Mr. President -- I am directed to inform the Senate that the House of Representatives has passed a bill of the following title, the veto of the Governor notwithstanding, in the passage of which I am instructed to ask the concurrence of the Senate, to-wit:

HOUSE BILL 5377

A bill for AN ACT concerning property.

I am further instructed to deliver to you the objections of the Governor which are contained in the attached copy of his letter to the House of Representatives:

To the Honorable Members of the Illinois House of Representatives 94th General Assembly

Pursuant to Article IV, Section 9(b) of the Illinois Constitution of 1970, I hereby veto House Bill 5377, entitled "AN ACT concerning property." While I recognize and appreciate the hard work of all the sponsors in passing this legislation, the bill would apply to only 3 of the approximately 900 Illinois mobile home parks. Legislation addressing mobile home park leasing policies should apply uniformly to all Illinois mobile home parks.

For this reason, I hereby veto and return House Bill 5377.
