28. Mr...Mr. President, I have thought and thought about getting
29. you something for your birthday that you would be absolutely
30. delighted with. When you've been...when you've been in my office,
31. Mr. President, I know that you have cast long...longing and wistful
32. eyes at this eloquent portrait of Senator Vadalabene and me. Now
33. Senator Harris, these...these are very difficult to get and are

1. in great demand for campaign purposes. I cannot relinquish this,
2. Mr. President. Reprints, as a matter of fact, are being made
3. right now for all members on both sides of the aisle...whose
4. terms expire in two years for campaign purposes, Mr. President.
5. So Senator Vadalabene and I are not at liberty to relinquish
6. this, but I do have an old campaign card, Senator, that I'm
7. going to ask a page to bring to you and I believe Senator
8. Vadalabene has a comment too.

9. PRESIDENT:

10. Senator Vadalabene.

11. SENATOR VADALABENE:

12. Thank you Mr. President. I will concur in the remarks
13. of Senator McBroom. We are in our 25th printing of that
14. photograph. Campaigns all over the State of Illinois, township,
15. city, and county officials have used our picture for fund raising
16. purposes and have had successful campaigns. I too do not have
17. a copy, but I also will give you one of my brochures that I used
18. in my campaign. And happy birthday to you.

19. PRESIDENT:

20. Senator Soper.

21. SENATOR SOPER:

22. Mr. President, members of the Senate, now Senator Nimrod had
23. a birthday here the other day and his candle almost went down to
24. the nubbin and I'd...I'd recommend that you blow out that cake
25. before you start a fire in this place and we got some birthdays
26. coming up, we'll save the candles. Happy birthday, Senator.

27. PRESIDENT:

28. Thank you. Well, thank you very much. Senator Merritt.

29. SENATOR MERRITT:

30. Mr. President, members of the Senate, my secretary of about
31. nine years here in the Senate, wanted me to convey to you that
32. she thought she used very good judgment on the date of May 7,
33. because that likewise is her birthday today, but she tells me she's

1. 39 and holding and I said you're better than that. Thank you.

2. PRESIDENT:

3. Senator Partee.

4. SENATOR PARTEE:

5. I just want you to know on your birthday that apparently
6. Senator McBroom has a better system working for him than I do, be-
7. cause I had a Resolution for your birthday and I...mine hasn't
8. been delivered yet but you'll get it.

9. PRESIDENT:

10. I want to say to you all that this is awfully nice and I...
11. I do deeply appreciate it...the great experience, of course, is
12. this privilege of serving with you, the members of the Senate.
13. And I just want to announce that the cake will be in the President's
14. office and you're all invited to go in and have yourself a bite
15. as suits your convenience. Senator Palmer and then Senator
16. Graham. Senator Palmer.

17. SENATOR PALMER:

18. I don't think that it would be right if the record did not
19. show, Mr. President, that this Resolution was adopted. Somebody
20. should move the adoption. Happy birthday. I move the adoption
21. of the Resolution.

22. PRESIDENT:

23. On that motion then to suspend the rules for immediate
24. consideration. All in favor signify by saying aye. Contrary
25. no. The motion to suspend carries and on the motion to adopt,
26. all in favor signify by saying aye. Contrary no. The motion
27. carries and the Resolution is adopted. Senator Graham.

28. SENATOR GRAHAM:

29. Mr. President and members of the Senate, when I talked with
30. you earlier today, you not knowing at that time you were going
31. to have this cake, I got the indication from you that the best
32. birthday present that we, as a Senate, could present to you
33. would be a calendar that looks like this on June 29th.

1. PRESIDENT:

2. I...I concur. We do have some work to do. I believe
3. we have disposed of...Senator McBroom.

4. SENATOR MCBROOM:

5. Mr. President, I...it's an oversight on my part, I would
6. ask all other members to join with me on the Resolution.

7. Thank you.

8. RESIDENT:

9. Is there leave? So ordered. Senator Knuepfer.

10. SENATOR KNUEPFER:

11. I take it you're recognizing me for purposes of making
12. an announcement?

13. PRESIDENT:

14. Yes.

15. SENATOR KNUEPFER:

16. ...That announcement is, the Committee of the Whole Hearing
17. scheduled on SB 955 is going to have to be postponed from today.
18. The reason being that we had witnesses from California and
19. Washington who were unable to make it. And we will notify the
20. Senate as soon as we are able to obtain those witnesses and
21. hopefully get a reschedule on this, but there will be no
22. Committee of the Whole Hearing.

23. PRESIDENT:

24. Senator Soper.

25. SENATOR SOPER:

26. Mr. President and members of Local Government and all those
27. Sentors having bills in Local Government on Thursday. Now
28. we're going to try and hear all the bills on Thursday. If you've
29. got bills you don't want heard on Thursday, say so because
30. we won't hear them again. We won't schedule them. If we call
31. the bill on Thursday and you're not ready, the bill's going to be
32. dead. We're not going to play games with this thing. We're
33. not going to come here on Friday and have everybody not attend

1. the meeting, that has bills and then have all the committee
2. members get here at 10 o'clock in the morning and sit around
3. like a bunch of dopes. So you better come ready with your
4. bills on Thursday. Thank you.

5. PRESIDENT:

6. Senator Rock.

7. SENATOR ROCK:

8. Yes, Mr. President I would like leave of this Body to
9. have the Journal reflect that Senator Hynes is absent due to
10. illness.

11. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

12. Is there leave? The Journal will...shall so reflect.
13. We'll revert to Senate Bills on 2nd. There are some Senators
14. here that weren't when...we acted on this before. So we'll
15. go back to Senate Bills on 2nd. The first one would be SB
16. 225, Senator Fawell. Still not here. Senator Knuepfer, 238.
17. Senator Knuepfer do you wish to move 238? Will somebody call
18. the attention of Senator Knuepfer, please? SB 364, Senator

20. ...Senator Conolly is not here for his series of bills.
21. Senator Bruce, 889. I will go to House Bills on 2nd reading.

5. and Health Officers. This bill would permit the indexes to
6. these records to be viewed and utilized by members of...an
7. approved genealogical societies. I don't know of any objection
8. to this. It only applies to records prior to 1916 and it's...
9. they would be used for historical purposes. I would solicit
10. your support for this bill.

11. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

14. Senator has this been amended so that it does not
15. apply to...it does, ok.

5. Yes, Mr. President, SB 333 amends the Vehicle Code and
6. it is as the synopsis said. It eliminates the condition that
7. display certificate for motor carrier of property be lost
8. or destroyed in order for a registrant to be excused from
9. penalty for non-display. It provides such certificate was
10. issued and valid upon arrest and authorized the service
11. being performed. Now what this...well I think all of you know
12. a motor truck carrier of property...operating on the highways
13. in the State of Illinois, is required by law to carry a current
14. copy of the certificate permit or registration on the vehicle.
15. Now sometimes this is lost inadvertently by when the truck
16. goes in for repair, it may be lost out of the glove compartment.
17. Somebody may use it for...a piece of scrap paper and they
18. neglect to replace it when the vehicle is put back into
19. service. Now the Act further reads that any person guilty
20. of not causing to be displayed a copy of his certificate,
21. permit, or registration may, in any hearing concerning such
22. violation, be excused from payment of the penalty. While
23. this is fine, but in most cases they don't excuse them. Even
24. after they go in and show that they have a valid certificate
25. or registration or permit, they are still fined. Now what
26. the amendment does, is it changes "may" to "shall" and it
27. adds the language before his arrest was valid at the time
28. of his arrest and authorized the transportation service actually
29. being performed. It's...a product of the Motor Vehicle Laws
30. Commission and it is supported by the Secretary of State's
31. Office. Now I know there was a gentleman, Mr. O'Brien from
32. the Commerce Commission, who testified in opposition to this
33. bill and I later spoke to him and he said they had withdrawn

1. their objection because the State Police is actually performing
2. this function...in conjunction with the Commerce Commission
3. Investigators. I would appreciate a favorable roll call.

18. Yes Mr. President, members of the Senate, this is the
19. bill that will continue the Data Information Systems Commission.
20. This is a Commission which I'm sure most members are familiar.
21. The report will be issued, I hope, in about a week. It's at
22. the printer right now. This is a Commission that contains
23. four Senate members and about 12 public members, all of whom
24. are experts in the computer field. It was an attempt on
25. the part of the Legislature, originally sponsored by Senator
26. Lanigan, to coordinate the activities in the computer field
27. that the State is involved in. It attempts to centralize
28. both the hardware and the software and the systems and I
29. think it's...this Commission in particular has done a terrific
30. job in this area. The Management Information Division, for
31. instance, and the Department of Finance was a direct result

26. near that. There's always a 3 or 4 thousand dollar lapse.

32. you...is there leave? Explain your amendment Senator.

33. SENATOR CHEW:

The amendment provides for the salary of a Legislative

1. Audit General, a position which as yet has not been implemented.

2. I move its adoption. I move its adoption.

3. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

4. Senator Chew moves the adoption of Amendment No. 2. All
5. those in favor signify by saying aye. Opposed? The amendment
6. is adopted. That added \$35,000 to the...salary of the Auditor

8. SENATOR CHEW:

9. \$30,00...\$30,000 isn't. \$35,000...ok fine.

13. That's the appropriation of \$12, 750, 000 to the
14. Metropolitan Fair and Exposition Authority for payment of

29. telephone numbers, numbering codes, credit card numbers,
30. and plans or diagrams for construction of devices with
31. knowledge or reason to believe they may be used in unlawful
32. telephone toll charges. An estimated loss of revenue to the
33. industry nation-wide is about 25 million dollars a year.

1. Recently there has been a wide spread publishing of plans,
2. diagrams, diagram encourage...encouraging construction
3. clandestine devices which are attached to the telephone to
4. enable the user to place free calls anywhere in the world.
5. This is a effort to stop this practice. There is a...
6. conviction of this would be imprisonment for not more than
7. one year or a fine not exceeding \$1000 or both at the
8. discretion of the court. I know of no opposition to this
9. bill. It will stop a practice that is...has been prevalent
10. throughout the nation and would...like to make it a law
11. that's...fraudulent work in the State of Illinois. I'd

Senator Buzbee.

1. SENATOR BUZBEE:

2. Thank you Mr. President. ...Mr. President I would
3. ask that Senator McBroom be on the Floor. I know he...
4. here he is, fine. SB 1139 is an emergency appropriation
5. bill of \$300,000 which is for emergency expenses that
6. some particular school districts have due to the flooding
7. we've had the last several days. Such things as renting

24. I...I concur with what Senator Buzbee is trying to do
25. here. I think the procedure is perhaps a little unusual
26. but the Senator told me that the students are having to
27. be transported to Missouri and rent school buildings there
28. and so on. Senator Buzbee, the appropriation staff checked
29. with the...with Superintendent Bakalis and I wanted to check
30. on one thing here with you if I can refer to my notes. Just
31. a minute. The Superintendent's Office has assured us that
32. they will develop guidelines for this procedure and forward
33. them to us as soon as they're completed, and the Superintendent's

1. staff is also...will also supply our committee with a

30. and with no income and no prospect of a crop. What do you

2. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

3. Senator Buzbee.

4. SENATOR BUZBEE:

5. Senator Latherow I certainly will support the
6. concept and I'll be glad to talk to you about the bill.

7. I have the same problem you have in my district with
8. farmers. ...Mr. President I would ask for a favorable
9. roll call. This bill would take effect immediately
10. and so I assume the 36 vote is correct. Is that not
11. right? No.

12. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATORMOHR):

13. No. 30 votes is...

14. SENATOR BUZBEE:

15. I would ask for a favorable roll call for a very
16. worth...

17. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

18. The question is shall SB 1139 pass? And on that
19. question the Secretary will call the roll.

20. SECRETARY:

21. Bartulis, Bell, Berning,

22. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

23. Senator Berning.

24. SENATOR BERNING:

25. I'm sorry, I would just like to direct one question
26. to the sponsor if I might, even though this is roll call.

27. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

28. Well we are on roll call. One question...Senator Buzbee.

29. SENATOR BERNING:

30. What will be...will this bill be necessary if the Federal
31. Emergency Flood Relief Program is implimented?

32. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

33. Senator Buzbee.

1. SENATOR BUZBEE:

2. ...Yes sir it is, Senator Berning, I believe, because
3. the Federal Funds will be only through the SBA and the FHA.
4. Which will be to take care of home repairs or...or...small
5. business damage and that sort of thing. To my understanding
6. there is no relief available for school districts in the
7. Federal funds.

8. SECRETARY:

22. Chicago Board of Education. It happens every once in
23. while that we have to help each other. Now there are
24. people in my district who can't even spell Kaskaskia.
25. I vote aye.

33. declared passed. Senator Buzbee, SB 1140.

1. SECRETARY:

2. SB 1140 (Secretary reads title of bill)

3. 3rd reading of the bill.

4. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

5. Senator Buzbee.

6. SENATOR BUZBEE:

7. Thank you Mr. President. This is part of the package
8. ...Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate, what this bill does
9. under the present school code 176 days of minimum pupil
10. attendance are required for a school district to be able
11. to receive their maximum state aid. For every day less
12. than 176 days that they are in attendance they are
13. penalized 1% per day. There are several school districts
14. that are now flooded out where there is no possible way
15. for them to get their 176 days in. I have one particular
16. school district in my...in my district where they were
17. out for a total of a month. We have several more that
18. need to be out. They're busing pupils in by boat and every-
19. thing else. So what this bill does is allows O.S.P.I.,
20. when there is an act of God such as a flooding situation,
21. to determine that he will not hold them to that 176 days
22. minimum to be able to get their maximum state aid. So
23. I would ask for a favorable roll call. There are at least
24. 10 to 15 to 20 school districts in the State that we know
25. of that are effected by this pending legislation. I would
26. ask for a favorable roll call. Thank you.

27. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

28. Any further discussion? The question is, shall SB 1140
29. pass? And on that question the Secretary will call the roll.

13. SB 365. Would you repeat that Senator, they couldn't hear
14. you?

15. SENATOR KNUPPEL:

16. Is there anybody that didn't hear me. Alright. I know
17. I wasn't but I thought everybody heard me anyway. That's
18. what the Sun-Times says. ...This act creates an Equine
19. Infectious Anemia Eradication program. It's sponsored
20. by the Department of Agriculture of the State of Illinois.
21. I'll appreciate a favorable roll call.

22. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

23. Any further discussion? Secretary read the bill.

24. SECRETARY:

25. SB 365 (Secretary reads title of bill)

26. 3rd reading of the bill.

27. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

28. Any further discussion. On that...the question is
29. shall SB 365 pass? And on that question the Secretary
30. will call the roll.

17. Senator there are a couple of announcements, apparently.
18. Do you want to withhold that for a moment or...?

19. SENATOR GRAHAM:

20. I will.

21. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

22. Senator Buzbee.

23. SENATOR BUZBEE:

24. Thank you Mr. President. Mr. President I would
25. ask leave of this Body to be shown as voting in the
26. affirmative on the following Senate Bills: 30...304,
27. 305, 308...

28. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

29. Senator, the Secretary...informs that is against the rules.
30. The votes have already been recorded. So...they're made up and
31. in the Journal already. So then...That is the one rule,
32. Senator Buzbee, that cannot be suspended, I'm informed. I'm
33. sorry. Senator Glass.

1. SENATOR GLASS:

2. ...Mr. President, I would move for unanimous consent
3. of the Body to waive the rule requiring notice for posting
4. of...bills and...bill...SB 196 may be posted and heard this
5. Friday in the Insurance and Financial and Institutions
6. Committee.

7. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

8. Senator Glass is requesting we suspend the rules for
9. the six day notice on SB 196. All those in favor signify
10. by saying aye. Opposed? The motion carries. SB 196
11. will be heard at the next committee hearing. Senator
12. Newhouse.

13. SENATOR NEWHOUSE:

14. Mr. President there are three bills in Judiciary
15. that I'd like to move to Table. So I now make the motion
16. to discharge the Judiciary Committee on SB 11, 16 and 91
17. for the purpose of Tabling those bills.

29. Now Mr. President I move...I'm sorry.

30. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

31. The motion carries. On the motion to Table, all those
32. in favor signify by saying aye. Opposed? So ordered. Next
33. bill Senator.

1. SENATOR NEWHOUSE:

2. I'd like to make the same motion with reference to
3. SB 16, Mr. President. Discharge committee for the purpose
4. of Tabling.

5. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

6. Senator Newhouse moves to discharge the Committee on
7. Judiciary on SB 16. All those in favor signify by saying
8. aye. Opposed? The motion carries. The motion to Table,
9. all those in favor signify by saying aye. Opposed? The
10. motion carries. Next bill Senator.

11. SENATOR NEWHOUSE:

12. My motion is to discharge Judiciary on SB 91 for the
13. purpose of Tabling.

14. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

15. Senator Newhouse moves to...discharge the Committee
16. on Judiciary on SB 91. All those in favor signify by
17. saying aye. Opposed? The motion carries. On the motion
18. to carry all those...motion to Table, I'm sorry, on 91
19. all those in favor signify by saying aye. Opposed? So
20. ordered.

21. SENATOR NEWHOUSE:

22. Thank you Mr. President.

23. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

24. Senator Knuepfer.

25. SENATOR KNUEPFER:

26. While the German Dinner is going on the Senate Public
27. Health, Welfare and Corrections Committee will be indulging
28. in Southern Fried Chicken. If you are members of that
29. Committee the meeting will be immediately after adjournment.
30. Any bills which are not heard today will be heard tomorrow
31. morning but there are too many to hear tomorrow morning. So
32. Committee meeting immediately following this adjournment.

33. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

Senator Graham.

1. SENATOR GRAHAM:

2. There was no call for a Republican Caucus in the
3. morning. Is that correct?

4. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

5. That is correct sir.

6. SENATOR GRAHAM:

7. Then I do move you now the Senate do stand adjourned
8. until 10:30 tomorrow morning.

9. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

10. Senator Graham moves that the Senate stand adjourned
11. until 10:30 tomorrow. All those in favor? Opposed?
12. We stand adjourned. I wish to commend you gentlemen. We
13. passed some 25 bills today. So it was a good afternoon.

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
