26. know in the House two bills, Senate Bills 6 and 7. I'm wondering  
27. what the posture of those bills are before we vote on this  
28. motion. Would you tell us.

29. SENATOR HARRIS:

30. Yes. The...the status of those bills is that the House  
31. sponsor of them refused to call them today. They were in a  
32. problem about them. It was obvious to the leadership over there,  
33. I know Representative Shea consulted with the Speaker. They

1. made a determination since they were short of bodies  
2. there was nothing they could do about it. These two  
3. substantive bills which are important and which this  
4. Body has acted on I think will have to be resubmitted  
5. in the Regular Session and enacted as rapidly as we  
6. can sometime after the first of the year. ...Those  
7. two bills that you refer to which by subject matter are  
8. the substantive bills for the reimbursement for the  
9. transportation of school children and reimbursement for  
10. the transportation of the elderly which is a new concept  
11. did not pass the House.

12. SENATOR PARTEE:

13. That answers my question.

14. SENATOR HARRIS:

15. Yes. Okay.
