7. Reading of the Journal.

8. SECRETARY:

10. PRESIDENT:

11. Senator Soper:

12. SENATOR SOPER:

13. Mr. President, I move that we dispense with the further
14. reading of the Journal of November 14th. Unless there's some
15. corrections or additions to be made that the Journal stand
16. approved.

17. PRESIDENT:

18. Senator Soper moves that the Journal of November 14th
19. be approved without further reading. Are there additions or
20. corrections? All in favor, signify by saying aye. Contrary,
21. no. The motion carries.

22. SECRETARY:

24. PRESIDENT:

25. Senator Soper.

26. SENATOR SOPER:

27. I move that we dispense with the further reading of the
28. Journal of November 15th. Unless there's some corrections or
29. additions to be made that the Journal stand approved.

30. PRESIDENT:

31. Senator Soper moves that the Journal of November 15th
32. stand approved without further reading. Is there discussion?
33. All in favor, signify by saying aye. Contrary no. The motion

1. carries. So ordered.

4. PRESIDENT:

5. Senator Soper.

6. SENATOR SOPER:

7. I move that we dispense with the further reading of the
8. Journal of November 16th. Unless there are corrections or
9. additions made that Journal stand approved.

10. PRESIDENT:

11. Senator Soper moves that the Journal of November 16 be
12. approved without further reading. Is there discussion? All
13. in favor, signify by saying aye. Contrary, no. The motion
14. carries. So ordered.

17. PRESIDENT:

18. Senator Soper.

19. SENATOR SOPER:

20. I move that we dispense with the further reading of the
21. Journal of November 18th. Unless there's some corrections or
22. additions to be made, the Journal stand approved.

23. PRESIDENT:

24. Senator Soper has moved that the Journal of November 18th
25. stand approved without further reading. Is there discussion?
26. All in favor, signify by saying aye. Contrary, no. The motion
27. carries. So ordered. Senator Soper.

28. SENATOR SOPER:

29. Mr. President, I now move that we postpone the reading of

33. Senator Soper moves ...

8. Yes. Senator Soper moves that further consideration of
9. the Journals of Tuesday, November 27 and Wednesday, November
10. 28, be postponed until the arrival of the printed Journal.
11. Is there discussion? All in favor, signify by saying aye.
12. Contrary, no. The motion carries. Resolutions.
13. SECRETARY:
14. Senate Resolution No. 304 by Senators Rock, Partee and
15. Donnewald. It's congratulatory.
16. PRESIDENT:
17. Senator Rock.
18. SENATOR ROCK:
19. Yes, Mr. President, this is a congratulatory resolution
20. that Representative DiPrima ask me to put in the Senate. It
21. congratulates five young men who are from his Ward that are
22. attaining the rank of Eagle Scout. I would ask that the
23. resolution be...the Rules be suspended. The resolution be
24. immediately considered and adopted, and I would further suggest
25. that all Senators be shown.
26. PRESIDENT:
27. Senator Rock has...seeks leave for all Senators to join
28. as co-sponsors. Is there leave? So ordered. Senator Rock
29. moves to suspend for the immediate consideration of the Reso-
30. lution. All in favor, signify by saying aye.. Contrary no.
31. The motion carries. On the motion to adopt. All in favor,
32. signify by saying aye. Contrary, no. The motion carries.
33. The resolution is adopted.

1. SECRETARY:

2. Senate Resolution 305 by Senator Bell.

3. PRESIDENT:

4. Executive. ...Senator Bell.

5. SENATOR BELL:

6. Mr. President, if possible I'd like to get this resolution
7. out today. Did I hear you say you wanted to move it to Execu-
8. tive.

9. PRESIDENT:

10. Well, it's not a congratulatory resolution. If you want
11. to take up the time of the Senate on it, you would have to
12. suspend the Rules for immediate consideration.

13. SENATOR BELL:

14. When might it be taken up if we didn't do that.

15. PRESIDENT:

16. At...well, at ... the next meeting of the Executive
17. Committee you could consult with Senator Ozinga about that.

18. SENATOR BELL:

19. Well, Mr. President, I'd like to move to suspend the Rules
20. for the...taken up of this resolution.

21. PRESIDENT:

22. ...well, yes. The Secretary will read the resolution.

23. SECRETARY:

24. Senate Resolution No. 305. (Secretary reads resolution).

25. PRESIDENT:

26. ...Senator Latherow.

27. SENATOR LATHEROW:

28. Well, Mr. President, I...I don't know whether it's too
29. late to object to the immediate consideration of this or not.
30. I think this is something that should go to the Executive
31. Committee.

32. PRESIDENT:

33. Well, Senator Bell has moved to suspend the Rules for

1. the immediate consideration of the resolution. The matter
2. before us now is Senator Bell's motion to suspend. It is
3. not debatable. All those in favor of suspension of the Rules,
4. signify by saying by saying aye. Contrary, no. The motion
5. fails. Do you wish a roll call, Senator Bell.

6. SENATOR BELL:

7. Yes,...Mr. President. I'd like to have a roll call vote
8. on this.

9. PRESIDENT:

10. Is Senator Bell joined by another Senator for a roll call?
11. He is so joined. Secretary will call the roll on the question
12. to suspend the Rules for the immediate consideration of Senate
13. Resolution 305. For what purpose does Senator Soper arise?

14. SENATOR SOPER:

15. Parliamentary inquiry. Does this take ... 30 positive...

16. PRESIDENT:

17. 30...30 votes.

18. SENATOR SOPER:

19. 30 positive votes?

20. PRESIDENT:

21. Yes. The question is, shall the Rules be suspended for the
22. immediate consideration of Senator Resolution 305. On that
23. question...Do you wish recognition, Senator Berning? Senator
24. Berning.

25. SENATOR BERNING:

26. Well, Mr. President, I think in all fairness to some of
27. us who were distracted at the time the motion was first put
28. and the resolution was announced, we're not aware of what the
29. resolution does. I think it perhaps would be appropriate that
30. we have...

31. PRESIDENT:

32. The...the resolution has been read, Senator Berning, by the
33. Secretary.

1. SENATOR BERNING:

2. Would it be inappropriate to have it reread?

3. PRESIDENT:

4. The Resolution, provides for...the Resolution provides
5. for condemnation, by the Senate, of the Board of Governors
6. for its decision to permit the utilization of alcoholic
7. beverages in the institutions under its control. That's
8. the thrust of the Resolution. The question is not debatable.
9. The question is to suspend the Rules for the immediate con-
10. sideration of Senate Resolution 305 and on that question,
11. the Secretary will call the roll.

26. the committee on Executive. We have a Death Resolution in
27. the Regular Session. Will the Senators please be in their
28. seats? It memorializes a former Senate member. Will the
29. Senators please be in their seats?

30. SECRETARY:

31. Senate Resolution 306, by Senator Kosinski and all
32. Members of the Senate. (Secretary reads Resolution).

33. PRESIDENT:

1. Senator Kosinski.

2. SENATOR KOSINSKI:

3. Mr. President, Members of the Senate, Stanley Mondala
4. was a very dear friend of mine. A man with a very warm
5. heart. He shall always be remembered by his constituents,
6. his wonderful family and I as a former precinct captain
7. who had rung doorbells for this great man. We shall miss
8. him very dearly. Thank you, Mr. President. I now move to
9. suspend the Rules and to move on the motion.

10. PRESIDENT:

11. All in favor of Kosinski's motion to suspend the Rules
12. for the immediate consideration of the adoption of the
13. resolution, signify by saying aye.. Contrary, no. The motion
14. carries. On the motion to adopt the resolution, all in favor
15. signify by rising. The resolution is adopted. Is there
16. further business to come before the Senate in the Regular
17. Session? Senator Weaver.
