1. PRESIDENT:
2. The Third Special Session of the 78th General
3. Assembly will come to order. Reading of the Journal.
4. Senator Soper.
5. SENATOR SOPER:
6. ...Mr. President, members of the Senate, I move
7. that we postpone the reading and the approval of
8. Journals of October 22nd, 23rd pending the arrival of
9. the printed Journal.
10. PRESIDENT:
11. Senator Soper moves that the Journals for the
12. Third Special Session of October 22nd and 23rd that
13. consideration thereon and reading thereof be post-
14. poned until the arrival of the printed Journal.
15. All in favor signify by saying aye. Contrary no.
16. The motion carries. So ordered. Introduction of
17. bills.
18. SECRETARY:
19. SB 17 by Senators Rock, Partee, Swinarski, Rock,
20. Partee and Saperstein.
21. (Secretary reads title of bill)
22. 1st reading of the bill.
23. SB 18 by Senators Swinarski, Rock, Partee and
24. Saperstein.
25. (Secretary reads title of bill)
26. PRESIDENT:
27. We are in the Third Special Session...Senator Partee,
28. did you have some motions with regard to Senate Bills 4,
29. 5 and 6?
30. SENATOR PARTEE:
31. Correct. Yes, Mr. President, are we going to take
32. them together?
33. PRESIDENT:

1. I believe we can. Yes.

2. SENATOR PARTEE:

3. All right...

4. PRESIDENT:

5. Those bills are in the Committee on Assignment

6. of Bills.

7. SENATOR PARTEE:

8. SB...Senate Bills 4, 5 and 6 I'm moving to move

9. to second reading without reference to committee.

10. PRESIDENT:

11. The motion...

12. SENATOR PARTEE:

13. Discharge the committee and move to second reading

14. without reference.

15. PRESIDENT:

16. Yes. Senate Bill...

17. SENATOR PARTEE:

18. Committee on Assignment of Bills.

19. PRESIDENT:

20. Yes. Senator Partee moves to discharge the Committee

21. on Assignment of Bills from further consideration of Senate

22. Bills 4, 5 and 6 and to have them advanced to second reading.

23. Is there discussion? All in favor signify by saying aye.

24. Contrary no. The motion carries, so ordered. Senator

25. McBroom.

26. SENATOR MCBROOM:

27. ...Mr. President, members of the Senate, I...I rise

28. on a point of personal privilege. There are a group of

29. friends of mine and constituents of mine in the President's

30. gallery. They are not going to be with us too long and

31. they're going to take a tour of Springfield today, for

32. many of them it's their first visit to Springfield.

33. They're led by Reverend Walter Marshall, President of

the Pembroke Senior Citizens Organization and Mrs.

1. Dora Smith who is the former President of the  
2. Pembroke Senior Citizens Organization. I wonder  
3. if these ladies and gentlemen would arise and be  
4. recognized by the Senate.

5. PRESIDENT:

6. Senator Scholl.

7. SENATOR SCHOLL:

8. Mr. President, I'd like to move to discharge  
9. the Committee on Assignment of Bills and refer the  
10. Committee on Revenue to SB 12, 13, 14 and 15.

11. PRESIDENT:

12. Senator Scholl moved that the Committee on  
13. Assignment of Bills be discharged from further  
14. consideration of Senate Bills 12, 13, 14 and 15  
15. and that those bills be referred to the Committee  
16. on Revenue. Is there discussion? All in favor  
17. of the motion signify by saying aye. Contrary no.  
18. The motion carries. So ordered. Senator Partee.

19. SENATOR PARTEE:

20. As to SB 1, I would move to discharge the Committee  
21. on Assignment of Bills and re-refer that bill to the  
22. Committee on Transportation.

23. PRESIDENT:

24. Senator Partee has moved to discharge SB 1 from  
25. the Committee on Assignment of Bills and refer to the  
26. Committee on Transportation. Is there discussion?  
27. All in favor signify by saying aye. Contrary no. The  
28. motion carries. So ordered. Senator Partee.

29. SENATOR PARTEE:

30. I make the same motion on SB 2 and SB 3. I think  
31. we could take them together.

32. PRESIDENT:

33. Yes. All right. Senator Partee moves to discharge

1. the Committee on Assignment from further consideration and  
2. to re-refer the Senate Bills 2 and 3 to the Committee  
3. on Transportation. Is there discussion? All in  
4. favor signify by saying aye. Contrary no. The motion  
5. carries. So ordered. Senator Partee.

6. SENATOR PARTEE:

7. Now, Mr. President, I move you that Senate Bills  
8. 9, 10 and 11 be discharged from the Committee on  
9. Assignment of Bills and re-referred to the Committee  
10. on Transportation.

11. PRESIDENT:

12. Senator Partee has made the same motion on Senate  
13. Bills 9, 10 and 11. Is there discussion? All in favor  
14. signify by saying aye. Contrary no. The motion carries.  
15. Senate Bills 9, 10 and 11 are discharged from the Com-  
16. mittee on Assignment and referred to Transportation.

17. SENATOR PARTEE:

18. Now, Mr. Chairman...Mr. President.

19. PRESIDENT:

20. ...Senator Partee...could you hold just a moment?

21. SENATOR PARTEE:

22. Yes.

23. PRESIDENT:

24. ...Senator Graham sought recognition before you  
25. started. Senator Graham.

26. SENATOR GRAHAM:

27. All I'm trying to do, Mr. President, is to get my  
28. bookkeeping straight for Assignment of Bills. Number  
29. 1 in the Third Special Session?

30. PRESIDENT:

31. Yes. Senate bill...

32. SENATOR GRAHAM:

33. To Transportation?

1. PRESIDENT:

2. Senate Bills 1 through 11 have been discharged.

3. SENATOR GRAHAM:

4. 1, 2, 3, 9, 10, 11.

5. PRESIDENT:

6. 1 through 11. Now I'll recite to you now the  
7. disposition. 1, 2, 3, 9, 10 and 11 are in Trans-  
8. portation. 4, 5 and 6 are on second reading. We  
9. have taken no action on 7 and 8. ...Partee.

10. SENATOR PARTEE:

11. Now, Mr. President, Senate Bills 17 and 18 were  
12. introduced this morning to deal with the subject of  
13. lottery and were...are now in the Committee on Assign-  
14. ment of Bills. Now I move that these two bills 17 and  
15. 18 be discharged from the Committee on Assignment of  
16. Bills and be referred to the Committee on Revenue.

17. PRESIDENT:

18. Senator Partee moves that Senate Bills 17 and  
19. 18 be discharged from the Committee on Assignment  
20. of Bills and re-referred to the Committee on  
21. Revenue. Is there discussion? All in favor signify  
22. by saying aye. Contrary no. The motion carries.  
23. So ordered.

24. SENATOR PARTEE:

25. Now, Mr. President, it is obvious that we have a  
26. rule which requires a six day posting of notice and we  
27. have referred to Committee today Senate Bills 1, 2, 3,  
28. 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 6...

29. PRESIDENT:

30. No, not 15. We haven't disposed of that yet.

31. SENATOR PARTEE:

32. No, 12, 13, 14 and 15.

33. PRESIDENT:

1. I'm sorry six...you're correct...

2. SENATOR PARTEE:

3. And 17 and 18.

4. PRESIDENT:

5. Correct.

6. SENATOR PARTEE:

7. I move that the six day posting notice for  
8. hearing be waived as to those bills in those  
9. Committees to which they have been...assigned.

10. PRESIDENT:

11. Senator Partee now moves that the rules be  
12. suspended with respect to six day notice concerning  
13. Senate Bills 1, 2, 3, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15,  
14. 17 and 18. Is there discussion? All in favor of  
15. the suspension of the rules with respect to the  
16. six day notice signify by saying aye. Contrary no.  
17. The motion carries. So ordered. Now with respect  
18. to SB 15, Senator Don Moore. I'm sorry, 16, SB 16.  
19. Senator Don Moore.

20. SENATOR MOORE:

21. ...Thank you, Mr. President, members of the Senate.  
22. SB 16 deals with implementing legislation which is  
23. needed when the Federal Government takes over the  
24. Aged, Blind and Disabled Program on January 1, 1974.  
25. So at this time, Mr. President, I would move to dis-  
26. charge the Committee on Assignment of Bills and ask  
27. that this bill be advanced to the order of second  
28. reading without reference to Committee.

29. PRESIDENT:

30. Senator Moore moves that SB 16 be discharged from  
31. the Committee on Assignment of Bills, re-referred...I'm  
32. sorry and advanced to the order of second reading with-  
33. out further referral. Is there leave? Senate has given  
its unanimous consent. So ordered. Senator Partee.

1. SENATOR PARTEE:

2. Mr. President, we have dealt with all bills in  
3. the Third Special Session 1 through 18 with the ex-  
4. ception of SB 7 and 8. And in light of some con-  
5. versations I've had this morning on SB 7 and 8, I'm  
6. asking the call of a 15 minute Democratic caucus  
7. for right now and we could be back in 15 minutes.

8. PRESIDENT:

9. All right...would you put the motion that the  
10. Senate in the Third Special Session recess subject  
11. to the call of the Chair. Is that agreeable to you  
12. ...that motion?

13. SENATOR PARTEE:

14. Yes. That's quite all right.

15. PRESIDENT:

16. Okay. All right. Then the Senate will stand in  
17. recess subject to the call of the Chair, which will be  
18. when the Democrats return from their caucus. All in  
19. favor signify by saying aye. Contrary no. The  
20. motion carries. We stand in recess subject to the call  
21. of the Chair.

24. PRESIDENT:

25. The Third Special Session has recessed subject to  
26. the reconvention at the call of the Chair therefore the  
27. Third Special Session will now come to order. Is there  
28. any business to come before the Senate in the Third  
29. Special Session? Senator Graham.

30. SENATOR GRAHAM:

31. No indication of business for the Third Special  
32. Session, I move you, Mr. President, that this Session stand  
33. adjourned until 10 a.m. tomorrow, Thursday.

1. PRESIDENT:

2. Senator Graham moves that the Third Special  
3. Session adjourn until 10 a.m. Thursday, October  
4. 25th. On that motion, all in favor signify by  
5. saying aye. Contrary no. The motion carries.  
6. So ordered.

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
