SENATE BILL RECALLED

On motion of Senator Sullivan, Senate Bill No. 82 was recalled from the order of third reading to the order of second reading.

AMENDMENT NO. 1 TO SENATE BILL 82

AMENDMENT NO. 1. Amend Senate Bill 82 by replacing everything after the enacting clause with the following:

"Section 5. The School Code is amended by changing Section 10-10.5 as follows:

(105 ILCS 5/10-10.5)

- Sec. 10-10.5. Community unit school district or combined school district formation; school board election.
- (a) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (b) of this Section, for community unit school districts formed before January 1, 1975 and for combined school districts formed before July 1, 1983, the following provisions apply:
 - (1) if the territory of the district is greater than 2 congressional townships or 72 square miles, then not more than 3 board members may be selected from any one congressional township, except that congressional townships of less than 100 inhabitants shall not be considered for the purpose of this mandatory board representation;
 - (2) if in the community unit school district or combined school district at least 75% but not more than 90% of the population is in one congressional township, then 4 board members shall be selected from the congressional township and 3 board members shall be selected from the rest of the district, except that if in the community unit school district or combined school district more than 90% of the population is in one congressional township, then all board members may be selected from one or more congressional townships; and
 - (3) if the territory of any community unit school district or combined school district consists of not more than 2 congressional townships or 72 square miles, but consists of more than one congressional township or 36 square miles, outside of the corporate limits of any city, village, or incorporated town within the school district, then not more than 5 board members may be selected from any city, village, or incorporated town in the school district.
- (b)(1) The provisions of subsection (a) of this Section for mandatory board representation shall no longer apply to a community unit school district formed before January 1, 1975, to a combined school district

formed before July 1, 1983, or to community consolidated school districts, and the members of the board of education shall be elected at large from within the school district and without restriction by area of residence within the district if both of the following conditions are met with respect to that district:

- (A) A proposition for the election of board members at large and without restriction by area of residence within the school district rather than in accordance with the provisions of subsection (a) of this Section for mandatory board representation is submitted to the school district's voters at a regular school election or at the general election as provided in this subsection (b).
- (B) A majority of those voting at the election in each congressional township comprising the territory of the school district, including any congressional township of less than 100 inhabitants, vote in favor of the proposition or two-thirds of all voters voting on the proposition vote in favor of the proposition.
- (2) The school board may, by resolution, order submitted or, upon the petition of the lesser of 2,500 or 5% of the school district's registered voters, shall order submitted to the school district's voters, at a regular school election or at the general election, the proposition for the election of board members at large and without restriction by area of residence within the district rather than in accordance with the provisions of subsection (a) of this Section for mandatory board representation; and the proposition shall thereupon be certified by the board's secretary for submission.
- (3) If a majority of those voting at the election in each congressional township comprising the territory of the school district, including any congressional township of less than 100 inhabitants, vote in favor of the proposition or if two-thirds of all voters voting on the proposition vote in favor of the proposition:
 - (A) the proposition to elect board members at large and without restriction by area of residence within the district shall be deemed to have passed,
 - (B) new members of the board shall be elected at large and without restriction by area of residence within the district at the next regular school election, and
 - (C) the terms of office of the board members incumbent at the time the proposition is adopted shall expire when the new board members that are elected at large and without restriction by area of residence within the district have organized in accordance with Section 10-16.
- (4) In a community unit school district, a combined school district, or a community consolidated school district that formerly elected its members under subsection (a) of this Section to successive terms not exceeding 4 years, the members elected at large and without restriction by area of residence within the district shall be elected for a term of 4 years, and in a community unit school district or combined school district that formerly elected its members under subsection (a) of this Section to successive terms not exceeding 6 years, the members elected at large and without restriction by area of residence within the district shall be elected for a term of 6 years; provided that in each case the terms of the board members initially elected at large and without restriction by area of residence within the district as provided in this subsection (b) shall be staggered and determined in accordance with the provisions of Sections 10-10 and 10-16 of this Code.

PRESENTATION OF RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, The Granite City Works steel mill has operated since 1878; it was originally founded by brothers William and Frederick Niedringhaus as the Granite Iron Rolling Mills, and most recently, owned by United States Steel Corporation; and

WHEREAS, The Granite City Works has been an industry leader in sheet steel products for customers in the construction, container, piping and tubing, service center, and automotive industries; and

WHEREAS, Granite City Works has an annual raw steelmaking capability of 2.8 million net tons; and

WHEREAS, Global influences in the market such as reduced steel prices, unfair trade practices, imports, and fluctuating oil prices, continue to have a dramatic negative impact on the steel production industry; and

WHEREAS, Domestic steelmakers continue to lose substantial sales to foreign countries, particularly China and South Korea, which have "dumped" their steel products into the United States market at prices below fair market value; and

WHEREAS, Due to these disruptions in the steel market, on March 25, 2015, United States Steel Corporation announced that it will temporarily idle the Granite City mill and lay off 2,080 steel workers by or after May 28, 2015; and

WHEREAS, Granite City Works is a vital part of the Metro-East economy, and the loss of this mill would be devastating to thousands of families and the financial well-being of the entire region; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE NINETY-NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge the President of the United States and Congress to review the national tariff policy on steel goods and take action similar to the 2002 actions of President George W. Bush and Congress; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we urge the President of the United States and Congress to consider all possible trade and economic policies to protect this vital American industry and minimize the financial impact on these hardworking men and women; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be presented to the President and Vice-President of the United States, the Majority and Minority Leaders of the United States Senate, and the Speaker and Minority Leader of the United States House of Representatives.

WHEREAS, Certain consumers have expressed a desire to know, via food product labeling, whether they are purchasing or consuming food that contains ingredients that were developed through bioengineering; and

WHEREAS, The United States Food and Drug Administration, the American Medical Association, the World Health Organization, the United States Department of Agriculture, the National Academy of Sciences, the United Nations Food and Agriculture Organization, and the European Food Safety Authority, among others, have all determined that genetically modified crops grow in the same fashion as those that are not genetically modified and that foods produced with genetically modified ingredients are safe for human consumption; and

WHEREAS, The United States Food and Drug Administration's "Statement of Policy - Foods Derived from New Plant Varieties" was first published in 1992 to address relevant scientific, safety, and regulatory issues prior to the introduction of new plant varieties into the marketplace; and

WHEREAS, Genetic modification technology has been used to produce food products for more than 25 years; and

WHEREAS, Seventy to eighty percent of the foods consumed in this country are genetically modified whole products or contain genetically modified ingredients; and

WHEREAS, Consumers in Illinois have a right to know the contents of the food they consume; and

WHEREAS, Any law passed in the State of Illinois regarding food labeling would likely be preempted by similar federal legislation presently being considered in our nation's capital; and

WHEREAS, A national clarification is needed to prevent the unneeded confusion for consumers, retailers, and manufacturers and to prevent an assortment of local and state regulations attempting to accomplish a similar goal; and

WHEREAS, A patchwork of local and state mandatory labeling laws and regulations will require manufacturers and retailers to make immediate and ongoing changes to their operations in order to comply with such requirements, which will undoubtedly result in higher food prices; and

WHEREAS, Requiring separate production runs, state-specific tracking units, segregated warehousing, trucking, and other logistical complexities to comply with a puzzle board of local regulations and state-specific requirements will all result in higher food prices; and

WHEREAS, The National Organic Program housed within the Agricultural Marketing Service of the United States Department of Agriculture excludes the use of bioengineered crops or ingredients for growers wishing to sell their products as "organic"; consumers seeking to avoid food containing ingredients developed through bioengineering may do so by purchasing food labeled as "organic"; and

WHEREAS, Many food marketers, vendors, retailers, and food producers already differentiate various food products that do not contain ingredients developed through bioengineering, by voluntarily affixing "non-GMO" or similar labels on products; third party certifiers, such as the Non-GMO Project, create standards for farmers, processors, and manufacturers in sourcing non-bioengineered crop sources so that consumers who make a decision not to purchase food containing ingredients developed through bioengineering can avoid such products; therefore, be it
