SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 200

WHEREAS, Certain communities on the Northwest side of the City of Chicago (including Edison Park, Norwood Park, Jefferson Park, Gladstone Park, and Big Oaks) lay underneath the key nighttime air routes that converge over the community; this includes 5 glide paths, 2 major take-off plates, air routes, all used after 10 p.m.; and

WHEREAS, These communities of the City of Chicago seek a solution to the nighttime sleep

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interruptions during the hours of 10 p.m. and 7 a.m., including the shoulder hours as well; and

WHEREAS, The Nextgen Program is currently being applied at O'Hare International Airport, where flights that used to be 5-miles spaced apart will soon have only a 3-mile separation, times 6 east-to-west approach patterns for all inbound flights; and

WHEREAS, These communities of the City of Chicago are experiencing higher levels of jet noise, especially during the phase 1 nighttime flight operations; and

WHEREAS, The current fly quiet program needs to be re-evaluated for the purposes of instilling and sharing the primary purpose of flight and community partnership at O'Hare International Airport with all of the collar communities; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE NINETY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge the Federal Aeronautics Administration and O'Hare International Airport authorities to decrease jet noise over the communities of Northwest Chicago by establishing a full-time fly quiet program and urge the creation and passage of a federal homeowner's aviation fly quiet act; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to the Commissioner of O'Hare International Airport, the Acting Administrator of the Federal Aeronautics Administration, and to each member of the Illinois congressional delegation.

Senator Sandoval offered the following Senate Resolution, which was referred to the Committee on Assignments:

SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 201

WHEREAS, The members of the Illinois Senate wish to recognize Fox College on its storied history and the contributions it has made to the field of higher education; and

WHEREAS, Fox College was founded in 1932 by Earl B. Fox, an educator and former high school principal; his vison was to have a small, exclusive school dedicated to producing the very best executive and legal assistants; ambitious and motivated individuals from the Chicago metropolitan area were accepted and extremely high standards were maintained in a highly specialized program; graduates possessed strong workplace skills and a strong sense of direction, maturity, and confidence; and

WHEREAS, Fox College has gone through changes throughout the years just as society has; while the philosophy of high standards and educational challenge has remained, the programs and curricula have evolved to prepare students to compete in the global economy of today; and

WHEREAS, Last year 75% of Fox College first-time/full-time students graduated from their programs; 97% of students seeking assistance secured employment in their area of study; minorities, including Hispanics, African Americans, and Asians, compose nearly half of the student body at the school today; and

WHEREAS, The mission of Fox College is that of an institution of higher learning that combines general education and professional education in applied programs that prepare motivated students for success in specialized careers; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE NINETY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we celebrate the history of Fox College and recognize its commitment to the community and the field of higher education; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be presented to Fox College as a symbol of our esteem and respect.

Senator Sandoval offered the following Senate Joint Resolution, which was referred to the Committee on Assignments:

SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 31

WHEREAS, Section 14.1 of the Toll Highway Act provides that prior to the issuance of bonds for or the commencement of construction of any new toll highway, that particular toll highway shall be authorized by joint resolution of the General Assembly; and

WHEREAS, In 1995 by Senate Joint Resolution 45 (the 1995 Resolution) the General Assembly approved the expansion of the Illinois toll highway system to include an O'Hare Airport Bypass with Extension, with the Bypass to be constructed generally along the western edge of the O'Hare Airport between I-90 (Northwest Tollway) near Elmhurst Road and I-294 (Tri-State Tollway) near Grand Avenue, and with the extension to be constructed in a generally East-West direction between I-290 (near Thorndale Avenue) at the West and the Bypass at the East; and

WHEREAS, It is necessary and appropriate, following extensive multi-agency public outreach culminating in recommendations agreed upon by all communities along the proposed Elgin-O'Hare corridor to proceed with construction of new toll highway facilities, to update the 1995 Resolution to reflect the current project recommendation as outlined in the October 2012 Tier 2 Final Environmental Impact Statement that was jointly executed by the Federal Aviation Administration, Federal Highway Administration, Illinois Department of Transportation, and Illinois State Toll Highway Authority; and

WHEREAS, It may be necessary and appropriate to expand the project limits over time to adhere to future additions or expansions of the EOWA project; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE NINETY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING HEREIN, that the Illinois State Toll Highway Authority be authorized to expand the Illinois toll highway system, under a project to be known as the Elgin-O'Hare Western Access (EOWA), to include an O'Hare Airport Bypass with Extension, general access to O'Hare Airport primarily from the West and South, with the Bypass to be constructed generally along the western edge of the O'Hare Airport between I-90 (Northwest Tollway) near Elmhurst Road and I-294 (Tri-State Tollway) near Grand Avenue, and with the Extension to be constructed in a generally East-West direction between the Bypass at the East and the western terminus of the Elgin-O'Hare Expressway at U.S. 20 to the West; including, but not limited to, any necessary access ramps and bridges; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Illinois State Toll Highway Authority, in performing work to complete the EOWA project, consider and utilize, to the extent practicable, available technology and construction processes intended to reduce the environmental impact of the project on surrounding areas, and to perform work that will facilitate establishment of future freight inter-modal transport, and alternative transport modes including rail transit, bicycle, and pedestrian within the project area; and be it further

RESOLVED, That that the Illinois State Toll Highway Authority shall complete the EOWA project in a manner that supports diversity involvement in the project work and economic development in the region; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a copy of this preamble and resolution be immediately forwarded to each of the Directors of the Illinois State Toll Highway Authority.
