15. SENATOR JOHNS:

16. Thank you, Mr. President. I move the Journals just read  
17. by the Secretary be approved unless some Senator has additions  
18. or corrections to offer. I move that reading and...

19. PRESIDENT:

20. You heard the motion. All in favor will say Aye. Opposed  
21. Nay. The Ayes have it. The motion carries. Senator Johns.

22. SENATOR JOHNS:

23. I move that reading and approval of the Journals of Wed-  
24. nesday, March the 31st, 1976, Thursday, April the 1st, 1976  
25. and Friday, April the 2nd, 1976, be postponed pending arrival  
26. of the printed Journals.

27. PRESIDENT:

28. You heard the motion. All in favor will say Aye. Opposed  
29. Nay. The Ayes have it. The motion carries. Now, just before  
30. the Committee Reports the Chair has an announcement. May I  
31. have your attention, please. There are two gentlemen here with  
32. cameras. One from the UPI and the other from the Associated  
33. Press who would like to take some silent pictures with their

7. Resolutions.

8. SECRETARY:

9. Senate Resolution 269, introduced by Senator Berning.  
10. It's congratulatory.

11. PRESIDENT:

12. Senator Berning is recognized.

13. SENATOR BERNING:

14. Thank you, Mr. President and members of the Body. This  
15. is a congratulatory resolution for a little old lady who has  
16. reached her 100th birthday. I would respectfully invite all  
17. members of the Senate to join in this congratulatory resolu-  
18. tion.

19. PRESIDENT:

20. Is there further discussion?

21. SENATOR BERNING:

22. I, then move, Mr. Chairman, for suspension of the rules  
23. for immediate consideration of this resolution.

24. PRESIDENT:

25. Senator Berning moves for the suspension of the rules for  
26. the immediate consideration of this resolution. All in favor  
27. will say Aye. Opposed No. The rules are suspended. Senator  
28. Berning now moves for the immediate adoption of this resolution.  
29. All in favor will say Aye. Opposed Nay. The resolution is

7. Senator Lemke has moved to suspend the rules for the im-  
8. mediate consideration of this resolution. All in favor will  
9. say Aye. Opposed Nay. The rules are suspended. Senator Lemke  
10. now moves for the immediate adoption of this resolution. All  
11. in favor will say Aye. Opposed Nay. The resolution is adopt-  
12. ed.

14. Senate Resolution 271, introduced by the same sponsors.

16. PRESIDENT:

17. Senator Lemke.

18. SENATOR LEMKE:

19. (Inaudible)...make a motion to suspend the rules, and  
20. have the resolution immediately adopted.

21. PRESIDENT:

22. Is there discussion? Senator Lemke moves for the imme-  
23. diate suspension of the rules for the immediate consideration  
24. of this resolution. All in favor will say Aye. Opposed Nay.  
25. The rules are suspended. Senator Lemke now moves for the im-  
26. mediate adoption of this resolution. All in favor will say  
27. Aye. Opposed Nay. The resolution is adopted.

28. SECRETARY:

29. Senate Resolution 272, introduced by the same sponsors,  
30. congratulating Curie High School.

31. PRESIDENT:

32. Senator Lemke.

33. SENATOR LEMKE:

1. Make a motion to suspend the rules and have it immediate  
2. adopted.

3. PRESIDENT:

4. Senator Lemke moves for the suspension of the rules for  
5. the immediate consideration of this resolution. All in favor  
6. will say Aye. Opposed Nay. The rules are suspended. Senator  
7. Lemke now moves for the adoption of this resolution. All in  
8. favor will say Aye. Opposed Nay. The resolution is adopted.

9. SECRETARY:

10. Senate Resolution 273, introduced by Senator Mitchler.  
11. It's congratulatory.

12. PRESIDENT:

13. Senator Mitchler is recognized.

14. SENATOR MITCHLER:

15. Mr. President and members of the Senate, this is a reso-  
16. lution congratulating the West Senior High School of Aurora  
17. for missing the State Championship in the 1976 Illinois State  
18. High School Class Double A Basketball Tournament by one point,  
19. and I would appreciate suspension of the rules and immediate  
20. consideration and adoption of this resolution.

21. PRESIDENT:

22. Any discussion? Senator Mitchler moves the suspension of  
23. the rules for the immediate consideration of this resolution.  
24. All in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. The  
25. rules are suspended. Senator Mitchler now moves the adoption  
26. of this resolution. All in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The  
27. resolution is adopted. Introduction of bills. One moment.  
28. For what purpose does Senator Bell arise?

29. SENATOR BELL:

30. Yes, thank you, Mr. President. A point of personal privi-  
31. lege.

32. PRESIDENT:

33. State your point.

1. SENATOR BELL:

2. Well, I think it's appropriate, Mr. President, that upon  
3. our gathering here for the first time in the new Senate Chambers,  
4. that it be commented upon how...frankly, Mr. President, how  
5. beautiful it is, that I think the decorators and the archi-  
6. tects have done an excellent job. I...I feel very proud to be  
7. a member of this Body that is sitting in this Chamber today.  
8. I would, also, comment that the Illinois State Florist Asso-  
9. ciation have put before us a...a beautiful display of the horti-  
10. culture art, and I certainly thank them and want to bring this  
11. to your attention, Mr. President. Thank you.

12. PRESIDENT:

13. Thank you very much, Senator Bell, and I'm glad that you  
14. mentioned the flowers. The horticulture...well, actually,  
15. the Illinois State Florist Association were kind enough to  
16. place these here and there will be a representative of that  
17. group here tomorrow morning to tell us what their motivation  
18. was. And so far as the Chamber itself is concerned, I believe,  
19. like you, that a place that belongs to the people should be  
20. responsive and should look like something the people would de-  
21. sire. This is the peoples' House, and I'm sure that the young  
22. people who will come into this Chamber for many, many years  
23. as Senators will be appreciative of the fact that several years  
24. ago we commenced this preparation for the refurbishing of what  
25. is the peoples' House. Introduction of bills.

26. SECRETARY:

27. Senate Bill 1650...1659, introduced by Senator Johns.

28. PRESIDENT:

29. Rules Committee.

30. SECRETARY:

31. Senate Bill 1660 and 1661.

32. PRESIDENT:

33. Rules Committee. The Chair recognizes Senator Hickey.

1. SENATOR HICKEY:

2. Mr. President, House Bill 3170 releases Federal re-  
3. insurance funds...

4. PRESIDENT:

5. One moment, Senator. Will the members be in their seats,  
6. please. Senator Hickey.

7. SENATOR HICKEY:

8. House Bill 3170 releases Federal reinsurance funds for  
9. the maintenance of the Guranteed Loan Fund for students un-  
10. der the Illinois State Scholarship Commission. This is an  
11. appropriations matter. Provisions for authorization of the  
12. transfer of Federal funds were made in House Bill 1693, and  
13. this action is merely perfunctory. Each day's delay cost  
14. the State two hundred and eighty eight dollars additionally.  
15. I've conferred with President Partee, Senator Harris, Senator  
16. Hynes and Senator Weaver of the Appropriations Committee who  
17. agree with this procedure. I move to discharge the Rules  
18. Committee from House Bill 3170 to have the bill read a 1st  
19. time today and moved to 2nd without reference.

20. PRESIDENT:

21. You heard the motion. All in favor will say Aye. Opposed  
22. Nay. The motion carries. The bill is discharged from Com-  
23. mittee, it will be read a 1st time and be referred to 2nd  
24. reading. Do you have the bill physically present? We'll have  
25. it in a moment, Senator. Senator Harber Hall, would you come  
26. up a moment, please? Read the bill a 1st time.

27. SECRETARY:

28. House Bill 3170. Senate sponsor Senator Hickey

29. (Secretary reads title of bill)

30. 1st reading of the bill.

31. PRESIDENT:

32. 2nd reading. Senator Rock. House Bills on 2nd reading.

33. Senate Bills on 2nd reading. Senate Bill 1542. That's page

1. two of your Calendar. Senator Rock.

2. SENATOR ROCK:

3. Thank you. I would wish that, Mr. President, this be

4. moved to the order of 3rd reading. I understand the Treasurer's

5. Office is in need of this refund money.

6. SECRETARY:

7. Senate Bill...

8. PRESIDENT:

9. Read the bill.

10. SECRETARY:

11. ...Senate Bill 1542.

12. (Secretary reads title of bill)

13. 2nd reading of the bill.

14. PRESIDENT:

15. Any committee amendments? Any amendments from the Floor?

16. 3rd reading.

17. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

18. If I might have the attention of the membership, the Ser-

19. geant-at-Arms has turned in a set of automobile keys from a

20. dealership in Decatur, Illinois. Will somebody who...whom-

21. ever they belong...they're up here at any rate. Senator Donne-

22. wald.

23. SENATOR DONNEWALD:

24. Yes, Mr. President, I'd like to move that Senate Bill

25. 1589 be Tabled. It reposes in the Committee on Rules.

26. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

27. That motion is always in order. Senator Donnewald has

28. moved that Senate Bill 1589 be Tabled. All those in favor

29. signify by saying Aye. So ordered. Senator Partee, for what

30. purpose do you arise?

31. SENATOR PARTEE:

32. For the purpose, Mr. President, of moving to Table some

33. bills, and by way of explanation let me say that these are

1. bills which had been introduced in the last Session, which  
2. were to be used in the main as vehicle bills, and they are, and  
3. I will give the Secretary a list of them. They commence at  
4. Senate Bill 3...1329 and run consecutively to 1365. They then  
5. commence at Senate Bill 1404 and run consecutively to 1444...  
6. 1445, pardon me, and the last in the series is 1454. I move  
7. that these bills be Tabled.

8. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

9. You've all heard the motion. Senator Partee has moved  
10. to Table Senate Bills 1329 through and including 1365 and  
11. Senate Bill 1404 through and including 1445 and additionally  
12. Senate Bill 1454. All those in favor signify by saying Aye.  
13. All those opposed. The Ayes have it. So ordered. Senator  
14. Partee.

15. SENATOR PARTEE:

16. Now, Mr. President, if I could have the attention of the  
17. membership for a moment. This is a...

18. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

19. Will the members please be in their seats. There is an  
20. announcement of some general interest, I expect with respect  
21. to the schedule.

22. SENATOR PARTEE:

23. This is a question which has been asked several times  
24. today, and I thought I could say once and for all. You have  
25. been given prior to today a projected schedule of the Session.  
26. We will stick as closely to that schedule as is humanly possi-  
27. ble, taking into consideration the unsuspected things and the  
28. frailties of humanity, but that will more or less be our  
29. schedule. By the same token, it has been suggested  
30. that we tell you today what time we're going to meet tomorrow.  
31. There is a Governor's Prayer Breakfast tomorrow morning at 8:00  
32. o'clock which... oh, that's Wednesday. I'm sorry, I thought  
33. it was tomorrow. Someone told me it's tomorrow. Tomorrow



1. there will be a meeting, and then we will have to alter our  
2. whole schedule. I thought that was tomorrow, but we will  
3. come into Session tomorrow, then, at 10:00 o'clock. And at  
4. the close of the Session, the Rules Committee will meet in  
5. Room 325, which is my office, and it appears that it may or  
6. may not be necessary to hold a Session on Wednesday. It's  
7. entirely possible that they...we will not have to have a  
8. Session Wednesday. It all depends on how it goes tomorrow,  
9. but as it...we now see it, we'll start at 10:00 tomorrow,  
10. and at 11:00 o'clock there will be a meeting of the Rules  
11. Committee. Any other questions? It's entirely possible that  
12. we will not be here either Wednesday or Thursday. That's  
13. what I'm suggesting to you.

14. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

15. On the order of Resolutions, Mr. Secretary.

16. SECRETARY:

17. Senate Resolution 16...1662, introduced by Senator Egan.  
18. Congratulatory.

19. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

20. Senator Egan.

21. SENATOR EGAN:

22. Yes, thank you, Mr. President. I move the...request  
23. unanimous approval for the immediate adoption of Resolution  
24. 1662. It's congratulatory.

25. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

26. Senator Egan has moved to suspend the rules for Senate  
27. Resolution 274. All those in favor signify by saying Aye.  
28. All those opposed. The Ayes have it. So ordered. Senator  
29. Egan now moves the immediate consideration and adoption of  
30. Senate Resolution 274. All those in favor signify by saying  
31. Aye. All opposed. The Ayes have it. The resolution is adopt-  
32. ed.

33. SECRETARY:

1 Senate Resolution 275, introduced by Senator Mitchler  
2 and all Senators. It's congratulatory.

3 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

4 Senator Mitchler.

5 SENATOR MITCHLER:

6 Mr. President and members of the Senate, this Senate Reso-  
7 lution is commending Francis Mayo, who is the Regional Adminis-  
8 trator to the Midwest office of the Environmental Protection  
9 Agency. He has been transferred to Cincinnati, Ohio to head  
10 the EPA's municipal water pollution laboratory in that city,  
11 and many of you are personally acquainted with Francis Mayo  
12 and the good work that he accomplished when he was the Regional  
13 Administrator, one of the outstanding fighters for the anti-pollu-  
14 tion cause, and I would certainly ask all Senators to join in  
15 sponsorship of this resolution, and further ask for suspension  
16 of the rules, immediate consideration and adoption.

17 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

18 Is there any discussion? Senator Latherow.

19 SENATOR LATHEROW:

20 Well, thank you, Mr. President. I wonder if I could see  
21 a copy of that resolution before we adopt it?

22 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

23 Yes, Sir, that is your right. Can we have a Page up here,  
24 please? Senator Latherow. May we have some order, please.

25 Senator Latherow.

26 SENATOR LATHEROW:

27 Well, Mr. President, I don't question at all the reason-  
28 ableness of Senator Mitchler's resolution, but I do believe  
29 that a resolution of this position should be heard in Executive  
30 Committee, and I would object to this having...having full con-  
31 sideration of the Body.

32 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

33 Further discussion? Executive. Senator Netsch, for what  
34 purpose do you arise?

1. SENATOR NETSCH:

2. I can't...oh, I beg your pardon. To redirect a...a ques-  
3. tion with Senator Partee.

4. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

5. Will the members be in their seats, please. We have an  
6. inquiry with respect to the schedule. Senator Netsch.

7. SENATOR NETSCH:

8. I mentioned to Senator Partee that I think a lot of us  
9. would be interested in whether or not there is anymore infor-  
10. mation about the question that I directed to him the last time  
11. we were in Session, and he suggested that I repeat it now.  
12. It has to do with our joint rules with the House, which pro-  
13. vide in effect that all bills that are introduced must go to  
14. Rules Committee and, presumably, cannot be acted upon unless  
15. they are approved by Rules Committee for action. That has  
16. left many of us in the position of really not knowing whether  
17. substantive nonbudget legislation is going to move this Session,  
18. or is not, and before the deadlines for introducing and setting  
19. bills pass, I think many of us would like to know what will  
20. happen in that respect. Is there any further information?

21. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK:)

22. Senator Partee.

23. SENATOR PARTEE:

24. Every time this question is asked I think of the rather  
25. stirring speech made by Senator Knuppel on the advantages of a  
26. unicameral Legislature in contradistinction to a bicameral  
27. one, and I can only say to you that at 9:00 o'clock tomorrow  
28. morning there will be a meeting of the leaders of the House  
29. and the Senate. And this matter is a priority consideration  
30. on our agenda for discussion with them. I have come to under-  
31. stand that there is a possibility that that there will be in  
32. the House some real concern about the delimitation of this  
33. Session to matters pertaining to Revenue and Appropriations.

1. I've heard from other sources that that is not so as to re-  
2. spect to what the House's plans are. We hope certainly to-  
3. morrow to find out precisely what they are going to be about  
4. with reference to this question, and when we come into Session  
5. at 10:00 o'clock tomorrow morning we can, of course, give you  
6. that information.

7. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

8. Introduction of bills.

9. SECRETARY:

10. Senate Bill 1662, introduced by Senators Soper, Howard  
11. Mohr, Dougherty and others.

12. (Secretary starts to read title of bill)

13. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

14. Rules Committee. Gentlemen, there appears to be no fur-  
15. ther business with the exception of a death resolution to come  
16. before the Regular Session. The Regular. Senator Harris.

17. SENATOR HARRIS:

18. Yes, I spoke to Senator Partee. He may not have communi-  
19. cated to you, Mr. President. I did want to have Senate Joint  
20. Resolution 60 read a second time today. I do not have any  
21. amendments for it. I would like to get that advanced.

22. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

23. All right, I'm...with leave of the Body, we will go then  
24. to the order of Constitutional Amendment, 2nd reading, and  
25. take up Senate Joint Resolution 60. It has to be read in full  
26. ...full under the Constitution. Mr. Secretary.

27. SECRETARY:

28. Senate Joint Resolution No. 60.

29. (Secretary reads SJR No. 60)

30. 2nd reading of the resolution.

31. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

32. Any amendments from the Floor? 3rd reading. With leave  
33. of the Body, we'll go back to the order of Introduction of bills.

1. Introduction, Mr. Secretary. I beg your pardon. Senator Harris,  
2. for what purpose do you arise?

3. SENATOR HARRIS:

4. Yes. A question with regard to the Secretary's reading  
5. of the Senate Joint Resolution, and that is that on page three  
6. we noticed, and I think it was just a matter of misstatement,  
7. my copy shows in the first paragraph that a record vote of  
8. three-fifths of the member elected passes the bill, it should  
9. become law. I think the Secretary...I...I know that the tran-  
10. script will show that the Secretary read it two-thirds, and  
11. I just...

12. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

13. The record...you...you are...you are correct, Senator.  
14. The copy that was read by the Secretary as the official docu-  
15. ment before the Body does, in fact, on page three, line seven,  
16. show that a record vote of three-fifths of the members elected  
17. passes the bill.

18. SENATOR HARRIS:

19. Yes.

20. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

21. If the Secretary said otherwise it was a simple error.

22. SENATOR HARRIS:

23. Right. Okay. And I...I just wanted this dialogue to be  
24. a part of the record so that the transcript and the bill, I'm  
25. sorry, the original of the resolution would be consistent with  
26. each other.

27. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

28. You are correct.

29. SENATOR HARRIS:

30. Okay.

31. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

32. The record...

33. SENATOR HARRIS:

1. Thank you, Mr. President.
2. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)
3. The record will so show. Introduction of bills. Senator
4. Egan, will you approach the Secretary's Desk? We usually put
5. our names on bills we introduce. Those are yours, I take it?
6. SECRETARY:
7. Senate Bill 1663 through Senate Bill 1665.
8. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)
9. Rules Committee. Further introductions.
10. SECRETARY:
11. Senate Bill 1666 and 1667.
12. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)
13. Rules Committee. Further introductions.
14. SECRETARY:
15. Senate Bill 1668.
16. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)
17. Rules Committee. Is there any further business to come
18. before the Regular Session? All right. I'm holding for the
19. death...yeah, those I know about. Any further business to
20. come before the Special...the Regular Session. All right,
21. will the members please be in their seats. We have two death
22. resolutions. Mr. Sergeant-at-Arms, will you please clear the
23. Floor of all those not authorized to be on the Floor, and I
24. ask the membership to be in their seats. Resolutions.
25. SECRETARY:
26. Senate Resolution 276, introduced by Senator Schaffer.
27. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)
28. Senator Schaffer.
29. SENATOR SCHAFFER:
30. This resolution pertains to Judge William Carroll of Mc-
31. Henry County, a former member of the Illinois General Assembly,
32. and I make the appropriate motion to suspend the rules for
33. immediate adoption.

1 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

2 Senator Schaffer has moved to suspend the rules for the  
3 immediate consideration and adoption of Senate Resolution 276.  
4 All those in favor signify by saying Aye. All those opposed.  
5 The Ayes have it. The rules are suspended. Senator Schaffer  
6 now moves the adoption of Senate Resolution 276. All those  
7 in favor signify by rising. The resolution is adopted.

8 SECRETARY:

9 Senate Resolution 277 introduced by Senators McCarthy  
10 and Carroll.

11 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

12 Senator McCarthy.

13 SENATOR McCARTHY:

14 Yes, Mr. President and members of the Senate. Senate  
15 Resolution 277 takes note of the death of Honorable Wright  
16 Patman, a former United States Representative from Texas.  
17 Congressman Patman, as you all know, is proof that politicians  
18 are viewed favorably by their constituents. Congressman Patman  
19 served fifty-six consecutive years in public service. Start-  
20 ing upon his discharge from the Army in World War I, he entered  
21 the Texas Legislature, later went into a district attorney  
22 and ultimately for forty-eight years served in the United States  
23 House of Representatives, and up until a period of about a  
24 year before his death served for about ten years as Chairman  
25 of the House Banking and Currency Committee. Representative  
26 Patman, as you know, had strong views on fiscal and monetary  
27 policies. He was well respected because of his positions, and  
28 I mention these things about Congressman Patman because it was  
29 my pleasure to know him. The inspiration that he has brought  
30 to many people will be missed. I think, particularly, again  
31 Congressman Patman who kept his views in touch with his con-  
32 stituents was kept in public service for these fifty-six years,  
33 and in these days that conventional wisdom is that politicians

1. are suspect, I think Wright Patman is...was living proof and  
2. now a symbol of politicians being a noble profession. Conclud-  
3. ing my remarks I would ask that the rules be suspended for the  
4. immediate consideration of this resolution, and unless anyone  
5. would not desire, I would move that the entire membership be  
6. added as sponsors on this legislation.

7. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

8. Senator McCarthy has moved for the suspension of the rules  
9. for the immediate consideration of Senate Resolution 277. All  
10. those in favor signify by saying Aye. All those opposed. The  
11. Ayes have it. The rules are suspended. Senator McCarthy fur-  
12. ther asks leave that all members be shown as cosponsors. Is  
13. leave granted? So ordered. Senator McCarthy now moves for
