22. SECRETARY:

23. House Bill 1519.

24. (Secretary reads title of bill)

25. 2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Judiciary offers
26. one amendment.

27. PRESIDENT:

28. Senator Donnewald. Senator Donnewald moves the adoption
29. of Amendment No. 1 to House Bill 1519. All in favor will say
30. Aye. Opposed Nay. The amendment's adopted. Any further amendments?
31. Any amendments from the Floor? 3rd reading. House Bill 1531,
32. Senator Savickas. I can't see Senator Savickas. Is he there?
33. Read the bill.

1. SECRETARY:

2. House Bill 1531.

3. (Secretary reads title of bill).

4. 2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Pensions, Personnel
5. and Veterans Affairs offers one amendment.

6. PRESIDENT:

7. Senator Savickas. Senator Savickas, there's an amendment,
8. Senator, do you desire to move it's adoption. Senator Savickas,
9. desires to move the adoption of Amendment No. 1 to House Bill
10. 1531. Any discussion? All in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The
11. Amendment's adopted. Any further amendments? Any amendments
12. from the Floor? 3rd reading. House Bill 1534, Senator Savickas.
13. Read the bill.

14. SECRETARY:

15. House Bill 1534.

16. (Secretary reads title of bill)

17. 2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

18. PRESIDENT:

19. Any amendments from the Floor? 3rd reading. House Bill
20. 1590, Senator Brady.

21. SECRETARY:

22. House Bill 1590.

23. (Secretary reads title of bill)

24. 2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

25. PRESIDENT:

26. Any amendments from the Floor? 3rd reading. Is there a
27. leave on...is there a leave to go to the order of, the receipt of
28. committee reports. The Executive Appointments Committee has
29. a report that I feel will take us fifteen minutes to
30. do it in. Senator Vadalabene, are you ready? Read the report
31. first, Mr. Secretary.

32. SECRETARY:

33. Senator Vadalabene, Chairman of Executive Appointments and

1. Administration Committee, recommends confirmation of the
2. Governor's Messages of February the 5th, 17th,...February
3. 5th and 17th, April the 15th, May the 13th and May the 19th.

4. PRESIDENT:

5. Senator Vadalabene. Will members be in their seats?

6. SENATOR VADALABENE:

7. Thank you, Mr. President, and members of the Senate, I
8. move that the Senate resolve itself into Executive Session
9. for the purpose of acting on the Governor's Appointments
10. set forth in the Governor's Messages of February 5th,
11. February 17th, April 15th and May 13th, 1975.

12. PRESIDENT:

13. You heard the motion. All in favor vote Aye. Opposed
14. Nay. Ayes have it. Senator Vadalabene.

15. SENATOR VADALABENE:

16. Thank you, Mr. President, I move that the Senate, do
17. advise and consent to the following nominations by the
18. Governor. To the Advisory Hospital Council, as a member,
19. Larry Bullock, of Chicago, for a term ending June 30th, 1976,
20. and to the Southern Illinois University Board of Trustees as
21. a member, A. D. VanMeter, Jr. of Springfield, for a term
22. ending January 19, 1981. I would ask leave, at this time,
23. Mr. President, that these be on one roll call. They are unsalaried
24. members to these respective boards.

25. PRESIDENT:

26. Is there any discussion? On this question the...those
27. in favor will vote Aye. Opposed Nay. The voting is open.
28. The three, are together as read by the Secretary...by the Chairman.
29. The question is that the Senate advise and consent to the
30. nominations just made? Mr. Bullock and Mr. Van Meter. Those
31. in favor are voting Aye, and those opposed are voting Nay.
32. Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question
33. the Ayes are 54, the Nays are none, with 1 Voting Present.

1. A majority of Senators elected, concurring by record vote,
2. the Senate does advise and consent to the nominations just
3. made. For what purpose does Senator Savickas rise?

4. SENATOR SAVICKAS:

5. Mr. President, and members of the Senate, if it's possible
6. at this time, I would rise to Table a bill of which I'm the
7. Senate sponsor.

8. PRESIDENT:

9. We are in Executive Session. As soon as we come out of
10. Executive Session that motion will be proper. Senator
11. Vadalabene.

12. SENATOR VADALABENE:

13. Yes, thank you, Mr. President, now we go to the salaried
14. positions of ...of the Governor's Messages, and I would
15. assume that these would be on individual roll calls. To
16. be Commissioner of Banks and Trust Companies, Richard K.
17. Lignoul, of Springfield, for a term ending January 17th, 1977.

18. PRESIDENT:

19. Any discussion? The question is does the Senate advise and
20. consent to the nomination just made? Those in favor vote Aye.
21. Those opposed vote Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted
22. who wish? Take the record. On this question the Ayes are 56,
23. the Nays are none, with none Voting Present. A majority of
24. Senators elected, concurring by record vote, the Senate does
25. advise and consent to the nominations just made. Senator
26. Vadalabene.

27. SENATOR VADALABENE:

28. To the Department of Law Enforcement as Director, Harvey
29. N. Johnson, of Park Ridge, for a term ending January 17th, 1977.

30. PRESIDENT:

31. Any discussion? The question is does the Senate advise and
32. consent to the nominations just made. Those in favor vote Aye.
33. Opposed Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish?

1. Take the record. On that question the Ayes are 54, the Nays
2. are none, with none Voting Present. A majority of Senators
3. elected concurring by record vote, the Senate does advise and
4. consent to the nomination just made. Senator Vadalabene.

5. SENATOR VADALABENE:

6. To the Department of Law Enforcement as Assistant Director,
7. Joseph J. Longo, of IaGrange Park, for a term ending January
8. 17th, 1977.

9. PRESIDENT:

10. Any discussion? The question is does the Senate advise
11. and consent to the nomination just made. Those in favor vote
12. Aye. Those opposed vote Nay. The voting is open. Have all
13. voted who wish? Take the record. On that question the Ayes
14. are 53, the Nays are none, with none Voting Present. A majority
15. of Senators elected concurring by record vote, the Senate
16. does advise and consent to the nomination just made. Senator
17. Vadalabene.

18. SENATOR VADALABENE:

19. To the Department of Mental Health and Developmental
20. Disabilities as Director, Leroy P. Levitt, M.D. of Chicago,
21. for a term ending January 17th, 1977.

22. PRESIDENT:

23. Any discussion? The question is does the Senate advise
24. and consent to the nomination just made. Those in favor vote
25. Aye. Those opposed Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who
26. wish? Take the record. On that question the Ayes are 56, the
27. Nays are none, with none Voting Present. A majority of Senators
28. elected concurring by record vote, the Senate does advise and
29. consent to the nomination just made. Senator Vadalabene.

30. SENATOR VADALABENE:

31. To the....

32. PRESIDENT:

33. Senator Buzbee and Senator, would you Gentlemen move out

1. of the aisle, please? Thank you.

2. SENATOR VADALABENE:

3. ...to the Department of Public Health as Director, Joyce

4. C. Lashof, of Chicago, for a term ending January 17th, 1977.

5. PRESIDENT:

6. Any discussion? The question is does the Senate advise

7. and consent to the nomination just made? Those in favor

8. vote Aye. Those opposed Nay. The voting is open. Have

9. all voted who wish? Take the record. On this question the

10. Ayes are 58, the Nays are none, with none Voting Present.

11. A majority of Senators elected concurring by record vote, the

12. Senate does advise and consent to the nomination just made.

13. Senator Vadalabene.

14. SENATOR VADALABENE:

15. To the State Fair Agency as Superintendent, Paul King, of

16. Springfield, for a term ending January 17th, 1977.

17. PRESIDENT:

18. Any discussion? Senator Graham.

19. SENATOR GRAHAM:

20. Mr. President, and members of the Senate, had I been in

21. Executive the other day, instead of Industrial Affairs, I would

22. have raised the same objection, that I'm going to raise now.

23. I think that the investigation conducted by the Auditor General

24. of this State, the Grand Jury investigation of the Illinois

25. State Fair, the editorial stands taken by various newspapers

26. and television and other members of the media throughout the

27. State and the obvious mismanagement of what used to be the fair,

28. that's now turned out to be a disaster, should bring to our

29. attention, that we should give some serious consideration to

30. this plight because, His Excellency, down on the second floor,

31. has continually said throughout the State, that we should have

32. honesty and responsibility in Government. And nevertheless,

33. he will fly in the face of a Grand Jury questioning, he'll

1.. fly in the face of the Auditor General of this State, he'll
2. fly in the face of the Editorial Policies throughout the
3. State, with regard to the mismanagement of the Illinois State
4. Fair, and reappoint...re-submit this name to us for confirmation.
5. I think it is especially disasterous, for us to consider this...
6. when Representative Dave Jones and Senator John Davidson, have
7. a bill pending before the legislature, which will take the
8. Illinois State Fair out of politics. We heard that hue and
9. cry with the judges, and I think we're doing this possibility
10. of this legislation becoming a law in this State, an injustice
11. by confirming this Gentleman, at this time. Ladies and Gentlemen,
12. of this Senate, I'm only saying to you, that if we believe what
13. we say we believe, and when we are under the closest scrutiny
14. in this State, in all the agencies, thanks to the Governor,
15. and others, to...to adopt that attitude of honesty, responsibility,
16. integrity, I love my fellow men attitude. Then we can't in
17. good conscience, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate, vote to
18. confirm this man, whose administration has been a disaster.

19. PRESIDENT:

20. Senator Mitchler.

21. SENATOR MITCHLER:

22. Mr. President, members of the Senate, we have before us
23. the confirmation of Paul King, to serve as the manager of the
24. Illinois State Fair. I think in considering the Governor's
25. selection for reappointment of this individual to administer
26. the State Fair Agency, I think we should look at what has
27. happened to the Illinois State Fair under this administration.
28. Probably of all the scandals and mismanagement of any agency
29. for many years past, I think the Illinois State Fair stands
30. out as a glowing example of inefficiency. I want to point
31. out that the Illinois State Fair is administered by the
32. Governor of the State of Illinois. He is the one that controls

1. the operation of that State Fair. Now, as a member of
2. the Illinois State Fair Advisory Board and Representative
3. Craig is the...member from the House, there are only
4. two members of the General Assembly serving on that board.
5. It has been my observation to note the political infiltration
6. into the Illinois State Fair, and it is with regret that we
7. in the Illinois General Assembly allow such a thing to
8. happen, because the State Fair belongs to the people, and if
9. we allow the political arm of the Executive Branch of this
10. Government to take over the State Fair, we are at fault. I
11. hope that we address ourself to that problem this Session
12. and correct that situation. Now, in addition to that, I'm
13. going to say a kind word about Paul King. He came here under
14. very troubled circumstances. He inherited a big problem, and
15. around him was surrounded many political appointments by this
16. Governor, and although he had the responsibility, and I criticize
17. him severely, openly and privately, for not taking his authority
18. as the manager of the State Fair, and saying, no. When you say
19. maybe and you let these things happen and you do not exert
20. your authority, you are wrong, and Paul King was wrong. But
21. around him, where he was surrounded by political appointees,
22. and this is what caused all the scandal out at that State Fair.
23. Even in addition to that, the Governor himself, issued news
24. releases about parimutuel betting, set racing dates in his
25. news releases, in defiance of Illinois Statutes and the authority
26. of the Illinois Racing Board. And that puts a responsibility
27. for the mismanagement of the State Fair on the Governor, himself,
28. and all of his appointees including...

29. PRESIDENT:

30. Your time has expired, Senator. Complete your remarks.

31. SENATOR MITCHLER:

32. Paul King and the others, I'm going to give a vote...

33. I'm summing up, Mr. President.

34. PRESIDENT:

1. Do sum up then.

2. SENATOR MITCHLER:

3. I'm going to give...an affirmative to Paul King, because if
4. we were to deny this and change the State Fair at this time, when
5. we got a Fair coming up, I think we'd even do a further detriment
6. to it, but let's take a good example and clean up the State Fair
7. this Session. Thank you.

8. PRESIDENT:

9. Senator Regner.

10. SENATOR REGNER:

11. Mr. President, members of the Senate, this morning I've
12. been reading the audit report of Coopers and Libra and regarding
13. to State Fair Agency, I have to concur in what Senators Graham
14. and Mitchler have said previously. Mr. King did come in late
15. last year, however, even under his operation it was a confusing
16. total mess, and I would urge that we do not confirm at this time
17. the appointment of Mr. King. Now, I want to read just one
18. sentence that was in the audit report. It can only be concluded
19. that the 1974 State Fair was operated almost completely without
20. management supervision and control. Especially over its fiscal
21. and budgetary operation. Total revenues recorded were down slightly,
22. yet expenditures increased by over three-million dollars, and I
23. would suggest we do not concur at this time but do give Mr. King
24. the opportunity to try again and see what he comes back with
25. next year.

26. PRESIDENT:

27. Senator Donnewald.

28. SENATOR DONNEWALD:

29. Yes, Mr. President and members of the Senate, I, of course,
30. am a member of the Executive Committee and did hear the testimony
31. and the questions submitted to the witness and the appointee,
32. Mr. King, and I feel as well as many of my fellow members, on
33. this side of the aisle, that he did answer the questions put to

1. him adequately. He did admit that there were errors that had
2. been made in that Fair in...the Illinois State Fair, and very
3. frankly, Mr. President and members of the Body, I feel that he
4. does deserve the advice and consent of this Body. Thank you.

5. PRESIDENT:

6. Senator Clarke. Senator Berning. Pardon me, Senator
7. Latherow is next.

8. SENATOR LATHEROW:

9. Thank you, Mr. President, I...I am going to support this
10. appointment but I just think we could easily recognize this
11. in a few words as a concrete example of a officer following
12. the boss' words.

13. PRESIDENT:

14. Senator Berning.

15. SENATOR BERNING:

16. Thank you, Mr. President, I too heard the testimony by
17. the witness, Mr. King, and in response to questions I
18. directed to him, it came completely evident to me, that
19. this Gentleman has no concept of business management. It
20. would be an insult to the citizens of the State of Illinois,
21. to confirm this Gentleman, at this time. In the light of the
22. evidence, he, himself exhibited of a lack of understanding
23. and lack of concern, a lack of responsibility, and sheer
24. inability to administer. In my opinion, this gentleman
25. does not deserve re-confirmation. The Fair certainly could
26. operate with an interim appointee of any individual associated
27. with the Fair and do a much better job, than has been done
28. at this time.

29. PRESIDENT:

30. Any further discussion? Senator Harris.

31. SENATOR HARRIS:

32. Mr. President, I attended that same committee meeting, that
33. reference has been made to earlier this week, and I must say

1. I'm impressed with the sincerity of Mr. King. There's
2. no question about his personal commitment, to making the
3. Illinois State Fair, the outstanding agricultural exhibition
4. that it ought to be. I do want to take this opportunity
5. to, on the public record, state my personal reservations
6. about whether he really has the total equipment to operate
7. within the restrictions of public administration. Encum-
8. bered by statutory directives, I have that reservation.
9. I'm impressed with his personal commitment and desire, but
10. I do want the understanding of the Senate, to be informed
11. of my concern, about whether, in fact, Mr. King is totally
12. skilled, in this difficult administrative responsibility
13. of public performance. I support him, but I want the record
14. to be unmistakable.

15. PRESIDENT:

16. Any further discussion? The question is, does the Senate
17. advise and consent to the nomination just made? Those in
18. favor vote Aye. Those opposed Nay. The voting is open.
19. Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question
20. the Ayes are 42, the Nays are 5, with 8 Voting Present. A
21. majority of Senators elected concurring by record vote,
22. the Senate does advise and consent to the nomination just
23. made. Senator Vadalabene.

24. SENATOR VADALABENE:

25. To the Property Tax Appeal Board as member, William
26. J. Engleman, of Raymond, for a term ending January 19th,
27. 1981.

28. PRESIDENT:

29. Any discussion? The question is, does the Senate advise
30. and consent to the nomination just made? Those in favor
31. vote Aye. Opposed Nay. The voting is open. Have all
32. voted who wish? Take the record. On that question the Ayes

1. are 54, the Nays are none, with none Voting Present. A
2. Majority of Senators elected concurring by record vote,
3. the Senate does advise and consent to the nomination just
4. made. Senator Vadalabene. For what purpose does Senator Hall rise?

5. SENATOR HALL:

6. Mr. President, I unfortunately was absent at the...
7. the discussion of, Commissioner Lignoul, I'd like the
8. record to show, that had I been here, I would of voted for
9. advising and consenting, on that Gentleman.

10. PRESIDENT:

11. The record will so show. Senator Vadalabene.

12. SENATOR VADALABENE:

13. Yes, I would like the record to show that, I wanted
14. to vote Aye on this Gentleman, too. I was handed a
15. telephone message, at the same time I was supposed to vote.

16. PRESIDENT:

17. The record will so show. A ringing message.

18. SENATOR VADALABENE:

19. To the Pollution Control Board as members, Irvin G.
20. Goodman of Medinah, for a term ending July 1, 1976.

21. PRESIDENT:

22. Any discussion? The question is does the Senate advise
23. and consent to the nomination just made? Those in favor vote
24. Aye. Opposed Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who
25. wish? Take the record. On this...that question the Ayes are
26. 55, the Nays are none, with 1 Voting Present. A majority of
27. Senators elected having...a majority of Senators elected
28. concurring by record vote, the Senate does advise and consent
29. to the nomination just made. Senator Vadalabene.

30. SENATOR VADALABENE:

31. To the Pollution Control Board as member, Philip Zeitlin
32. of Chicago, for a term ending July 1, 1977.

33. PRESIDENT:

1. Any discussion? The question is does the Senate advise
2. and consent to the nomination just made? Those in favor vote
3. Aye. Those opposed vote Nay. The voting is open. Have
4. all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question the
5. Ayes are 53, the Nays are none, with none Voting Present.
6. A majority of Senators elected concurring by record vote,
7. the Senate does advise and consent to the nomination just
8. made. Senator Vadalabene.

9. SENATOR VADALABENE:

10. To the Department of Children and Family Services as
11. Director, Mary Lee Leahy, of Springfield, for a term ending
12. January 17th, 1977.

13. PRESIDENT:

14. Any discussion? The question is does the Senate advise
15. and consent to the nomination just made? Those in favor
16. vote Aye. Those opposed vote Nay. The voting is open.
17. Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question
18. the Ayes are 40, the Nays are 5, with 5 Voting Present.
19. A majority of Senators elected concurring by record vote,
20. the Senate does advise and consent to the nomination just
21. made. Senator Vadalabene.

22. SENATOR VADALABENE:

23. Mr. President, and members of the Senate, I move that the
24. Senate, do now arise from Executive Session.

25. PRESIDENT:

26. You've heard the motion. All in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay.
27. The Ayes have it. The motion carries. We have some bills
28. that were brought late from 1st reading, I think that it's
29. essential that they be moved, of which I have the list.

30. PRESIDENT:

31. Is there leave to return to the order of House Bills
32. on 1st reading. Leave is granted. House Bill 574, Senator
33. Newhouse.

1. SECRETARY:
2. House Bill 574.
3. (Secretary reads title of bill)
4. 1st reading of the bill.
5. PRESIDENT:
6. For what purpose does Senator Savickas rise?
7. SENATOR SAVICKAS:
8. For the purpose of getting your commitment to me after
9. that Executive Session.
10. PRESIDENT:
11. I always honor my commitment, Senator, I wondered
12. why you weren't on your feet?
13. SENATOR SAVICKAS:
14. Well, I was sitting in my chair waiting...
15. PRESIDENT:
16. I don't recognize people sitting in their chair.
17. Senator Savickas is recognized.
18. SENATOR SAVICKAS:
19. My motion, Senator, is at the request of the Department
20. of Public Health to Table House Bill 1399 of which I am
21. the Senate sponsor. It's presently in committee and I
22. would ask leave of the Body to Table it.
23. PRESIDENT:
24. The motion is, to discharge House Bill 1359, 1399, from
25. the Committee on Judiciary, Judiciary Committee.
26. SENATOR SAVICKAS:
27. Committee on Licensed Activities.
28. PRESIDENT:
29. ...To discharge House Bill 1399, from the Committee on
30. Licensed Activities for the purpose of Tabling. Is there...
31. is there leave? Leave is granted. Senator Savickas moves to
32. Table Senate Bill...House Bill 1399. All in favor say Aye.
33. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. House Bill 1399 is Tabled.

1. For what purpose does Senator Demuzio rise?

2. SENATOR DEMUZIO:

3. Mr. President, this morning I picked up House Bill 1061
4. by mistake, the bill I wanted was 1161, and I'd like to
5. leave of the Senate to remove myself as the sponsor of that
6. bill, somebody else may want to pick it up today.

7. PRESIDENT:

8. Is there leave? Leave is granted. Senator Donnewald.

9. SENATOR DONNEWALD:

10. Yes, Mr. President, I'd like to have leave of the Body to
11. re-refer House Bill 2781, from Transportation to Revenue. And
12. I have another request.

13. PRESIDENT:

14. Is there leave? Leave is granted. Senator Netsch, or
15. Senator Donnewald, you had another one?

16. SENATOR DONNEWALD:

17. Yes, Mr. President, I would also ask that House Bill
18. 2044 be re-referred from Pensions to Executive. Do I have leave?

19. PRESIDENT:

20. There is an objection. Senator Shapiro. Senator
21. Shapiro is recognized.

22. SENATOR SHAPIRO:

23. That is a pension matter, it concerns a downstate teachers
24. retirement system. The companion Senate Bill was in the same
25. committee and that bill should remain in Pensions, Personnel and
26. Veterans Affairs.

27. PRESIDENT:

28. Senator Donnewald.

29. SENATOR DONNEWALD:

30. It does not, in fact, deal with the pensions itself, it
31. deals with the members appointed to the Pension Board of
32. that particular Teachers Pension Bill.

1. PRESIDENT:

2. Senator Shapiro.

3. SENATOR SHAPIRO:

4. The pensions are concerned with the makeup of the members
5. of the various Public Employee Pension Boards, and I still
6. raise an objection to taking that bill from that committee and
7. referring it to Executive.

8. PRESIDENT:

9. Senator Donnewald.

10. SENATOR DONNEWALD:

11. Well, Mr. President, I in the...in the past several weeks,
12. I've been making it a practice to spread bills where they are...
13. where the principal sponsor is located. In this particular
14. instance, Senator Johns is the principal sponsor. However,
15. my next motion was to have Senator Johns, at his request, be
16. removed as lead sponsor and myself as lead sponsor...placed as
17. lead sponsor. Now, if we're going to...to save the hour to
18. save time, let's take a vote on whether we can, in fact, re-refer
19. this from...from Pensions to...Executive. So I...I so move.

20. PRESIDENT:

21. What is the number of the bill again?

22. SENATOR DONNEWALD:

23. 2044, House Bill.

24. PRESIDENT:

25. The question is Senator...Senator Donnewald moves to
26. discharge the Committee on Pensions from further consideration
27. of House Bill 2044, for the purpose of re-referring it to
28. Executive. Those in favor of that motion will vote Aye. Those
29. opposed will vote Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who
30. wish? Take the record. Senator Donnewald.

31. SENATOR DONNEWALD:

32. Now, now, Mr. President.

33. PRESIDENT:

1. Just a moment, please. On that question the Ayes are
2. 31, the Nays are 24, The motion carries, and the bill
3. is discharged, House Bill 2044 is discharged from the
4. Committee on Pensions and is re-referred to the Committee
5. on Executive. Senator Shapiro.

6. SENATOR SHAPIRO:

7. I'd like to have that roll call verified. I understand
8. it takes thirty votes to discharge.

9. PRESIDENT:

10. It does, in fact, take thirty votes. Will the members be
11. in their seats? There is a motion for a verification of
12. that roll call. Will the members be in their seats? Now
13. let's have some order. Will the members be in their seats?
14. The Secretary will call the affirmative roll call.

15. SECRETARY:

16. The following voted in the affirmative: Brady,
17. Bruce, Buzbee, Carroll, Course, Daley, Demuzio, Donnewald,
18. Dougherty, Egan, Kenneth Hall, Hickey, Hynes, Johns, Knuppel,
19. Kosinski, Lane, Lemke, McCarthy, Morris, Netsch, Newhouse,
20. Nudelman, Palmer, Rock, Savickas, Smith, Vadalabene, Welsh,
21. Wooten, Mr. President.

22. PRESIDENT:

23. Senator Shapiro.

24. SENATOR SHAPIRO:

25. Hynes.

26. PRESIDENT:

27. Senator Hynes is standing in the middle aisle where he
28. should not be.

29. SENATOR SHAPIRO:

30. Lane.

31. PRESIDENT:

32. Senator Lane is in the same posture.

33. SENATOR SHAPIRO:

1. Lemke.

2. PRESIDENT:

3. Senator Lemke. Is Senator Lemke within the bar? Is
4. Senator Lemke here? Take him off the record...take him off
5. the roll call.

6. SENATOR SHAPIRO:

7. Senator Carroll.

8. PRESIDENT:

9. Senator Carroll is on the...The roll has been verified.
10. On this question the Ayes are 30, the Nays are 24. The
11. motion carries. Senator Donnewald.

12. SENATOR DONNEWALD:

13. Now, Mr. President, I would like to have leave of the
14. Body to have myself replaced as lead sponsor in lieu of
15. Senator Johns. I have his permission.

16. PRESIDENT:

17. Is there leave?

18. SENATOR DONNEWALD:

19. He would...he would also like to be the second sponsor
20. on that bill.

21. PRESIDENT:

22. Is there leave for Senator Johns to be replaced as the
23. lead sponsor on House Bill 2044 and to become the second sponsor
24. with Senator Donnewald being the lead sponsor? Is there leave?
25. Leave is granted. Senator Fawell.

26. SENATOR FAWELL:

27. I rise on a matter of personal privilege.

28. PRESIDENT:

29. State your point. Just a moment Senator. Will the
30. members be in their seats? Senator Fawell.

31. SENATOR FAWELL:

32. If I heard Senator Donnewald correctly, he has stated that
33. he has attempted to send the bills to the various committees

1. where the chief sponsor may be. Now, maybe I didn't hear
2. correctly, but if I did, I, without any personal rancor towards
3. Jim Donnewald, who I respect very much, but certainly if...
4. when I heard as I have heard over the years, how much we
5. respect the committee system, if the assignment of bills
6. which are supposed to go to the committee that is knowledgeable
7. on the substance on those bills, if instead we are distributing
8. the bills to the particular committee wherever the chief sponsor
9. might be, we might as well forget about the substantive
10. aspect of the bills, or the substantive expertise of our committees.
11. And for the record, I, for one, would like to say, I object
12. to that kind of distribution of...of bills to our committees.

13. PRESIDENT:

14. Senator Donnewald:

15. SENATOR DONNEWALD:

16. Very quickly, in response to that, Senator, what
17. is being done at the present time, where the bill will fit
18. in more than one committee, and that person sponsoring is
19. in one of those committees, it is, in fact, assigned there.
20. Now, in all instances this cannot be done, as you well can
21. appreciate.

22. PRESIDENT:

23. I think you should add, Senator Donnewald, there are
24. two other considerations. And that are...and those are,
25. the load of the various committees. Taken into consideration,
26. the fact that we have a no proxy system, and...in a major
27. mandate sometimes that kind of conduct. Any further discussion?
28. Senator Netsch, did you desire recognition?

29. SENATOR NETSCH:

30. Thank you, Mr. President, I was requested to announce
31. that with the waiver of the six day rule, House Bills 780,
32. 796 and 824, have been set for hearing today in the Committee
33. on Public Health, Welfare and Corrections.

1. PRESIDENT:

2. Senator Regner.

3. SENATOR REGNER:

4. Mr. President, and members of the Senate, Senator Hynes,
5. Chairman of the Appropriations Committee, asked me to announce
6. that Senate Bill 1494, which was left off the call sheet for
7. today, will be heard in appropriations this afternoon.

8. PRESIDENT:

9. Senator Harber Hall.

10. SENATOR HARBER HALL:

11. Mr. President, I'd like leave of the Body to take House
12. Bill 855 from the committee for purposes of Tabling this

14. PRESIDENT:

15. Is there leave? Senator Hall seeks leave to remove
16. House Bill 855 from the order of what. Where is it?

17. SENATOR HARBER HALL:

18. Take from the Local Government Committee.

19. PRESIDENT:

20. To discharge the Local Government Committee to bring to
21. the Secretary's Desk, for the point of...purpose of Tabling.
22. Is there leave? Now, Senator...leave is granted. Senator
23. Harber Hall moves now to Table House Bill 855. Those in
24. favor will say Aye. Opposed Nay. Ayes have it. The House
25. Bill 855 is Tabled. Back to the order of House Bills on
26. 1st reading. Senator Clarke.

27. SENATOR CLARK:

28. Mr. President, I'd like to have leave to be indicated
29. chief sponsor on House Bill 1966. Senator Knuppel picked it
30. up, and he's perfectly agreeable to transfer it.

31. PRESIDENT:

32. Is there leave? Leave is granted. Senator Course.

33. SENATOR COURSE:

1. I'd like to have unanimous consent, Mr. President, to
2. have House Bill 1386 and 2781 heard in the Revenue Committee
3. this afternoon.

4. PRESIDENT:

5. Is there leave? Leave is granted. Senator Newhouse.

6. SENATOR NEWHOUSE:

7. Mr. President, I'd like to announce to the Body that the
8. Committee on Pensions, will not be meeting today because of
9. the absence of a number of its members. We'll have it's meeting on
10. next Monday.

11. PRESIDENT:

12. Senator Berning.

13. SENATOR BERNING:

14. Mr. President, I ask for unanimous consent to have
15. the Committee on Local Government discharged from further
16. consideration of House Bill 2191, for the purpose of Tabling.

17. PRESIDENT:

18. Is there leave? Leave is granted. Where is the bill,
19. Senator?

20. SENATOR BERNING:

21. Committee on Local Government. I now then move to Table
22. House Bill 2191.

23. PRESIDENT:

24. All in favor will say Aye. Opposed Nay. House Bill 2191,
25. is Tabled. Senator Brady.

26. SENATOR BRADY:

27. Mr. President, I would like leave to be named as additional
28. sponsor on House Bill 1043, 1044 and 1045.

29. PRESIDENT:

30. Is there leave? Leave is granted. May I have the Senate...Senator
31. Bruce.

32. SENATOR BRUCE:

33. Yes, Mr. President, I would like to be shown as sponsor of

1. House Bill 1568, Senator Knuppel picked that bill up and
2. he's agreeable that I become the principal sponsor of
3. House Bill 1568.

4. PRESIDENT:

5. Is there leave? Leave is granted. Is there leave to
6. show, Senator Partee as co...as a sponsor to House Bills 955
7. and 56. Leave is granted. Now, may I have your attention?
8. Senator Palmer. Senator Clarke. May we have your attention?
9. Senator Berning. A former member,...Senator Netsch. A former
10. member of the Illinois State Senate, who gave many fruitful
11. years of human service to this Body, has passed to the great
12. beyond. He is Senator T. MacDowning, who at one period, at my
13. earliest recollection, served, as Chairman of Judiciary.
14. His funeral is today at two o'clock, at the First Presbyterian
15. Church, in Macomb, Illinois. The Chair is appointing a
16. Committee of Senators for whom air transportation will be
17. arranged, to attend that funeral. Those Senators are:
18. Senators Dougherty, Chew, Ozinga and Latherow. House Bills
19. on 1st reading. House Bill 1177, Senator Glass. Pardon me,
20. Senator Smith.

21. SENATOR SMITH:

22. Just a word to the point you just announced.

23. PRESIDENT:

24. Yes Sir. Senator Smith is recognized. Senator Netsch,
25. and the Gentlemen in the aisle, please, please, let's have
26. some order here.

27. SENATOR SMITH:

28. Mr. President, and members of the Senate, it's all
29. together possible that there are those who are sitting here,
30. who knew, our late friend and former colleague, who are
31. perhaps wondering why I was not named as a member of the
32. committee that was just announced. I merely rise to say,
33. that I'm not yielding, Mr. Chairman.

1. PRESIDENT:

2. You are recognized, Senator.

3. SENATOR SMITH:

4. ...If you want to stop me, it's all right.

5. PRESIDENT:

6. You are recognized, Senator.

7. SENATOR SMITH:

8. All right. I knew the late Senator MacDowning, member of
9. the other side of the aisle. But, insofar as a relationship
10. as between he and myself, we never considered the matters
11. that came before this Body and the light, of whether or not
12. it was sponsored by a Senator on that side of the aisle or
13. a Senator on this...side of the aisle. Senator Harris came
14. over and asked, if I should like to make the trip to Macomb.
15. I knew of the death of our late friend, and I had to say to
16. the good Senator, I should like, rather, to remain here, and
17. not make that particular trip. I don't know, I hope, and I
18. think Senator Latherow, was to prepare...did you do so, Senator...
19. a resolution in connection with the death. But now that you
20. have seen fit to make mention here and now, may I simply say
21. that if one surveys the life, of the late Senator MacDowning
22. as a man, you would find in it many, many things to admire,
23. and little if anything to criticize. He was brave, farseeing,
24. quick seeing, obedient and prompt in action, but there is
25. another characteristic about the man which I think, like him,
26. and all others should be considered. I mean the standard of that
27. morality, which one owes to truth to his family, to his loved
28. ones, to his own immediate convictions and to his God. And
29. when considered in that light, may I say to my friends who
30. did not know him, I repeat, when considered in that light,
31. I find in him the type of manhood that I could appreciate and
32. do appreciate, and which I could wish was possessed by all,
33. with whom we've come in contact. I'm trying to say that I feel...

1. I felt for him an admiration, which I could but scarcely
2. accord to some, let me look over this audience, some three
3. or four others, besides. And I say to you that if the statues
4. of the time should come, when the statues of our former friends
5. and associates were to be erected in testimony of a colleague's
6. belief, that I would vote to give to his, one of the highest places
7. of honor. I did not say why, specifically, I refused to take the
8. trip, but did not see fit to make the trip. The other day
9. when they examined my blood pressure, and I can't account
10. for it, and I have it here in my pocket, it was two-hundred, over
11. one-hundred and eighty, which indicates that I continue the
12. course that I have followed by refusing to appear at the
13. mike, and being as quietly as I can. That's the only reason
14. my name was not called to accompany the others to have shown
15. our respects for our late colleague. Thank you, Mr. Chairman,
16. Mr. President.

17. PRESIDENT:

18. Back to House Bills on 1st reading. House Bill 1177. Now,

17. All in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The rules are
18. suspended. Senator...Graham.

19. SENATOR GRAHAM:

20. Mr. President, and members of the Senate. I talked
21. to Senator Latherow about this. He feels very strongly about
22. his friend, and on his behalf and behalf of the senior members
23. of this Senate, I think that they will all agree with me,
24. that we who enjoyed serving with T. Mac, our lives and
25. enrichment of those lives, are better for having known him.
26. I was a freshman here. T. Mac and some of those gentlemen that
27. were presiding in these halls at that time were just that in
28. every sense of the word. T. MacDowning was a man who was
29. mentally and morally equipped, academically up to the challenge,
30. always willing and ready to give a newcomer advice, from
31. whichever side of the aisle this newcomer might be sitting.
32. He always had a smile for you. He joined in the camaraderie
33. of this Senate.

1. He was a man who believed deeply, as many of our members who
2. have left us believed, that this Illinois State Senate,
3. was a most exclusive club in Illinois. They treated each
4. other as gentlemen, they earned that respect, and when no
5. other colleagues violated that in all kindness and candor,
6. they would say to him. I wonder if you really belong. T.
7. MacDowning was a great, great man. I have fond memories
8. of serving with him. He had courage. He flew in the face
9. of his colleagues sometimes when he thought he was right,
10. and voted his conviction. I would want to join with Senator
11. Latherow and others, in moving that the Senate adopt this
12. Resolution.

13. PRESIDENT:

14. The question is shall Senate Resolution 92 be adopted?
15. I would assume the entire membership would desire to be
16. shown as sponsors on both this Resolution and the one
17. preceding. All in favor of the adoption of Resolution 92,
18. Senate Resolution 92, please rise. The amendment is adopted.
19. Is there an announcement either by the Chairman of Finance
20. and Credit Regulations or Insurance and Licensed Activities?
21. Your time having run over. Just a moment. Senator McCarthy.

22. SENATOR MCCARTHY:

23. The Committee on Finance and Credit Regulations will
24. meet immediately upon adjournment. We can move along with
25. our business and be out at a reasonable length of time.

26. PRESIDENT:

27. Senator Romano.

28. SENATOR ROMANO:

29. The Committee on Insurance will meet immediately after
30. adjournment, in Room 400.

31. PRESIDENT:

32. Senator Johns.

33. SENATOR JOHNS:

1. Mr. President, for the record, House Bill 2044, will be
2. heard in Executive tomorrow at ten-thirty. House Bill 2044.

3. PRESIDENT:

4. Thank you. The Senate stands adjourned till nine o'clock
5. tomorrow morning.

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
