19. SR 457 by Senator Mitchler and 458 by Senator Mitchler and
20. 459 by Senator Schaffer. They're all congratulatory.

21. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

22. Senator Schaffer, Senator Mitchler moves to suspend the rules
23. for consideration of Resolutions...SR 457, 458, 459. Is there
24. leave? Now Senator mo...Mitchler moves the adoption of Senate
25. Resolutions 457, 458, 459. All those in favor signify by saying
26. aye. Opposed. Resolutions are adopted. Introduction of bills.

27. SECRETARY:

28. SB 1609 by the Senate Committee on Health, Welfare and
29. Corrections. Senator Knuepfer design...designated as
30. the Senate sponsor.

31. (Secretary reads title of bill)...

32. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

33. Senator Knuepfer...

1. SECRETARY:

2. ... (Secretary reads title of bill)

3. 1st reading of the bill.

4. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

5. Senator Knuepfer.

6. SENATOR KNUEPFER:

7. I...I have two motions on that bill. One is...the first
8. motion is, leave to bypass the Assignment of Bills Committee and
9. it be referred immediately to the Senate Public Health, Welfare
10. and Corrections Committee. The second motion is to bypass the 6th
11. day rule on posting of notice so that it be...will be heard
12. tomorrow morning. Let me just provide background on this, Senator
13. Rock is aware of this bill, this is a bill that was introduced
14. last session, that we finally got agreement on. I think among
15. most people, due to the new Senate Rules, we had then to rewrite
16. the bill and reintroduce it as a Senate Bill. That is the posture
17. that it is in now. We had promised everyone that there would be
18. a hearing this coming Wednesday, tomorrow morning, due to the
19. time pressure on this. So, I would ask for action on those two
20. motions having explained the need for them. I have talked to
21. Senator Graham incidently, about the motion to bypass the Committee
22. on Assignment of Bills and it's all right with him.

23. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

24. Senator Knuepfer moves the suspension of the rules and bypass
25. Committee on Assignment of Bills and refer this bill to the Public
26. Health, Welfare and Corrections Committee. All those in favor
27. signify by saying aye. Opposed. So ordered. The bill will be
28. referred to Public Health. Now Senator Knuepfer moves to suspend
29. the 6th day notice for a hearing. All those in favor signify by
30. saying aye. Opposed. Motion carries. Senator Weaver.

27. Pur...Pursuant to Senator Weaver's motion Senate Bills 1610
28. through 1623 are referred to the Committee on Rules. Senator
29. McBroom.

30. SENATOR MCBROOM:

31. Yes, Mr. President and members of the Senate, you were
32. there of course this morning Mr. President, but obviously many
33. members weren't. The Senate Appropriations Committee adopted

1. a resolution to investigate all aspects of the Illinois Information
2. Service, Mr. President, to see among other things that the other...
3. if the other...see if the other duly elected constitutional officers
4. had any access to the Illinois Information Service. And the adopted...
5. a resolution that it would be a seven man committee, 4 of the
6. majority and 3 of the minority. Senators, I'd like to give you if
7. the time is appropriate Mr. President, I'd like to give you the
8. names of the members of that committee who have agreed to serve and
9. I discussed it with Senator Hynes. The Chairman of it will be
10. Senator Regner, the other Republican members are Senator Schaffer,
11. Senator Hall, Senator Clarke, Senator Hynes has given me the
12. Democratic members: Senator Hynes, Senator Donnewald, Senator
13. Dougherty. Thank you Mr. President.

14. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

15. Thank you Senator. ...from the House.

25. Mr. President, I move adoption of the amendment.

28. SJR 69. All those in favor signify by saying aye. Opposed.
29. Amendment is adopted.

30. SECRETARY:

15. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

16. Secretary's desk. We'll go to the Calendar on 2nd reading.
17. Senator Vadalabene.

18. SENATOR VADALABENE:

19. Thank you Mr. President, before you go to the Calendar on
20. 2nd reading, I would like to stand on a point of personal privilege,
21. Sir.

22. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

23. State your point.

24. SENATOR VADALABENE:

25. Today, one of the great...one of the closest friends I have
26. in the State Senate, we didn't offer any resolution but I would
27. like for my colleagues here on the Floor of the Senate to give a
28. good sound round of applause and a happy birthday to Senator
29. Robert McCarthy. His 50th birthday.

30. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

31. That's Senator Half Century McCarthy, now is that correct?
32. Senator McCarthy.

1. SENATOR McCARTHY:

2. Well, thank you very much Mr. President, to you my colleagues
3. in the General Assembly, I say thank you. The only reason I
4. rise because you have birthdays every year, but this happens
5. to be the 20th birthday that I've observed as a member of the
6. General Assembly. The 50th birthday that I observed in this
7. world and it's been happy to serve...it's my pleasure to serve
8. forty percent of that time as a member of the General Assembly.
9. I...I think I'd be remiss if I didn't mention that when we did...
10. when I did come in here to represent the people, Senator Harris
11. and Senator Romano came at the same time. Senator Dougherty came
12. to the Senate the same day and Senator Smith had moved to the
13. Senate and if I've missed anybody that was here back in 1955 when
14. we came in I apologize but to you people that we all came together
15. and Senator Smith that has seniority and to all of you fine people
16. that have come along to represent the people over the 20 years,
17. I...I share with you the pleasure of...of the day and it's my
18. pleasure to have my son here today, my wife and daughter can't
19. be here because the daughter is being graduated from grade school
20. and my wife is looking after her. Thank you very much.

21. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

22. Senator, you know if you've been here for 20 years that
23. generally the party that is having the birthday, especially the
24. 50th, buys the birthday cake. We'll be here for awhile so if you
25. want to have one from the baked... Resolutions.

27. SR 460 by Senators Donnewald, Harris, Partee and all Senators.
28. Congratulatory.

29. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

30. Senator Donnewald.

31. SENATOR DONNEWALD:

32. That is congratulatory and I would appreciate that the rules
33. be suspended for its immediate consideration.

1. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

2. Senator Donnewald moves to suspend the rules for immediate
3. consideration. All those in favor of suspension of the rules
4. signify by saying aye. Opposed. The rules have been suspended,
5. now Senator Donnewald moves for the adoption of the resolution.
6. All those in favor signify by saying aye. Opposed. The resolution
7. is adopted.

13. Mr. President and members of the Senate, this is a Congratulatory
14. Resolution for James Grigsby who is retiring at Western Illinois
15. University and I move for suspension of the rules and immediate
16. adoption.

28. SENATOR LATHEROW:

29. Mr. President and members of the Senate, this resolution has
30. to do with the shortage of nitrogen for agriculture purposes
31. and it's directed to the Commerce Commission to ask them to
32. consider the release of more of the natural gases for use of these
33. industries to develop more nitrogen. That there's no objection, I

1. would appreciate the favorable consideration. I would so move
2. for...

3. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

4. Any objection? Senator Latherow moves for the suspension
5. of rules for immediate consideration of the resolution. All those
6. in favor signify by saying aye. Opposed. The rules have been
7. suspended, now Senator Latherow moves for the adoption of the

12. It's congratulatory.

14. Senator McCarthy.

15. SENATOR MCCARTHY:

16. Yes, Mr. President, this is congratulatory. I'd like to move
17. for suspension of the rules for immediate consideration. May I
18. have leave?

19. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

20. Senator McCarthy moves for suspension of the rules. All those
21. in favor sus...suspending the rules, signify by saying aye. Opposed.
22. The rules have been suspended. Now Senator McCarthy moves the
23. adoption of the resolution. All those in favor will signify by
24. saying aye. Opposed. The resolution has been adopted. Senator
25. McCarthy.

26. SENATOR MCCARTHY:

27. ...Mr. President, this resolution congratulates the Illiopolis...
28. the Illiopolis High School Girls Athletic Team. Illiopolis is a
29. little town of about a 1000, it's located in Sangamon County, but in
30. the 51st district and they won the State Girls Track and Field meet
31. at Charleston on May 18th. We're...we're...we're for congratulating
32. them and they'll be honored when they get this Senate Resolution.
33. Yeah, they're all...I put them all on unless someone has an objection.

2. All members will be shown. Senate Bills on 2nd reading.

6. Yes, I move the adoption amendment number 1.

29. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):
30. Any amendments from the Floor? 3rd reading. Senator Berning,
31. you want to mov...move SB 1475? SB 1475.
32. SECRETARY:
33. SB 1475

1. (Secretary reads title of bill)

2. 2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Pensions and Personnel,
3. offers Amendments numbered 1 and 2.

4. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

5. Senator Berning.

6. SENATOR BERNING:

7. Mr. President, I move the adoption of Amendment number 1.

8. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

9. Senator Berning moves the adoption of Amendment number 1.

10. All those in favor signify by saying aye. Opposed. Amendment
11. number 1 is adopted. Senator Berning..

12. SENATOR BERNING:

13. Now Mr. President, I move Amendment number 2 be Tabled.

14. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR (SENATOR MOHR):

15. Senator Buzbee.

16. SENATOR BUZBEE:

17. Mr. President, I rise in opposition to the Tabling motion just
18. made to...by Senator Berning. And I would like to explain why I
19. opposed his motion. This amendment was put on in the Pensions and
20. Personnel Committee for one very good reason. I would like to read
21. the amendment. The amendments reads to quote...quote,

22. To conduct negotiations affecting pay, hours of
23. work or other working conditions of employees subject
24. to this Act. End quote. That simply saying that the
25. Director of Personnel shall have the right to negotiate
26. with employees affecting pay, hours of work and other
27. working conditions.

28. Mr. President, that language is lifted out of the present Act. I
29. might say by the way as you would very well guess, this amendment
30. passed the committee with bipartisan support. Had to have bipartisan
31. support to enable for us to...in order for us to get it out. Let me
32. say this, Amendment number 2, puts the powers to negotiate rates
33. back within the departments of manpower. This is exactly the same

1. language that presently is in the Personnel Code, under the
2. powers and duties of the Director of Personnel. Under the rule
3. of strict construction when the Legislature lists a series of
4. powers or duties and then by amendment removes one, the Court
5. assumes that the Legislative intent is explicit. Now for all of
6. you members of the Senate who went to the same law school that
7. I did, you very well know that the rule of strict construction
8. simply means that if a particular wording has been in an Act
9. previously and then the Legislature rewrites the Law and leaves
10. out that wording, the Courts have rules that the Legislature
11. explicitly meant for that ruling to be excluded. In other words,
12. if we leave this out of the present Act...the upcoming Act and the
13. fact that it's in the present Act, then the Courts are going to
14. rule that the Department of Personnel will no longer have that
15. power.

16. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

17. Senator Buzbee, I have to interrupt, I'm sorry, this motion is
18. not debatable and I thought maybe you would conclude before this
19. time...for what purpose does Senator Rock arise?

20. SENATOR ROCK:

21. Just to point of inquiry, I have not yet heard an explanation
22. from the Committee Chairman why he wishes to Table a Committee
23. Amendment.

24. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

25. He did move to Table, if the Senator wants to explain the
26. reason for Tabling, he will have that opportunity now. Senator
27. Berning.

28. SENATOR BERNING:

29. Thank you Mr. President and members of the Body. This amendment
30. was offered I'm sure in good faith, was accepted in that same good
31. faith by a majority of the members of the committee that is true.
32. In accepting the amendment, there was an implicit implication that
33. there would be support from those offering the amendment for the

4. then amended bill. That did not occur and I now have been advised
5. that there will be no support by anybody on that side of the aisle
6. with or without the amendment and therefore it seems to me
7. that the question rather becomes moot. I objected to the amendment
8. originally, I still see no advantage to it and if as I have been
9. informed, there will be no support from anybody for this dramatic
10. improvement in our Personnel Code and Civil Service Commission.
11. Then to accept your amendment gentlemen is an insult and therefore,
12. I move to Table it. Now, I ask you as gentlemen, will you support
13. the bill with the amendment?

14. SENATOR BERNING:

15. Senator Buzbee, will you support the bill with Amendment
16. No. 2?

17. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

18. Senator Buzbee.
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1. SENATOR BUZBEE:
2. Mr. President, I would like to say that I have objected to
3. this bill all the way through the proceedings. I continue to
4. object to it. However, if this amendment were in there it would
5. make the bill a little less obnoxious to me. I think that...
6. on a point of personal privilege, Mr. President, if I might.
7. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):
8. Well do you...Senator Berning did have the Floor, Senator.
9. He asked a question and I think you answered it. Now, Senator
10. Berning do you want to conclude?
11. SENATOR BERNING:
12. If I understand the sequacious route by which the response
13. came, the answer really is no. Is that correct?
14. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):
15. Senator Buzbee.
16. SENATOR BUZBEE:
17. Yes, that is correct.
18. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):
19. Senator Berning.
20. SENATOR BERNING:
21. Then, Mr. President, I persist in my motion to Table Amend-
22. ment No. 2.
23. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):
24. Senator Berning moves to Table Amendment No. 2. All those
25. in favor of Tabling Amendment No. 2 will signify by saying Aye.

10. priation is up about \$300,000 because we are beefing up this
11. agency in terms of in-house capacity to do some of the audits -
12. more than they are doing at the present time.

8. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

9. 1283. You'll be here tomorrow, won't you Senator? Senator

10. Wooten.

11. SENATOR WOOTEN:

12. Yes, Sir. These...this is appropriation of the ordinary

13. and contingent expenses of the Institute for Environmental Quality.

14. There's a slight reduction overall this year. It has had an

15. increase in the Retirement Fund and at the request of both staffs

16. there was some clarification of expenditures of the Environmental

17. Health Resource Center at the University of Illinois. I believe

18. it's all in order to everyone's satisfaction now, and I would

19. move its adoption. ...favor it passes, rather.

20. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

21. Any further discussion? The question is shall SB 1283 pass.
