobile homes. As a result, House Bill 4651 weakens fire safety standards for mobile home parks and raises legitimate safety concerns for local fire departments. In addition, it preempts a home rule entity from establishing more restrictive setback requirements. More restrictive setback requirements may be necessary depending on the needs and desires of a particular community.

For this reason, I hereby veto and return House Bill 4651.

- (b) In counties with a population of not less than 500,000 and not more than 800,000, a lease to any other department of State government, any authority, commission, or agency of the State, or a municipality, county, or township of the State, including in any land lease the corresponding vertical rights, subterranean and air rights, and sublease rights, may be for a period of time no longer than 25 years.
- (c) In counties with a population of not less than 3,000,000, a lease initially entered into within one year after the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 93rd General Assembly, including in any land lease the corresponding vertical rights, subterranean and air rights, and sublease rights, may be for a period of time no longer than 35 years. The land or property shall be leased by the Department at fair market value.
