25. Bill 1287, Senator Graham. Senate Bill 1288, Senator Graham.
26. Senate Bill 1289, Senator Graham. All right. That ends the
27. Senate Bills on 2nd reading. For what purpose does Senator Egan
28. arise?

29. SENATOR EGAN:

30. Mr. President and members of the Senate, I would like leave
31. of the Body to transfer the Senate Bill 828 from the Executive
32. Committee for hearing by the Executive Appointments Committee,
33. please.

1. PRESIDENT:

2. Is there leave? Leave is granted.

3. SENATOR EGAN:

4. Thank you.

5. PRESIDENT:

6. Senator Bradley Glass, did you desire recognition?

7. SENATOR GLASS:

8. Thank you, Mr. President. Approximately a week ago I moved to
9. Table Senate Bill 266. That was my error. I did not mean to do
10. that and I would now move, Mr. President, that Senate Bill 266 be
11. taken from the Table, and I have spoken to the Chairman of the Pensions
12. Committee about having the bill heard. He indicates that it can be
13. heard either today or at the...the next meeting of the committee.

14. PRESIDENT:

15. Senator Morris, did you desire to speak to this matter? Is

26. The...the number was 1453. Senator Morris moves to discharge Senate

29. All in favor will say Aye. Opposed Nay. The bill is reassigned.
30. Senator Savickas.

31. SENATOR SAVICKAS:

32. Mr. President, I was just checking on 266, Senator Glass's bill.
33. It's a downstate pension, policeman's pension fund and fireman's

1. fund. I'm wondering if this is a...a bill that will be gutted for
2. the purpose of enacting some other legislation?

3. PRESIDENT:

4. Senator Glass would be the one who could answer it. Senator
5. Glass.

6. SENATOR GLASS:

7. No, Senator Savickas, it will not. It will...it will be
8. submitted to the committee in its present form.

9. SENATOR SAVICKAS:

10. Thank you.

11. PRESIDENT:

12. On the order of 2nd reading, there announcement...the...
13. Senator Hickey now has her amendment ready. We're going back
14. on the order of 2nd reading for Senate Bill 749. Senator Hickey.

15. SENATOR HICKEY:

16. Mr. Chairman, as you know, Senate Bill 49 is full of shall
17. nots...

18. PRESIDENT:

19. Well, just...just one moment.

20. SENATOR HICKEY:

21. Okay.

22. SECRETARY:

23. Senate...Senate Bill 749

24. (Secretary reads title of bill)

25. 2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments. One Floor
26. Amendment offered by Senator Hickey.

27. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

28. Senator Hickey.

29. SENATOR HICKEY:

30. Mr. Chairman, as you know, the...the 749 is clear full of shall
31. nots for dental assistants, and it says for...

32. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

33. There's been a call for a little order, but I think we ought to

1. have a lot of order. Senator Hickey.

2. SENATOR HICKEY:

3. Thank you, Mr. Chairman. It denies these things to appropriately
4. trained, as it say dental assistants, and I have no quarrel with that
5. at all. But I do have a quarrel with the fact that appropriately
6. trained is not defined. Within the last few years, the State of Illinois
7. has spent many, many, many dollars in many of our community colleges
8. putting in courses for dental assistants. These people take a course
9. for one year, they're certified by a national board. There is no
10. certification for them in the State of Illinois, and they feel that
11. unless appropriately trained is defined, as I want to do with this
12. amendment to 749, that all of that money that the State has spent
13. in establishing these courses and all the education that they have
14. had will all go down the drain, and for that reason, I ask for a
15. favorable roll call on this amendment.

16. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

17. Senator Partee. Senator Harris.

18. SENATOR HARRIS:

19. Well this amendment, and I acknowledge that Senator Hickey
20. brought it to me about a half hour ago is a pretty comprehensive
21. amendment. Really that paragraph - I is a magor question. Could
22. we have a little time to evaluate this before we adopt the amendment?
23. I...would it be possible to hold this for a day, Senator Hickey,
24. for me and some of my staff people to make some calls and just see for
25. sure whether this is the direction we ought to go?

26. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

27. Senator Partee.

28. SENATOR PARTEE:

29. That's quite right. I'd be...I'd be willing to hold it till
30. tomorrow. We'll hold the bill till tomorrow.

31. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

32. Hold the bill. Take it out of the record. Senator Partee,
33. we're now fast approaching the hour of 10:30. Is it the desire to

1. adjourn until tomorrow morning now? Senator Partee.

2. SENATOR PARTEE:

3. That's correct because we have...that's correct because we
4. have committee meetings scheduled for 10:30.

5. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

6. Senator Dougherty...

7. SENATOR PARTEE:

8. ...oh, we wanted to make an announcement. That's correct.
9. May we have your attention just one moment. We'll be right through
10. in a minute, Senator Dougherty. On Friday of last week, Senator
11. Harris and I were in Washington...

12. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

13. Just a moment, Senator. There's an awful rumbling. I don't
14. know whether it's talking or what, but could we have your attention.

15. SENATOR PARTEE:

16. Saturday...or Friday of last week, Senator Harris and I were in
17. Washington where we were briefed first by the Economic Council of
18. the President, by the President himself, and by the Secretary of State,
19. Mr. Kissinger. We later were briefed by members of the State Depart-
20. ment. Senator Harris and I have mutually decided that we would like
21. to, if you desire it, make a report to you of what took place on our
22. trip. We think it would be edifying and enlightening to you, and
23. we desire to share it with you. In order that all the members may
24. be accommodated, we would prefer to do it tomorrow at a point just
25. before we go into our committees at...at the end of the Session tomorrow.
26. Senator Harris.

27. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

28. Senator Harris.

29. SENATOR HARRIS:

30. Well, I would just join Senator Partee. I think we both were
31. enriched by our experience. We'd like to share it with you and if
32. it meets with the approval of the Senate, we'd like to just take a
33. few minutes, each of us, tomorrow and make just a little report to

1. you about our experience.

2. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

3. Senator Dougherty, I think the Senate certainly agrees to
4. that. All those in favor say Aye. All those opposed No. The
5. Ayes have it. Senator Dougherty.

6. SENATOR DOUGHERTY:

7. Mr. ...President and members of the Senate, we have...there
8. was a bill that, Senate Bill 765 which was originally scheduled to
9. be held tomorrow, the hearing was to be held tomorrow. However,
10. inadvertently, the sponsor of the bill thought it was set for
11. today. I have discussed with Senator Soper and he asked if we
12. could put it on the call for today and he has agreed. So Senate
13. Bill 765 will be held, hearing will be held today rather than
14. tomorrow.

15. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

16. You've heard the motion. All those in favor say Aye. All
17. those opposed No. The Ayes have it. Are there further announcements?
18. Senator Regner.

19. SENATOR REGNER:

20. Yes, Mr. ...Mr. President, I'd like to move to discharge the
21. Committee on Agriculture from further consideration of Senate Bills
22. 1319 and 1320 for the purpose of Tabling.

23. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

24. That...the motion is to discharge the Committee on Agriculture
25. on...for...further consideration on Senate Bills 1319 and 1320.
26. Is...all those in favor say Aye. All those opposed No. The Ayes have
27. it. Senator Regner.

28. SENATOR REGNER:

29. I now move to Table Senate Bills 1319 and 1320.

30. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

31. The...the motion is to Table Senate Bills 1319 and 1320. All
32. those in favor say Aye. All those opposed No. The bills are Tabled.
33. Are there further announcements? Senator Rock.

1. SENATOR ROCK:

2. I just wanted to make sure, Mr. President, thank you, that
3. if, in fact, the Journal does not reflect, I wish it would reflect

14. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DONNEWALD)

15. Senator Chew moves to discharge the Committee on Transportation
16. for the purpose of Tabling Senate Bill 644, was it? All those in
17. favor say Aye. All those opposed No. The Ayes have it. Senator
18. Chew now moves to Table Senate Bill 644. All those in favor say
19. Aye. All those opposed No. The Ayes have it. Are there further
20. announcements? Senator Lane moves to adjourn till 9:00 o'clock
21. tomorrow morning. All those in favor say Aye. All those opposed
22. No. The Ayes have it. Oh, Senator Savickas.

23. SENATOR SAVICKAS:

24. Labor Committee will meet at 2:30 till 5:00 and the schedule
25. says from...break from 5:00 till 7:00. It is our intention because
26. of the call of bills that we may be able by working a little extra,
