2. The Senate will... The Regular Session will be
3. convened. The prayer will be offered by Reverend Dale

9. Did Senator Mitchler want recognition? Reading

11. SENATOR SOPER:

12. Mr. President I move that we postpone the reading
13. and the approval of the Journal...Journals of November
14. 27th and November 29th pending the arrival of the printed
15. Journals.

16. PRESIDENT:

17. Senator Soper moves that we postpone the reading
18. of the Journals of November 27th and 29th pending the
19. arrival of the printed Journals. Is there discussion?
20. All in favor signify by saying aye. Contrary no. The
21. motion carries. Resolution.

22. SECRETARY:

23. Senate Resolution 307 by Senator Ozinga and all
24. members of the Senate and it's congratulatory.

25. PRESIDENT:

26. Senator Ozinga moves that the rules be suspended
27. for the immediate consideration of the Resolution.
28. All in favor signify by saying aye. Contrary no. The
29. motion carries. The rules are suspended for the con-
30. sideration of the Resolution. On the motion to adopt
31. all in favor signify by saying aye. Contrary no. The
32. motion carries and the Resolution is adopted.

1. PRESIDENT:

2. ...For what purpose does Senator Bruce arise?

3. SENATOR BRUCE:

4. ...I was just curious if Senator Mitchler had a resolution
5. this morning. We're up to 310 and I thought maybe we'd like
6. to make a new record.

7. PRESIDENT:

8. ...Perhaps Senator Savickas could answer that question.

9. ...Senator Vadalabene, did you wish to respond for Senator
10. Savickas?

11. SENATOR VADALABENE:

12. Yes. I'm handling...I'm Senator Savickas' downstate
13. legislative aide and Mitchler is a co-sponsor with Daley on
14. this...on this resolution so he gets one-third credit for
15. his resolutions.

16. PRESIDENT:

17. Senator Mitchler.

18. SENATOR MITCHLER:

19. I was going to originate that but inasmuch as the gentleman
20. that we honored by that resolution resides in Senator Savickas'
21. territory at Burbank - why Senator...Savickas is the chief
22. sponsor and I share all these lovely thoughts that we give to
23. our colleagues and constituents with those Senators who repre-
24. sent them.

25. PRESIDENT:

26. Senator Merritt.

27. SENATOR MERRITT:

28. Mr. President, Members of the Senate this should be a
29. rather light work day and I just wondered if maybe if we might
30. not just hold ourselves in limbo until Senator Mitchler gets
31. those other ten Resolutions prepared.

32. PRESIDENT:

33. The rules do not provide for the limbo position. Senator Soper.

1. SENATOR SOPER:

2. I was just wondering Mr. President and Members of
3. the Senate whether the honorable Senator from Oswego
4. is going to tell his folks back home that Daley joined
5. him or he joined Daley?

6. PRESIDENT:

7. Senator Netsch.

8. SENATOR NETSCH:

9. Mr. President we did not have an opportunity to
10. prepare a formal Resolution and I regret that the
11. record will not show this but I think it would be
12. appropriate for all of us to join in wishing Senator
13. Buzbee a happy birthday today.

14. PRESIDENT:

15. By all means. Happy birthday Senator Buzbee.
16. Is there any further... Senator Vadalabene.

17. SENATOR VADALABENE:

18. On a point of personal privilege Mr. President,...

19. PRESIDENT:

20. Proceed.

21. SENATOR VADALABENE:

22. I was wondering if some time you would take in
23. consideration us members who served in the House and
24. in the Senate whose birthdays fall in July. Did you hear
25. me Mr. President?

26. PRESIDENT:

27. I'm sorry, I didn't.

28. SENATOR VADALABENE:

29. Well, I'm glad 'cause I'd like to repeat it.

30. PRESIDENT:

31. Ok.

32. SENATOR VADALABENE:

33. I'm wondering if you would some time would take in

1. consideration to us members who served in the House and
2. are now in the Senate whose birthdays fall in July, give
3. some consideration of some resolution and a birthday cake.

4. PRESIDENT:

5. The Speaker and I will confer on the emergency nature
6. of that question and perhaps we can issue a proclamation
7. for a special call. I know we'd all love to be down here
8. to respond for the natal day of people like Senator
9. Vadalabene. Resolutions.

10. SECRETARY:

11. Senate Resolution number 312...by Senator Partee.

12. PRESIDENT:

13. Senator Partee.

14. SENATOR PARTEE:

15. Which one is that Mr. Fernandes?

16. SECRETARY:

17. Relates to...

18. SENATOR PARTEE:

19. November 30th?

20. SECRETARY:

21. ...the birthday of a memory.

22. SENATOR PARTEE:

23. Yes. This Resolution relates to the birthday of
24. one of our members, Senator Kenneth Buzbee. Today is
25. his 36th birthday, and I would ask for suspension of
26. the rules and immediate adoption of this Resolution.

27. PRESIDENT:

28. All in favor of the motion to suspend the rules
29. signify by saying aye. Contrary no. The motion carries.
30. On the motion to adopt, Senator Partee.

31. SENATOR PARTEE:

32. I move its adoption.

33. PRESIDENT:

1. All in favor...

2. SENATOR PARTEE:

3. No way.

4. PRESIDENT:

5. The question is shall the Resolution be adopted?

6. And on that question, 29 yeas and 28 nays. And the

7. Resolution is adopted. Happy birthday Ken.

8. SECRETARY:

9. Senate Resolution number 313 by Senator Partee
10. and it's congratulatory.

11. PRESIDENT:

12. Senator Partee.

13. SENATOR PARTEE:

14. Is this the one that relates to the Chicago Bulls?

15. SECRETARY:

16. No, no it's...

17. PRESIDENT:

18. And certainly not the Chicago Bears.

19. SENATOR PARTEE:

20. Absolutely not. Mr. President, Mr. President speaking
21. of the Chicago Bears I understand that they're going to play
22. the University of Illinois because someone then has to
23. win. This is a congratulatory Resoltuion to a group in
24. my community who have prepared a national publication
25. called the Black Book, and it's a congratulatory Resolution.

26. PRESIDENT:

27. Senator Partee moves to suspend the rules for the
28. immediate consideration of the Resolution. All in
29. favor signify by saying aye. Contrary no. The motion
30. carries. On the motion to adopt, all in favor signify
31. by saying aye. Contrary no. The Resolution is adopted.

32. SECRETARY:

33. Senate Resolution 314 by Senator Partee and it's

1. congratulatory. This is the Chicago Bulls.

2. PRESIDENT:

3. Senator Partee.

4. SENATOR PARTEE:

5. This one is congratulatory to the only real team
6. in Chicago that has brought a great deal of pride to
7. us recent, the Chicago Bulls a basketball team. And
8. I'd ask for suspension of the rules and the immediate
9. adoption of this Resolution.

10. PRESIDENT:

11. Senator Partee seeks leave for all members to
12. join as co-sponsors. Is there leave? On the motion to
13. suspend all in favor signify by saying aye. Contrary
14. no. The motion carries. On the motion to adopt, all
15. in favor signify by saying aye. Contrary no. The
16. motion carries and the Resolution is adopted. If...if
17. we...if we don't move along Senator Mitchler will have
18. another Resolution. Is there further business to come
19. before the Regular Session? Senator Weaver.

20. SENATOR WEAVER:

21. Well Mr. President there is a...there must be some
22. way to move this HB on firstreading, 17 and 65 in order
23. to be ready for that football game between the Chicago
24. Bears and the St. Louis Cardinals in August of next year.
25. Now this...both of these teams are used to playing on
26. artificial surfaces and we'd like to make them feel com-
27. fortable down in Champaign, so if Senator Partee would
28. like to co-sponsor this bill with me and move it on
29. through this Session in the next day or so, why I think
30. we can make that time table.

31. PRESIDENT:

32. Did you wish to suspend the rules to proceed out
33. of the regular order of business?

1. SENATOR WEAVER:

2. Well, I was trying to wait until Senator Graham was
3. off the Floor.

4. PRESIDENT:

5. Senator Scholl.

6. SENATOR SCHOLL:

7. Mr. President, Members of the Senate coming from the
8. great City of Chicago I think we'd probably be very happy
9. to let the Chicago Bears move permanently to Champaign.

10. PRESIDENT:

11. Senator Graham now moves that the Regular Session
12. stand in recess subject to the call of the Chair. We
13. will learn later today what the plan of the House will
14. be and if they come in at 12:01 we will then ultimately
15. today adjourn until 9:00 tomorrow morning. If they
16. come in at a regular hour tomorrow morning we will come
17. in at noon. But that will...that decision will await
18. the development of events in the House. It will not
19. be necessary for the members to stand in readiness to
20. convene subject to the call of the Chair. We will adopt
21. the adjournment resolution with what ever members we have
22. on hand at the time we learn what the plan of the House
23. will be. So the motion by Senator Graham is to recess
24. the regular Session subject to the call of the Chair.
25. On that question, all in favor signify by saying aye.
26. Contrary no. The motion carries. The Regular Session
27. stands in recess subject to the call of the Chair.

29. PRESIDENT:

30. The Regular Session will come to order. Is there
31. any further business to come before the Regular Session?
32. Senator Bell moves to adjourn the Regular Session until
33. 12:00 noon, Saturday, November 1st. All in favor of the

1. motion... I'm sorry, December 1st. The Regular Session
2. will adjourn until 12:00 noon, Saturday, December 1st.
3. All in favor signify by saying aye. Contrary no. The
4. motion carries. So ordered.
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
