21 From whence...

22 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

23 Senator Rock.

24 SENATOR ROCK:

25 From...from whence did the bill emanate? Who...who requested 26 this?

27 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

28 Senator Davidson.

29 SENATOR DAVIDSON:

30 The Probation Department of the Circuit Court here in Springfield,
31 because the...man who is the Superintendent of the home is getting
32 married, and he was going to have to mandatorily live in the home and
33 this has been changed. The detention home has been changed to where it

is now keeping...a more reckless or more dangerous juvenile and for him to stay on the job as a married person, he was going to have to leave and...the request came from the Probation's Department of the Judicial...7th Judicial Circuit here.

5 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Senator Rock.

7 SENATOR ROCK:

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Well, the problem that I have and I frankly am not that familiar 8 with your County Detention Home here and I understand very well that 9 there is at least an... overt or inverted Home Rule Amendment on the 10 bill. The problem that I have is the...the statutory mandate that has 11 long been in existence calls for that the caring of the inmates...as in a 12 family home and to this end, the employees provided for and selected 13 to control and manage the home shall consist of and then they had 14 discreet women of good moral character or a man and you are adding "or 15 couple" to which I have no objection. The objection that I have is 16 "may reside therein". If we don't mandate some adult to reside 17 therein, who is going to reside therein and provide care as in a 18 family home? That's the problem I have. 19

20 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

21 Senator Davidson.

22 SENATOR DAVIDSON:

23 Well, as explained to me, Senator Rock, the ones who asked for the amendment, is that adults must be on duty 24 hours a day whether 24 25 it's the Superintendent or another hired individual and the reason they requested the word ... strike the word "shall" to the word "may", 26 that if the County Board or the Court wanted the person to live there, 27 then they shall, but if they wanted to give the option that they did not 28 have to live there, then they would have the option not to live there, 29 and with the statutory word "shall", the Court could not give that 30 discretion. That's why they asked the word "may". 31 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE) 32

Senator Rock.

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SENATOR ROCK: 1

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Well, the...the problem then, it seems to me, we ought to change 2 the Statute,...and say that we are not providing care for the inmates 3 as in a family home and we may or may not have adults living there. 4 5 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK) Senator Davidson. 6 7 SENATOR DAVIDSON: 8 Mr. President, let's take this out of the record and let me resolve this with Senator Rock and see if we can come up on what's 9 10 our hangup is between us. 15	I was unaware that municipalities were at twenty-five hundred.
16	I thought it was fifteen hundred also.

18	Senator Nimrod.
19	SENATOR NIMROD:
20	I don't believe it was brought to my attention that why were
21	townships singled out for this in the provisions of the Act and if it is
22	doing that, then I would be opposed to it since I think these ought
23	to be standarized for everybody but ifif it is for everybody,
24	then I would go along with it, but my notes here say that it's only
25	townships that we're reducing.
26	PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)
27	Senator Lane.
28	SENATOR LANE:
29	That's what this bill is reducing, but I understand that it's my
30	impression that the municipalities are at fifteen hundred. I

That...thank you, Mr. President. Senator Lane, we talked about 1 this, and...this is going to cost a little bit of money to do this 2 again. 14 SENATOR SOPER:

15 I think that this is the wrong thing to do.

16 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

17 Senator Wooten.

18 SENATOR WOOTEN:

Mr. President, on the other hand, most complaints that I...my office seems to encounter about townships has to do with the fact that people are just not aware of what happens. I would be very much in favor of reducing this amount to fifteen hundred, simply so that we have a better opportunity of knowing what the townships are doing. I... I think the townships themselves would be in a little bit better standing with the community if this were the case.

26 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

27 Senator Clarke.

28 SENATOR CLARKE:

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8 9 A professional strikebreaker means any person who repeatedly and habitually offers himself for employment on a temporary basis where a lockout or strike exists to take the place of an employee whose work has ceased as a direct consequence of such lockout or strike.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Senator Graham.

SENATOR GRAHAM:

Mr. President and members of the Senate, Senator Harber Hall
tried to get an amendment. It would have made this bill a little
bit better in our eyes. This is not as bad...about the only thing I
can say for this Strikebreaker's Bill...

14 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Excuse me, Senator Graham. If we could have some order? We
are on House Bills 3rd. Pardon me, Senator Graham.
SENATOR GRAHAM:

18 If there's anything good to be said about it, it isn't as bad 19 as House Bill 410. We feel that without the Harber Hall Amendment 20 that this bill is not in the best keeping with the economic climate 21 in the State of Illinois and other things that we think are right, 22 and we, on this side of the aisle, I hopefully will stand in opposi-23 tion to the passage of House Bill 650.

24 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

25 Is there further...Senator Harber Hall.26 SENATOR HALL:

Mr. President, I think the members should...should be aware that last year this bill was heard in the Labor Commerce Committee, and it was stipulated that only if the Professional Picket's Amendment was put in, would it even get out of Committee. With that firm agreement, and it was put on that bill, it did get out of Committee... Subsequently, the Professional Picket Amendment was stricken, and... the bill then failed. Here we are now, we've asked to have that put

back in, and it hasn't, so if we repeat the interest and the con-1 cern of the Body as we did...last year, it's not to say that the 2 3 Body doesn't change from time to time, but I just want to draw your attention that previous legislation, identical to this, has failed 4 5 because there wasn't an equitable amendment and provision for pro-6 fessional pickets. I oppose this bill. 7 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE) 8 Senator Nimrod. 9 SENATOR NIMROD: 10 Yes, Mr. President, if I might ask Senator Hickey just one 11 question? 12 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE) 13 Indicates that she will yield. Senator Nimrod. 14 SENATOR NIMROD: 15 Can you tell me why you would not take the same definition for 16 professional pickets so we could all get behind this bill? Why you 17 would not take that and include it? 18 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE) 19 Senator Hickey. 20 SENATOR HICKEY: Yes, Senator Nimrod, and this answers the two previous Senators 21 22 who spoke, too. That was not offered this year. They're talking about 23 last year, and the bill didn't come over here with that on it. It 24 was offered, I know, by Senator Hall, but not pursuant to any agree-25 ment that I'm aware of this year. We can talk about agreements last 26 year, and you know about those, I don't know about those. And I con-27 tend that since the bill has come this way, and it is a good bill, it 28 seeds to me if you vote against this bill, you must be for professional strikebreakers. That...there isn't anything under the sun 29 30 that prevents Senator Hall or you, Senator Nimrod, from having in-31 troduced that legislation this year since it was not part of the 32 agreement this year which is a separate kind of item. It pertains 33 to a different subject, and there wasn't anything to keep you from

1 offering that bill, and then let that be voted up or down. That really is not, while it is all, of course, in the labor field and 2 3 does deal with strikes, it is a separate issue. We can't go back to agreements a year ago. This is the bill as it stands, and it 4 5 seems to me if anybody votes against this bill they must be for 6 professional strikebreakers.

7 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

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Senator Nimrod.

- 9 SENATOR NIMROD:

10 Thank you, Senator Hickey. I happen to be against professional 11 strikebreakers, and I happen to be against professional pickets, and unless you put the two together, I'm going to oppose your bill. 12 13 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

14 Senator Glass.

15 SENATOR GLASS:

16 Thank you, Mr. President. I would like to speak against this 17 bill also, and I think Senator Hickey in making the statement that 18 if you're against this bill, you must be against professional strike-19 breakers is prejudicial. It seems to me this bill is patently anti-20 business, because if you are going to treat this problem, you ought 21 to treat it across the board and fairly. I... I would also question 22 the definition of a professional striker in the bill - someone who 23 repeatedly, habitually acts as a strikebreaker. I don't know what 24 that means. How many times would they have to do so, once or twice 25 or what...what makes a habitual strikebreaker?

26 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

27 Senator ...

28 SENATOR GLASS:

29 But, I do think to...to repeat that it is clearly an anti-30 business measure and would hope this Body would defeat it. 31 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

32 Senator Berning.

SENATOR BERNING:

33

Well, thank you, Mr. President, I... I have to take exception 1 to the comment of the sponsor in indicating that anyone who votes 2 against this measure is for something else, namely, a professional 3 strikebreaker. I cannot accept that without challenge. Number one, 4 5 I abhor discrimination in any of its phases, and in the event of a strike which is fraught with all sorts of discrimination, both 6 against employers, those workers who want to work, and against the 7 public, I find it difficult, then, to say to someone who would be 8 willing to take a job that he cannot take it, because he can be 9 labeled as a strikebreaker, and consequently, we are going to tell 10 him that he has no right to seek employment. This I find difficult 11 to reconcile with our concept of individual liberty and lack of 12 13 support for discrimination in any of its abhorrent aspects. 14 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

15

Is there further debate? Senator Dougherty.

16 SENATOR DOUGHERTY:

Thank you, Mr. President. I hesitate to get into this argument, 17 but for one reason, I can remember.... I think of it as sort of a 18 fetish of studying the labor laws in this country and what have ... 19 what has taken place down through the years, and I will like to tell 20 21 the members of this Body that the greatest incidence we ever had in the State of Illinois took down here some fifty years ago down in 22 Herrin, Illinois where they imported a great many strikebreakers, and 23 the people down there rebelled. We had bloodshed. We had all kinds 24 There was a fellow named...an outfit in New 25 of trouble, problems. 26 York called Schultz that that was their sole profession, strikebreak-They operated all over the country. Some of the greatest 27 ing. 28 tragedies we've ever had in this country, the labor movement, has been the result of professional strikebreakers. This is one way 29 to end this fearsome thing that labor and business will have to face. 30 I would...recommend and suggest...ask my colleagues here to vote 31 32 for this bill. I believe it's good legislation. 33 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Senator Partee.

SENATOR PARTEE:

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Well, Mr. President and members of the Senate, I stand to 3 support Senator Hickey's Bill. Now, either you believe in the 4 process of unionization or you do not, and if you do, you'll support 5 the bill, because there has to be something like balance, and if a 6 corporate entity could at anytime it gets into a discussion with a 7 union, and if they are in the process of trying to resolve their 8 problems with all of the money and all of the weight being on the 9 side of the corporation, if they could then just break the strike, 10 then there would be no sense or no reason to ever employ the union-11 ization process. So, if you want to be...if you want to kill unions, 12 if you want to say that those who hold the reigns of economics should 13 14 be able to say to those who seek to make a living that you could not under any circumstance sit down and collectively bargain and sit down 15 16 and work out differences because we can just come in and have people to take over your jobs, then the whole process is meaningless. It 17 is a vapid kind of consideration. A bill of this nature brings into 18 the process balance so that the negotiations will be in the spirit 19 20 of settlement rather than in the spirit of destruction of the work Now, it's just that simple, it seems to me, that it brings 21 force. 22 about a quality called balance to the negotiative process, and hence, it is very necessary. Senator Dougherty alluded to the kinds of 23 24 bloody things that are going to transpire or have transpired under circumstances where strikebreakers would come in and take over. 25 26 There have been instances in this country where strikebreakers were brought into situations, and then, when the strike is over, the...the 27 28 cor oration has no feeling, no concern about how those people are going go live, where they're going to eat, how they're going to eat, 29 where they're going to go to school, their children, and it just 30 brings about a very unwholesome situation, and I stand to support 31 32 Senator Hickey's bill.

33 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

» Senator Bell.

SENATOR BELL:

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Well, Mr. President, I'd like to respond to Senator Partee's 1 comments in reference to the fact that if you don't vote for this · 2 · * 3 particular bill, House Bill 650, that you are in effect against unions. Now, Senator Partee, I have great respect for you, and I'm 4 really appalled at your sense of logic there, because your first 5 premise is a faulty premise, but I understand that... I understand 6 that...that's part of the debate process and does serve to cloud the 7 issues and all. I would like to mention that it seems to me that the 8 bill is inequitable when it does not allow the provision that Senator 9 Nimrod has pointed out here. If you're going to have things equal, 10 we should certainly have legislation that prohibits professional 11 pickets also. I just wanted to throw this particular thing out. One 12 other item, Senator Partee, and that is the fact that you mention 13 the significant amount of monies that corporations have available. 14 Well, the truth of the matter is that...that business in these United 15 States and certainly, specifically here in the State of Illinois, 16 is made up of many small corporations, small closed corporations, and 17 that those businesses do not have fantastic sums, and yet they may 18 come under control through the unions of the financial resources at the 19 disposal of the AF of L - CIO or the...or the Teamsters and various other 20 organizations that...that do have considerable resources that would far 21 outgun...far outgun what small business corporations may have available. 22 I'd just like to throw those comments out. Thank you. 23

24 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

25 Is there further debate? Senator Graham is recognized pursuant26 to our rules to speak a second time. Senator Graham.

27 SENATOR GRAHAM:

28 I...I only want to make one correction in the record. I re-29 ferred to House Bill 410, it should have been Senate Bill 410. 30 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

31 Is there further debate? Senator Hickey may close.32 SENATOR HICKEY:

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Thank you, Mr. President. I'd like to point out that as I 1 mentioned earlier, but apparently everyone wasn't able to hear me, · 2 ິ 3 that this ... (SENATOR BRUCE) 4 PRESIDING OFFICER: Excuse me, Senator Hickey. We can perhaps... 5 SENATOR HICKEY: 6 ...that 7 (SENATOR BRUCE) 8 PRESIDING OFFICER: ... get you some order. Senate, please come to order. Senator 9 10 Hickey. 11 SENATOR HICKEY: ... that we have had other strikebreaker legislation before this 12 Body which has passed out that I want, particularly, the people on 13 the other side of the aisle to hear that there are two provisions 14 in this bill which the other bill did not contain, and those two 15 provisions have something to do with the hiring of bona fide replace-16 ments during the progress of a strike or a lockout. The other bill 17 does not contain that, and I think that this certainly would make this 18 bill far more attractive to the other side of the House because of 19 It also does provide, and I...I do hope, Senator Berning, you 20 that. were able to read the amendment which I sent you which does pertain to 21 that because you spoke about not being able to hire somebody during 22 It does the progress of a... of a strike. This does pertain to that. 23 have that provision in it. And then, also, anyone may be hired to 24 see that the property is protected and maintained so that work may 25 be resumed at the end of the strike without crippling affects from 26 cessation. Those are two very valuable parts of this bill. And I, 27 again, want to reiterate that the other legislation referring to 28 pickets can be introduced in a bill of its own which pertains to 29 that subject. This subject pertains only to strikebreakers, and I 30 solicit votes from both sides of the aisle for this good piece of 31 legislation. Λ PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE) 5 Senator Harber Hall. 6 SENATOR HARBER HALL: 7 Mr. President and Senators, 668 simply provides that small 8 insurance companies...county and township insurance companies, they're 9 usually very small, may invest in certain other investments other than 10 U. S. Government Bonds, they may for example ... 11 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE) 12 Excuse me, Senator Hall. If we could have some order, we have 13 several conferences. We have about six staff people on the Floor 14 having conference, if you wish, please take the Senator off the 15 Floor so we can conduct business. Excuse me, Senator Harber Hall. 16 SENATOR HARBER HALL: 17 ... they may for example invest in savings and loan associations so 18 long as their total investment is secured by government insurance. 19 I solicit your support for the bill: 20 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE) 21 Is there further debate? The question is, shall House Bill

33 The record will so show.

SECRETARY:

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House Bill 674.

3 (Secretary reads title of bill)
4 3rd reading of the bill.
5 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)
6 Senator Shapiro.

7 SENATOR SHAPIRO:

8 Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate, House 9 Bill 674 amends the downstate Police and Firemen Articles of the 10 Pension Code and provides that these Articles may not be changed, 11 altered, or amended in anyway by a unit of local government through 12 home rule powers. Now, the genesis for this particular bill is the 13 fact that in downstate Illinois, we have approximately four hundred 14 and seventy-five pension funds...police and firemen. There have been several instances where downstate home rule units have attempted 15 16 to change their pension funds. Niles changed the composition of its 17 board of trustees and Evanston made another minor change which has 18 stood. Rosemont attempted to establish a different pension system 19 without referendum and eventually changed its mind and Monticello 20 considered setting up a pension program without providing for any 21 financing provisions. I think you can see the chaos that would be 22 caused if this bill is not enacted. With four hundred and seventy-23 four separate pension funds, it's absolutely very necessary and I 24 would appreciate a favorable roll call. If there are any questions, I will attempt to answer them. 25

26 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

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Is there...Senator Knuppel.

28 SENATOR KNUPPEL:

If the sponsor would yield...what affect does this have on cities such as Decatur, for example, as I understand, which have already adopted ordinances which change the makeup of the pension system that they have there?

33 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Senator Shapiro.

SENATOR SHAPIRO:

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I...didn't get the...the entire question. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Senator Knuppel.

SENATOR KNUPPEL:

7 Well, what I am trying to ask you, is...is the bill perspective
8 only, or what about those home rule units that have already adopted
9 ordinances which change? Will this...the language of this appears
10 to me to be only perspective and not retrospective with respect
11 to cities or home rule units that have already changed their procedures.
12 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

13 Senator Shapiro.

14 SENATOR SHAPIRO:

15 That is correct. It is prospective. The changes that have...
16 have been made in the two units that we know of have been minor and
17 those will be allowed to stand.

18 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

19 Senator Knuppel.

20 SENATOR KNUPPEL:

21 And those will be what?

22 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

23 Senator Shapiro.

24 SENATOR SHAPIRO:

25 Since it is prospective, I would assume that those will be allow26 ed to stand to...to remain...the two changes that have been made.
27 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

28 Senator Knuppel. Any further...Senator Knuppel.

29 SENATOR KNUPPEL:

30 Well, I'm...I'm just surprised that at this time when we know 31 that there are, for example, the City of Decatur as...that I have cited, 32 although the City of Springfield, there was ligitation which my 33 firm handled, which went up and brought about a decision holding that

the home rule units could change despite the prohibition in the 1 Constitution which I think was in violation of what the Constitution 2 really intended that those cities...or those cities who have already 3 moved would...would get benefits that are not going to be open to 4 those who hereafter act. In other words, I think we've got a ... 5 a situation where it leaves a... open hole. We should correct the 6 whole thing, and it seems to me that this is a vehicle that should correct 7 it, both prospectively and retrospectively, to the time the 8 Constitution was adopted. 9

10 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Is there further debate? The question is, shall House Bill 674
pass? Those in favor vote Aye. Those opposed vote Nay. The voting
is open. Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question,
the Ayes are 54, the Nays are none, 2 Voting Present. House Bill 674
having received the constitutional majority is declared passed. House
Bill 676, Senator Berning. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary.

17 SECRETARY:

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House Bill 676.

19 (Secretary reads title of bill)

20 3rd reading of the bill.

21 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

22 Senator Berning.

23 SENATOR BERNING:

Thank you, Mr. President. Senate Bill 676 has been proposed by 24 the Illinois State Park Lodges themselves to legalize what in many 25 instances is being done already and very simply there are frequently 26 seminars or private parties held, and the present law prohibits 27 the sale of alcholic beverages except while a person is seated and 28 with food served to that customer. Under the bill, which incidently 29 has been amended to meet the requirements of the Committee of 30 Agriculture, we've amended it back to the original hours of from noon 31 until 10:00 p.m. and have defined what a party is, namely ten or more 32 people. As amended, it will provide the authority for the operators 33

of State Parks to cater to groups such as our Legislative Commission, for instance, who is interested in food and drink in other than the regular dining room. This will be of some significance to insuring a greater, profitable operation both to the operator and then ultimately and to the State of our...of our State Parks. I would appreciate a favorable roll call, Mr. President.

7 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

8 Is there further debate? The question is, shall House Bill 676 9 pass? Those in favor vote Aye. Those opposed vote Nay. The voting 10 is open. Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question, 11 the Ayes are 42, the Nays are 5, 2 Voting Present. House Bill 676 12 having received the constitutional majority is declared passed. House 13 Bill 679, Senator Carroll. House Bill 682, Senator Newhouse. House 14 Bill 689, Senator Dougherty.

15 SECRETARY:

16 House Bill 689.

17 (Secretary reads title of bill)

18 3rd reading of the bill.

19 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

20 Senator Dougherty.

21 SENATOR DOUGHERTY:

Thank...thank you, Mr. President. House Bill 689 amends the...the 22 23 pension fund of the employees of the Chicago Park District. It provides that an annuitant will receive an increment of from 2% to 3% of each 24 25 year of retirement. It further provides the sum of $\frac{1}{2}$ of 1% or in other 26 words one full percent will be applied to the payment of this. It 27 increases the pension allowed so widows...up to a maximum of six hundred dollars and has some changes in the insurance section. This 28 29 is the best funding system in the pension form. 85% funded, there is no increase in public contribution to it, all on behalf of the 30 31 employee. This is good legislation, and I'd request a favorable roll 32 call.

33 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

1 . Is there further debate? Senator Berning.

2 SENATOR BERNING:

3 Thank you, Mr. President, I rise in support of this measure. 4 Senator...Senator Dougherty is correct. This is perhaps an out-5 standing example of a finely operated and well funded operation. There 6 is, of course, the potential for a precedent contained in this bill, 7 and I just alert you that we may be confronted with that, and we'll 8 have to deal with that later, but this measure deserves the support 9 of all.

10 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Is there further debate? The question is, shall House Bill 689 pass? Those in favor vote Aye. Those opposed vote Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question, the Ayes are 54, the Nays are none, none Voting Present. House Bill 689 having received the constitutional majority is declared passed. House Bill 692, Senator Savickas.

17 SECRETARY:

18 House Bill 692.

19 (Secretary reads title of bill)

20 3rd reading of the bill.

21 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

22 Senator Savickas.

23 SENATOR SAVICKAS:

Yes, Mr. President and members of the Senate. House Bill 692 24 revises the qualifications for the executive officer of the Board of 25 Health in a public health district. It provides for the authorization 26 for the Boards of Health to charge fees for health services and permits 27 boards to enter in contracts with political subdivisions and private 28 agencies for the purchase, sale, and delivery or exchange of health 29 services. It's...derived from the standard...Stickney Public Health 30 District, one of the four special districts, which is specifically 31 authorized as State law. The other public health districts exist in 32 Champaign-Urbana, East St. Louis, and Berwyn. I would just solicit your 33

1 favorable...

2 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

3 Is there further debate? Senator Demuzio.4 SENATOR DEMUZIO:

Question.

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6 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

7 He indicates that he will yield. Senator Demuzio.8 SENATOR DEMUZIO:

9 Senator Savickas, this does not relate to the county health 10 departments in rural areas...in terms of the appointment of a...of 11 an official that is...qualified as a public health administrator. 12 Is that correct?

13 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

14 Senator Savickas.

15 SENATOR SAVICKAS:

No, it doesn't interfere with any county health department...
at all. What it does...most...county health departments now operate
with appointed public health administrators providing medical
supervision by extenal sources, and this would...just...allow...for
that provision for public health districts.

21 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

22 Senator Demuzio.

23 SENATOR DEMUZIO:

One other question and that is rural boards and...the kind of...
public health districts that you're talking about, could they not
have not entered into third party payment agreements prior to this
enactment of this legislation?

28 PRESIDING OFFICE: (SENATOR BRUCE)

29 Senator Savickas.

30 SENATOR SAVICKAS:

31 I can't...I didn't hear it.

32 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

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Would you repeat the question, please? Let's have some order.

Senator Demuzio. •

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SENATOR DEMUZIO:

Couldn't the public health districts have entered into contracts with third party payers in... in the past?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Senator Savickas.

7 SENATOR SAVICKAS:

8 Well, I'll read from my memo on it. It says currently the public 9 health boards are not able to collect payments from third party 10 payers. This includes payments from the Department of Public Aid 11 for medicheck services, funding for these services is on a cost 12 reimbursement basis according to a fee schedule which physicans, 13 hospitals or other health facilities provide normal charge...normally 14 charge the individual patient. So, they would be unable currently ... 15 to collect payments from third party payers.

16 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE) Senator Demuzio.

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18 SENATOR DEMUZIO:

19 Well, apparently, it...it...it really doesn't affect the rural 20 health departments. Apparently, it only affects the public health 21 districts that you stipulated, and apparently, there are only four, 22 and therefore, I'll support the bill.

23 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

24 Is there further debate? The question is shall House Bill 692 25 pass? Those in favor vote Aye. Those opposed vote Nay. The voting 26 is open. Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question, 27 the Ayes are 57, the Nays are none, none Voting Present. House Bill 28 692 having received the constitutional majority is declared passed. Is 29 there leave to go to the order of Senate Bill 2nd reading. Leave 30 is granted. House...Senate Bill 554, Senator Rock. Well, perhaps 31 we can come back. This is an extraordinary order of business. Senate 32 Bill 555, Senator Don Moore. Read the bill. For what purpose does 33 Senator Davidson arise?

SENATOR DAVIDSON: ۱. Since you just reverted that, I have a proposed amendment to 2 555 which I'd like to present to the sponsor and to the Secretary 3 before you get it moved. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE) 5 It is on the order of 2nd reading. The Secretary will read 6 the bill a second time. 7 SECRETARY: 8 Senate Bill 555. Q (Secretary reads title of bill) 10 2nd reading of the bill. The Department... I mean... the Committee on 11 Appropriations offers one amendment. 12 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE) 13 Senator Moore. 14 SENATOR MOORE: 15 Yes, I'll yield to the Chairman of the Appropriations Committee 16 on Amendment No. 1, Senator Hynes. 17 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE) 18 Senator Hynes. 19 SENATOR HYNES: 20 Amendment No. 1 reduces the appropriation by ... for operational 21 purposes by eight million eight hundred twenty-three thousand three 22 hundred fourteen dollars. The affect of the amendment is to remove 23 all new positions requested by the Department some five hundred. I 24 would move the adoption of the amendment. 25 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE) 26 Senator Hynes moves the adoption of Amendment No. 1 to House Bill ... 27 Senat," Bill 555. Is there discussion? Senator Wooten. 28 SENATOR WOOTEN: 29 Mr. President, I just want to be sure I...it removes all new 30 positions what ... what kind of positions are they? 31 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE) 32 Senator Hynes. 33

1 SENATOR HYNES:

2 All of the new positions requested by the Department.3 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

4 Senator Wooten.

5 SENATOR WOOTEN:

6 That includes case workers of which we are dramatically short in 7 our area?

8 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

9 Senator Hynes.

10 SENATOR HYNES:

11 That includes all new positions requested by the Department. The 12 Department currently has approximately ten thousand employees. This 13 amendment would amount to a 6.2 percent cut in its operational budget 14 which is within the guidelines or close to the guidelines...the 15 Governor has requested, although this amendment was adopted prior to 16 any such announcement. The Department also has substantial flexibility 17 in its existing organization which would permit it to shift personnel 18 as the need would arise and it is our judgement, the unanimous judge-19 ment of the committee, that this amendment is going to result in a 20 savings to the taxpayers and will not in any way impair the efficiency 21 of the operations of the Department of Public Aid.

22 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

23 Senator Wooten.

24 SENATOR WOOTEN:

25 Well, the efficiency is already dramatically impaired, there 26 simply aren't enough people to...to do the kind of investigative 27 work...the big...the big problem of public aid is should we just give / eople money or should we have people involved with trying to 28 solve problems. I...I don't know...it...as I look at the section in 29 our area, we're too short of competent people to make real judgements. 30 31 We're just throwing the money away. I don't know how you solve that, 32 but it seems to me that one of the things we needed were more people, and that to just say we eliminate all new request, I'm not sure that's 33

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very prudent approach to take.

2 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

3 Is there further discussion of Amendment No. 1? Senator Hynes
4 moves the adoption of Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 555. All in
5 favor say Aye. All opposed. The amendment is adopted. Any further
6 amendments?

7 SECRETARY:

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Amendment No. 2 offered by Senator Davidson.

9 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

10 Senator Davidson.

11 SENATOR DAVIDSON:

Mr. President, this is a Floor amendment, not a committee amend-12 ment, and the reason behind this, this amendment reduces the general 13 systems budget in this Senate Bill by twenty-five million three hundred 14 eighty-four thousand one hundred dollars, and the reasoning behind this 15 amendment...amendment is this, the budget as proposed for this coming 16 17 fiscal year is based on a spending level of 15.7 million per month for general assistance. Their first four months of this Calendar year 18 19 shows a spending level of 13 million plus. We got better than a 2 million that they've budgeted in and what they have 20 more per month been spending in the first four months of when employment was supposed 21 to be at the highest and therefore, this twenty-five million is un-22 necessary at this time, and if later in the year, something would 23 happen that we would have to address ourselves, fine, but by one 24 stroke of the pen by adopting this amendment, gentlemen, we can give 25 26 the Governor one sixteenth of this three hundred million dollar reduction in his proposed budget by adopting this amendment. Now the 27 general assistance program should go down, because based on the re-28 determination of eligibility which they are just starting on, on 29 30 general assistance if it has any relation to what they found on the ADC which was fifteen percent or more ineligible and now have it re-31 duced to ten, this reduction might not even be enough. It could be 32 even additional moneys found if they do the reevaluation and take the 33

people off general assistance. Now, everybody I talked to out in the public, they're upset about the people on general assistance who are ineligible receiveing money, and this will certainly goad the Department to adjust theirselves to reevaluation of the eligibility, and I urge the adoption of the amendment which will reduce the budget by twenty-five million three hundred and eighty-four thousand one hundred. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

8 Senator Davidson has moved the adoption of the amendment. Is
9 there discussion? I have on my list Senator Demuzio, Senator Kenneth
10 Hall, Senator Moore, Senator Hynes, Senator Netsch. Senator Demuzio.
11 SENATOR DEMUZIO:

Well, Mr. President, this amendment is...is such that...such importance that I think that every member of the Senate ought to have a copy of it and I think that I would have...five people on...at least on this side of the aisle that would request a copy of this amendment because it is a major proportion.

17 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

18 Senator Demuzio has requested the amendment be printed and 19 distributed. Is he joined...Senator Demuzio.

20 SENATOR DEMUZIO:

21 Well, I withdraw my request.

22 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

23 Senator Kenneth Hall. Senator Morris.

24 SENATOR MORRIS:

25 I...I just would like to ask the sponsor one question.26 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

27 Indicates that he will yield. Senator Morris.

28 SENATOR MORRIS:

I read in the newspapers over the weekend that there has been
a court ruling that says that people will have the option of taking
public aid or unemployment compensation. I also read that according
to those figures there may be as much as one hundred dollars a month more

available to a family under public aid than under unemployment and I want to ask the sponsor if he has taken this into consideration at all in preparation of this amendment because I understand we won't be back here after this next two weeks until sometime in October and I'd like to know if he's considered this possibility.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Senator Davidson.

8 SENATOR DAVIDSON:

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9 Well, in response to Senator Morris' question, I'm reducing a general assistance, not the ADC and the court ruling had to do with aid to dependent children not with general assistance and they even ...with what you say, I would be in error on the court ruling and I don't believe I am. We'll be back here in October or November and you certainly have more than enough money to run this Department until we're back here in the winter.

16 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Senator Morris. Senator Hynes.

18 SENATOR HYNES:

Mr. President, would the sponsor yield to a question?PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Indicates that he will yield.

22 SENATOR HYNES:

Have you discussed, Senator Davidson, this amendment with theDepartment of Public Aid?

25 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

26 Senator Davidson.

27 SENATOR HYNES:

28 '...and if so what response did they give you?29 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

30 Senator Davidson.

31 SENATOR DAVIDSON:

No, I haven't discussed this with the Department of Public Aid
because the information was only given to me by our staff this morning

that they were budgeting two million plus more per month than what 1 they were spending and this gave me an opportunity to prepare this 2 3 amendment to remove the twenty-five million dollars and if they're spending more...if they're asking for two million more per month than 4 what they're spending, the Department of Public Aid should be in favor 5 of this if they want to help get this three hundred million dollar б reduction in his budget. 7 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE) 8 Gentlemen, can we have some order? Senator Harber Hall, Senator 9 Schaffer, the group behind Senator Davidson, we're having a lot of 10 conferences on going on the Floor. Senator Hynes. 11 SENATOR HYNES: 12 Have you...have you discussed it with the Chairman of the 13 14 Legislative Advisory Commission? PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE) 15 Senator Davidson. 16 SENATOR DAVIDSON: 17 Went back and they gave it to him and he hasn't taken a position 18 yes or no and you'll have to ... you'll have to ask the Chairman of the 19 Legislative Advisory Committee his position. I don't know. 20 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE) 21 Senator Hynes. 22 SENATOR HYNES: 23 With leave, I would like to ask Senator Moore, who is also the 24 sponsor of the bill, what his position on this amendment is and what 25 26 their analysis indicates as to its merits. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE) 27 That is an extraordinary procedure. Is leave granted? Leave is 28 granted. Senator Hynes. 29 . SENATOR HYNES: 30 That is the question. I simply would like to know the position 31 of the Commission. 32 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE) 33

Senator Moore, Don Moore. SENATOR DON MOORE:

1

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Well, I haven't discussed this with the members of the Legislative 3 4 Advisory Committee on Public Aid, Senator Hynes. However, I...I do feel that...with...particularly with the general assistance, we are 5 6 gaining more and more general assistance units that are being subsidized by the State of Illinois because of the economy as it exists 7 8 today. We in the suburban Cook County and collar county areas, you q will see some of our townships that are going to have to be calling upon the State when their funds are exhausted after the...after they use 10 up their one mil levy which they're required to levy in order to 11 qualify for State funds. I think that the question of coming back with 12 a possible deficiency in October, we're having a hard enough time as 13 14 it is getting deficiencies through. I predict that there will be a deficiency to Senate Bill 555 before the end of this fiscal year. I 15 think that the Department in their computations anticipated a eight 16 17 percent unemployment rate throughout the entire fiscal year. They, based upon going in on a two hundred and five thousand case load, in 18 19 the ADC for example, we're now about two hundred and twenty thousand 20 case load. I hate to disagree with my colleague, Senator Davidson, but I do feel that...to take a slash of twenty-five million in the general 21 assistance would be ill-conceived at this particular time. 22

And further-18 more, either we are going to close down the Soldier's and Sailor's Home 19 or we're going to fund it properly, Senator Weaver. This is essential 20 to those people. They can't...they don't have enough people to cut 21 the grass, and I was urged to defeat of this motion to Table...I 22 would urge the... the adoption of the motion to Table the Amendment... 23 24 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

25 Senator Knuppel.

26 SENATOR EGAN:

27 ...so that we can add the proper amendment later.

Thank you, Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. 10 Amendment No. 12, Mr. Secretary, reads amend Amendment No. 2 to Senate 11 Bill 635 on line 9 by deleting and then there are certain deletions. 12 The sum and substance of this amendment is a net addition dollar wise 13 of sixty-four thousand dollars. There are some ... transfer between line 14 items and what we come up with is...a line item called services to 15 unmarried mothers in the amount of six hundred and fifteen thousand 16 dollars. There was no objection. This was at the request of the de-17 partment, and I would move the adoption of Amendment No. 12. 18 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE) 19

Senator Rock moves the adoption of...No. 12. Is there discussion?
All in favor say Aye. All opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. The amendment is adopted. Any...Amendment No. 13.

23 SENATOR ROCK:

Well, my 13 is going to be or my 14, I guess it would be your 13, it 24 would be amend Amendment No. 2 to Senate Bill 635 on page 1 line 5. Is 25 that correct? Is that the one we're talking about? By deleting eight-26 een million and inserting in lieu thereof twenty-three million. This 27 is the increase for foster care. Is that correct, in the amount of five 28 million dollars? It would...it had come to the attention...I think 29 this amendment is also agreed; it had come to the...the attention to 30 certain members of the committee, and frankly, last year with Senator 31 Schaffer and Knuepfer, that the foster parents of our State were being 32 short...shortchanged in...in...inasmuch as they were required to...pay 33

out-of-pocket for foster care. This...this amendment adds five
 million dollars and attempts to remedy that. I would move the
 adoption of Amendment No. 13.

4 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Senator Rock moves the adoption of Amendment No. 13. All in
favor say Aye. All...opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. The amendment
is adopted. Amendment No. 14, Senator Rock.

8 SENATOR ROCK:

9 Amendment No. 14, I believe, was that offered by Senator Shapiro, if I am not mistaken. That would read, Mr. Secretary, amend Senate Bill 10 635 on page 1 line 13 by deleting two million nine and inserting in lieu 11 thereof two million seven. Is that correct? This is No. 14. Amend-12 ment No. 14 reflects a five percent cut in the department's central 13 administrative budget. This was offered on Wednesday afternoon prior 14 to the Governor's budget address. The department cannot, at this point, 15 have ... have any objection. I would move the adoption of Amendment 16 No. 14. 17

18 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

19 Senator Rock moves the adoption of Amendment No. 14. All in
20 favor say Aye. All opposed Nay. The amendment...the Ayes have it.
21 The amendment is adopted. Amendment No. 15.

22 SECRETARY:

23 Amendment No. 15 offered by Senator Egan.

24 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Is Senator Egan on the Floor? Amendment No. 15, Senator Egan,
 under consideration.

27 SENATOR EGAN:

Yes, thank you, Mr. President and members of the Senate. We just spoke at length about what this amendment does and let me just clarify it even further. The...the...exactly how many new positions...these are the vacant positions, I...I can't tell you at this moment. But what this amendment will do will cut back from the request the total number of five jobs that we felt were not necessary. Now, those jobs

that we feel are necessary are not only necessary, they're essential to the completion of the work that is necessary just to keep that Soldier's and Sailor's Home going. They are more professional nursing cares that are...nursing care necessary because the increase and the years that these people are...

6 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

7 Excuse me, Senator Egan. We seem to be...it we could break up
8 a lot of the conferences that are occurring on the Floor? We seem to
9 have a lot of activity to the left of the Chair. Senator Egan.
10 SENATOR EGAN:

Yes, that...that Home has been there since the Spanish American War, and...at that time, people didn't live until they were ninetyfive and a hundred years old. As a result, we have had a lot more work to do there. Now, either we're going to close down the... Soldier's and Sailor's Home or we are going to fund it properly so they can keep it operating, and I would urge the adoption of Amendment No. 15.

18 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

19 Senator Egan moves the adoption of Amendment No. 15. All in 20 favor say Aye. All opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. The amendment is 21 adopted. Amendment No. 16. Any further amendments? Senator Weaver. 22 SENATOR WEAVER:

I'm asking that one be drafted. Senator Rock, would you be willingto bring it back tomorrow? Thank you.

25 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

26 He indicates he will. Senator Rock, did you seek recognition?27 Senator Rock.

28 SENATOR ROCK:

Well, Senator...Senator Graham had indicated that he might have a proposed amendment, I will agree at this time formally to have it moved with the understanding that it can be called back and will be called back.

33 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

For what purpose does Senator Morris arise? Oh...on...on 635...
 any further amendments? Third reading. Senator Morris.
 SENATOR MORRIS:

4 On Senate Bill 635, I can recall the last bill that Senator Rock 5 added several amendments to, we were able to get it consolidated into 6 a more readable form. I wonder if it would possible that we have this 7 in a more readable form prior to the time we vote on it on third 8 reading. From what it says in the Calendar and what the bill now 9 apparently does is a great amount of difference, and I'd like to be 10 able to see what I am voting on in detail.

11 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

12 The correct amount will be shown on tomorrow's Calendar. The 13 bill could go to Enrolling and Engrossing, but it would require 14 additional printing. ...If that is your request, we can request the 15 Secretary that it be sent to Enrolling and Engrossing and be sent to 16 us in its enrolled and engrossed form. Senator Partee. 17 SENATOR PARTEE:

18 Well now, I understand what the gentleman said, but now this is 19 a precedent which if you start is going to...just going to cause a lot 20 of confusion when we get right near the end. Suppose somebody has that 21 same request two days before we are to get out here and you don't get the bill back and then you have and obligation to do the same thing. 22 23 What I plan to do is to get a copy of all the amendments together, look at 24 them, and look at them with the bill, and then I will have a judgement 25 as to what the bill contains, and I think anybody else who wants to can 26 do that. But for us to take the bill and to print it again with all 27 these new amendments, I think is...an expense that we can avoid. 28 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

29 Perhpas when you get that...that copy prepared, a copy could be 30 transmitted to Senator Morris, that way we would both have...Senator 31 Rock.

32 SENATOR ROCK:

33

Well, I think once the fifteen amendments are gone over by anyone

of the members and the staff certainly has gone over them as have I and the department, I think the net dollar change from the hundred and thirteen million as introduced is less than four million dollars. There were a lot of breakouts into line items where...where the bill as introduced merely contained the lump sums. I don't think the dollar amount is that...varies that greatly. Sure...I'd be...you know...no problem.

8 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

9 All amendments, the Secretary tells me, increases it by four million
10 four hundred and ten thousand dollars. For what purpose does Senator
11 Sommer arise?

12 SENATOR SOMMER:

Mr. President and members, as a matter of personal priviledge.
I'd like to call to the attention of the members the presence of our
former colleague, Senator Ed Scholl, a good friend of ours and a former
colleague.

17 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

18 Is recognized and always welcome in the Senate. Senate Bills on 19 3rd reading. Senate Bill 347, Senator Hynes. Senator Harber Hall 20 for what purpose do you arise?

21 SENATOR HARBER HALL:

Mr. President and fellow Senators, in the south...gallery immediately to my rear, there is quite a gathering of young people who are exchange students from the Country of Germany, the City of Rhinehausen. I would like to have you see them and they see you as they watch our legislative process in the State Senate. Would you please stand,

27 folks, from Germany?

28 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

We would ask that they stand and be recognized by the StateSenate.

31 SENATOR HARBER HALL:

32 The leader comes from Senator Merritt's district, and we are 33 certainly glad to have her bring them down here to see our process. 34 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Senate Bill 347, Senator Hynes. Senator Hynes.
 SENATOR HYNES:

3 I would ask leave, Mr. President, to bring it back to the order4 of 2nd reading for the purpose of an amendment.

5 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

6 Is...is leave granted? Leave is granted. 2nd reading.7 SENATOR HYNES:

Before the amendment is offered if I may explain, we adopted 8 Amendment No. 2 which restored part of the personal services money 9 reduced. I proposed to Table that ... reconsider the vote and Table 10 that amendment and offer Amendment No. 3 which would restore an 11 12 additional twenty-three thousand dollars. This will fund for the full year two positions that are already on board at the...the agency and 13 14 have been there for two years. There are only seven employees in this agency total, so I would move to reconsider the vote by which Amendment 15 No. 2 was adopted to Senate Bill 347. 16

17 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Senator Hynes moves to reconsider the vote by which Amendment No. 2 was adopted. All in favor say Aye. All opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. The amendment is...the vote by which the amendment was adopted is reconsidered. Now, Senator Hynes moves to Table Amendment No. 2. All in favor say Aye. All opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. The amendment is Tabled. Amendment No. 3, Senator Hynes. SENATOR HYNES:

This amendment, as I indicated, would restore the funds for the
full year for those two positions. I would move its adoption.
PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Senator Rock moves the adoption of Amendment No. 3. All in favor
say Aye. All opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. The amendment is adopted.
Any further amendments? 3rd reading. Senate Bill 477. Senator Hynes,

33 SENATOR EGAN:

16	This amendment would remove an additional four hundred fifty
17	thousand dollars from the appropriation bill. It would eliminate the
18	line item for purchase of telephone systems out of general revenue fund
19	money. In view of the financial pinch that the State is now feeling, it
20	isit is our judgement that this item is not sufficiently substantial
21	and important enough in nature to remain in the budget, and I, therefore,
22	move the adoption of Amendment No. 18.
23	PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)
24	SenatorHynes moves the adoption of Amendment No. 18. All in
25	favor say Aye. All opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. The amendment is
26	adopted. Any further amendments?
27	SECRETARY:
28	mendment No. 19 offered by Senator Howard Mohrby Senator
29	Weaver I'm told now.
30	PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENTOR BRUCE)
31	Senator Weaver.
32	SENATOR WEAVER:
33	Thank you, Mr. President. This amendment would remove some of the

new people in this budget, a total reduction of three hundred and 1. 2. eighteen thousand eight hundred and ninety dollars. If there is any question on all ... on any of them, I can break it out into various 3. categories. Real estate division, five new stationary engineers in FY '76, 4. one radio communication consultant, one switchboard operator, and down 5. in EDP, the Department requested a hundred and forty-six thousand, eight 6. hundred for ten new people in FY '76. The amendment has already been 7. 8. adopted and reduces this request by fifty-seven thousand. This takes out the remaining new people, a hundred thousand seven hundred and fifty-9. five dollars. In OSA the General Service request a million ... thirty-10. two thousand eight hundred. 19. ... of Amendment No. 19 to Senate Bill 477. Is there discussion?20. Senator Egan.

21. SENATOR EGAN:

Yes, Mr. President and members of the Senate. Let me say, Senator 22. Weaver, that I fully respect your attempt here and ... I just hink, how-23. ever, that you're just slightly misdirected. We have already cut from 24. this budget four hundred thousand dollars of old jobs, and ... it brings 25. ... this amendment would bring this budget far below the fiscal year '75 26. appropriation. And I'll tell you, not all these jobs are new. You... 27. you are cutting out of the budget, for example, a nurse's job in the State 28. of Illinois in Chicago. Now, that nurse, ... heretofore, has been paid 29. from another department. I believe Public Health. So, you are going to 30. eliminate that job when it is not really new, it is only a new transfer. 31. Now, we're talking about cuts over the entire budget so that 32.

1 we can accommodate the Governor in his request but that is not to say that we must do it indiscriminately and I would think unreasonably. 2 3 Also, as you know, the new State Office Building has to be manned in 4 East St. Louis and if we don't offer enough help to keep that build-5 ing going the building is liable to collapse. You've got a few new jobs in the Architect's Department that...are an absolute necessity 6 when they transfer back from the Capital Development Fund...Department. 7 8 And so I would say, Senator Weaver, that...your attempt here to cut below the two million dollars that we have already cut, and pared, and squeezed 9 is totally rejectionable by myself and I hope my colleagues and I 10 11 would urge that the motion to adopt this amendment is defeated because 12 it's really a grandstand.

13 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

14 Senator Hynes.

15 SENATOR HYNES:

16 I would join Senator Egan in opposition to this amendment. I will 17 say that the last portion of the amendment, frankly, I...I know where it comes from. It...it basically arises out of the testimony we had on 18 the Capital Development Board Appropriation in committee the other day. 19 There might be some merit in that part, but it was our judgement, at this 20 21 late date in the Session, this is a Senate Bill and it has to be moved out of here. But the...the entire amendment, we simply cannot accept, 22 23 and there will be an opportunity subsequently in the House if...if adjust-24 ments are necessary on that one item. At a person's residence 19 when no one receives any payment for providing the place for the card 20 game or the second reason on the premise of any bona fide and nonprofit 21 labor, veterans, fraternal, or other organizations having membership 22 dues when neither such organization nor any person receives any pay-23 ment for providing the place for the card game, and the reason and the 24 theory behind Representative Giorgi's Bill is that too much time seems 25 26 to be devoted in...attacking the card game that is played at home by participants that are not gambling in any form, but enjoying cards for 27 their own enjoyable use. We have read, we have seen on television where 28 police have broken in homes, raided apartments to find half a dozen 29 senior citizens, elderly gentlemen just playing cards spending their 30 leisurely hours. I think when the State has entered and to legalize 31 gambling in the form of lotteries and the form of all of our present... 32 horse racing that we can support ... card playing at home between 33

27 Senator Fawell.

28 SENATOR FAWELL:

29 The...I...I agree with much of what you say, Senator Savickas.
30 I...I think the important thing that all of us should bear in mind
31 though is that what we are doing here is making it legal for gambling
32 ...that...that otherwords a poker game can be played for

high stakes or low stakes as long as the...the...the veterans 1 organization that has the hall isn't charging money for that particular 2 game and there is no exception here...minors can be involved in the ٦ high stakes poker game as I read it. And as much as I...as much as I 4 agree with you as a practical matter, I suppose there is nobody in this 5 room that hasn't played a poker game for some stakes and been technically 6 guilty of...of violating the law. I...I don't think that this is a 7 very wise step for ... for us to take, and I would rise in oppostion to 8 the bill. 9

Can we have some order? Will the members please be in their 11 seats? Senator Schaffer. 12

9 I'm trying to get a copy of the bill but isn't the way a lot of

13 SENATOR SAVICKAS:

I think that doubt is certainly not in my mind and certainly not 14 in those of us and those senior citizens who are now subject to arrest 15 for playing pinochle out on a park bench, those people that enjoy a 16 friendly game of cards, not for anything of value, there's certainly 17 no doubt in our minds. Of course, anytime you have lawyers that are 18 questioning any bill, there's going to be doubt, and any two lawyers 19 will cause...causes a doubt, so I would ask for a favorable roll call. 20 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK) 21

22 Senator Soper.

23 SENATOR SOPER:

Well, Mr. President and Sentor Savickas. 24 You know, Frank, I have got the bill before me, and you say that when they play cards 25 there's no...nothing of value, but that's...only means there isn't 26 a house man that's taking a clip out of the game, that's what you're 27 talking about. You are... the only thing wrong with... with this bill 28 and...I'd say is this that when you...when you allow a game like this in 29 the veterans or...any other place, the fellow that comes home and he 30 has a paycheck and he goes out there, and he gets in one of these games, 31 and he loses his money, yeah, he doesn't double it,...he loses a 32 paycheck, the wife has no place to complain. And you'll find that you're 33

doing a great disservice with this. It is alright to say you are 3 playing pinochle and so forth and I played a lot of pinochle 2 in my time, but there are certain...people that can't...can't afford 3 to lose this money and a wife complains and if she calls the veterans, 4 if she calls the...the Elks Club or so forth and says John goes out 5 there and he plays with a bunch of the boys and he hasn't brought his 6 paycheck home for about three weeks. They go over and they tell him 7 John is out of the games, and John gets out of the game but they still 8 keep on playing. Now, if you are going to make it impossible for the 9 10 wife to complain, what you are going to do is take one of the safeguards away from...from people who should have the right to complain 11 12 about these things and I'm not a ... I'm not a reformer or anything else, I know how these things work, but at least give a wife a chance to 13 14 save some of the money for the kids without putting them on relief. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK) 15

16 Senator...

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17 SENATOR SOPER:

18 The losers always say deal the cards and the winners tell jokes.19 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

20 Senator Course.

21 SENATOR COURSE:

22 Senator Soper what is this game, so forth? I've never heard of that 23 of that nor have I ever played it. Would you explain that to the 24 membership?

25 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

26 Senator Soper.

27 SENATOR SOPER:

That's...that's a game that when you get into the game and the fellow deals five cards, he says I've got a so far, see, and then he collects the money, and then when you have the same hand, he says that doesn't go this time, it's gone so far enough.

SENATOR COURSE:

7 SENATOR MORRIS:

Thank you. I was under the impression that...that this bill 8 would...would limit card playing to one's homes and to the veterans 9 organizations and that, but I... I have to request what ... what is a, 10 11 you know, not for profit labor, veterans fraternal or other organiza-12 tion? Now, what is an other organization? Does that mean that if two or three of us form a non-for-profit organization and call it the 13 Good Guys Card Club, we can now have card games played there and we can 14 charge a five hundred dollar year membership, Senator Savikas? 15 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK) 16

17 Senator Savickas.

18 SENATOR SAVICKAS:

No, Senator Morris, it's not for some personal gain. It's for 19 20 other...other memberships, could mean senior citiznes clubs...mens 21 clubs, womens clubs, church groupings. These are the non-for-profit. 22 Maybe a pinochle club...where our senior citizens play. This is what we're talking about. You are going to have to remember that this does 23 not change the definition of gambling. All this says that if you play 24 25 cards for non-for-profit with no money passing hands, nothing of value exchanging hands between the players or between the...the owner of the 26 27 building in which you are, that this is not gambling. I can't understand...I...I would just call for a roll call. Let's vote it up or 28 down. 29

30 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK)

31 Senator Morris.

32 SENATOR MORRIS:

Are...are we supposed to be naive enough to believe that people
are going to actually get together and play cards without any kind of an

exchange, they're just going to have a little fun, and ... and play the card 1 with no prizes, or no gifts, or no money on the table? I mean we 2 may play for chips or matchbooks, but I can't believe that people are 3 actually going to gather together to play cards, and nongambling, 4 since there can be no real exchange even though this is an amendment 5 to the gambling section of the Criminal Code, and then we're going to б say, in nauiveway, well, they're just going to do it for fun folks, 7 it's just...it's just going to be a good time. I think what we're 8 trying to do here is create gambling clubs so that we can run them 9 in the back room, and when...when the police officer comes in the 10 money will go off the table, but other than that, they're going to 11 be playing for money, and I think that, you know, we ought ... we ought 12 to call it what it is. If we are going to legalize gambling, let's 13 legalize gambling; let's not pretend. 14 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK) 15 Any further disucssion? Senator Demuzio. You have ... 16 .17 SENATOR MORRIS: I have on question to ask ... 18 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK) 19 Second time only after ... 20 SENATOR MORRIS: 21 ... one question to ask of the sponsor. 22 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK) 23 ... after all others have spoken, Senator. Senator Demuzio. 24 SENATOR DEMUZIO: 25 Will the sponsor yield for one question? 26 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ROCK) 27 Indicates he will yield. Senator Savickas, if you contend 7 that these games are going to go on without any money or anything of 8 value changing hands, then why is it necessary to amend the gambling 9 sections of the Criminal Code? You wouldn't have to do that unless 10 you intended to have gambling involved in it.

5 SENATOR MCCARTHY:

Mr. President, I don't want to give this speech, you know, over 6 and over and over, but we're here in the last two weeks of the 7 Session, a lot of these bills are going to come through, and here 8 the public waterworks have been able to get along, apparently, issuing 9 a maximum of 6% which roughly is the equivalent of an interest rate 10 that I'd have to pay at 12% for a private borrowing or a private in-11 vestment to make it coefficient. This cost of the money to the water-12 works will be reflected in the price that the water is sold to the 13 people, and if you raise the cost of money by a third, it's axiomatic 14 that when the rates on the water go up to the consumers by a third, the 15 cost of the money will be the prime, and that's funny when we're talking 16 about water, the prime reason because I remember one time someone was 17 asked to define what prime was, and he said "prime means to pour into 18 a pump to make the sucker swell so it will draw more water". I think 19 that's appropriate many times when we talk about prime and also the 20 prime rates. But I oppose this bill, or at least call it to the attention 21 of the Body to know what we're doing here, because not only does the 22 cost of the money go up by a third, the purposes for which it expended 23 are this, they say that these bonds can be issued to pay for the 24 improvement or extension of the waterworks, from time to time, including 25 engineering and all other expenses for a forty year period of time. Secondly, there was an amendment by Senator Carroll that 33: excluded from the definition of open spaces those pieces of property

that are used primarily as a residence so that under this...the pro-- 2 visions of this bill if, in fact, the...land owner owns 10 or more 3 acres and used it for his residence, it could not be included in this 4 ...ultimate...evaluation process. The third amendment was offered by 5 Senator Fawell, with the respect, to the rollback provision, and the 6 fourth amendment was just put on by Senator Nimrod, which again further 7 circumscribed the definition of the open space land. I think the 8 bill, as amended, in good shape. I am anxious to get it back to the 9 House for Representative Daniel's concurrence, and I would seek a 10 favorable roll call.

11 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

12 Is there further debate? Senator Morris.

13 SENATOR MORRIS:

14 Senator Rock, would you yield to a question?

15 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Indicates that he will yield.

I don't have any problems at all with this bill, except one. In 18 19 fact, I support the conceptof open space, but in line 25 through 26 on the first page, you say included in this definition of open space 20 should be public and private golf courses. My question is, why are 21 private golf courses included? I understand that a private golf course 22 23 is a...either profit or nonprofit corporation, but they do exclude certain numbers of people, and I think that if they are going to choose 24 25 to be a private entity and to keep people off of their property and 26 only to use themselves as an exclusive place for people to go, why whould we give them a tax break? 27

28 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

29 Senator Rock.

30 SENATOR ROCK:

Well, the question is, the alternate evaluation of what is open
space. There is no question that a golf course is, in fact, open space,
and as long as it is so used and not used for development purposes,
it should be subject, we feel, to consideration by the assessor to

assess it at its current use as open land, not its potential use as
 development property.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Senator Morris.

5 SENATOR MORRIS:

6 Does this mean if a developer purchases a piece...purchases a 7 piece of land and sits on it for 10 years, you want to give him the 8 same exemption?

9 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

10 Senator Rock.

11 SENATOR ROCK:

No Sir, you didn't read the bill. It says when it is "used actually and exclusively for" under Senator Nimrod. So if I bought a golf course, for instance, and sat on it and did not use it for that purpose, it would not be...I could not file this...I could not file the application or would the assessor, I am sure, grant me that...is the electrician off the phone?

18 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

19 Senator Rock.

20 SENATOR ROCK:

I stopped thinking there for a moment the power went off. No... 21 I think that... the point is, that if, in fact, it's used for the pur-22 pose it is intended to be used for ... it's just exactly the opposite of 23 what your contention is. That is as long as it is used for...for the... 24 purposed stated under the definition of open spaces, we are saying that 25 upon filing the proper application, the assessor, can in fact, take 26 that open space use into account; it parallels those provisions that 27 allow for open space for agriculture purposes. 28

29 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

30 Senator Morris.

31 SENATOR MORRIS:

32 I'll probably support the bill, but my real concern is why we 33 should give a private Club any kind of a tax break. I don't know about 34 other areas of the State, but in my area there are private clubs,

many of them which have golf courses attached to them, which are used 1 to keep certain groups of our society out of those clubs. 2 I think that those people should not be given a tax break that they are going 3 to be given. I think that the overriding factor here is the need to 4 preserve open space, and I salute that idea, but I really wonder why 5 we in government are going to continue to give private, exclusive, little 6 clubs their way to keep certain people out. I think it is about time 7 that we tell groups that they can't have it that way. I think we 8 give them liquor licenses, and we give them tax breaks to keep people 9 out and I think one of these days, we're going to have to face a day 10 of a reckoning on something like this. The bill has a lot of merit, 11 except for those three words, and I'm going to have to ponder that 12 13 before I vote on it.

14 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

15 Senator Latherow.

16 SENATOR LATHEROW:

17 Thank you, Mr....Mr. President. I certainly wasn't objecting to
18 the bill earlier, and...and I don't look upon this as a tax break
19 bill after I looked at it.

20 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

21 Senator Schaffer.

22 SENATOR SCHAFFER:

Well, I rise in support of this bill. There's only one think 23 24 wrong with this bill, it doesn't go far enough. As far as I am concerned, anytime we can encourage anybody, be it a private club, 25 a golf course, or the guy who just has a lot alongside of this house, 26 to not build on it, to keep the trees on it, to keep it green, we're 27 promoting our whole way of life. I'm sorry that...that one amend-28 ment went on... the exempting or deleting the reference to the land 29 around someone's home because I don't really care whether it is an 30 individual or private club or a corporation or a church or who cares what, 31 if they'll keep that land open, I think that it is a plus for the 32 whole community, be it the lot alongside the house or fifty acres in-33

volved in...a golf course. I hope Representative Daniels will not concur with that amendment and we can knock it off, because I think that it is very important that we preserve all or as much vacant land and open space as we can and I hope this bill will get a large favorable roll call.

6 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

7 Senator Netsch. Senator Berning.8 SENATOR BERNING:

9 I would just like to make an observation relative, not only to 10 this bill but to other types of exemptions that we have provided. 11 It occurs to me that we are consistently eroding the tax base for the 12 support of local levels of government and the schools are probably hurt the most. It would be appropriate, in my opinion, for the 13 14 sponsor of this measure, as well as the rest of us, to be thinking 15 about payment in lieu of taxes with the State picking up the lost revenue. I know the sponsor didn't hear what I said, but I would ... I 16 17 will discuss it with him privately.

19 Is there further debate? Senator Rock may close.20 SENATOR ROCK:

We have done this for private individuals in...in the agricultural field the fact that private golf courses are included, I don't think... in anyway denigrates from the...from the basic value of the bill. I would urge a favorable vote.

Well, I agree with you Senator Lemke. It addresses itself to a 26. problem that we...that we currently have in our society today and that 27. is those persons that are laid off, and...there should be some way to 28. continue on their ... their group benefits, but I would like to mention 29. here that there is a particular problem in reference to the legislation 30. in that that the employer for the first thirty days or the first month 31. that that employee is off, that the employer, Senator Lemke, is that 32. not true, that the employer would have to stand the cost of the ... 33:

Brand with would have to pay the premium for that laid off employee? 1 2 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Senator Harris. 16

SENATOR HARRIS: . 17

Well, Mr. President, I think the members ought to be aware of the 18 prospective affect of this very important amendment to the Insurance 19 Code as it relates to group insurance coverage. Now, group insurance 20 is a limited form of coverage that provides for administrative efficien-21 cies that...and broad selection of the risks which result in the lower-22 ing of the cost of offering the coverage. The mandate that coverage 23 must continue at group rates for individuals who leave employment, 24 whether the reason for the leaving of employment is the result of the 25 employee's action or involuntary result, is not distinguished. 26 The fact is that all group policies prospectively will have this mandated 27 provision in the Illinois law that the existing group rate must be 28 continued for a period of six months, and that keeping track of in-29 dividuals, no matter where they might be located, is a requirement of 30 the carrier, will add significantly to the administrative costs of group 31 insurance. Now, the purpose for which this bill was introduced is 32 laudable and understandable. Its actual long-run affect will be to 33

increase the cost of group coverage very significantly. Further, and this gets into some technicality, but further, the fact that an employee 2 has six months after employment to make a determination whether, in fact, 3 his acceptability is questionable insofar as a change of insurability 4 might be concerned will develop an increased adverse selection prob-5 ability which in turn be calculated into increased cost. I think that б the membership ought to be mindful of those eventful results. I think 7 the purpose might be understandable, but I think its affect will be 8 to increase group coverage costs in Illinois. 9 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SEANTOR BRUCE) 10

Senator Demuzio.

SENATOR DEMUZIO: 12

To clear up a point for me, ... and employee is terminated, he 17 immediately begins to pick up the full monthly premium for that six 18 month period of time, is that correct? 19

Senator Lemke. 21

31. This is really a bill just aimed at clarifying some language and32. some definitions. It...defines more clearly that the Department of33: Conservation officers do have the power to enforce regulations on snow-

1 mobiles on State property. It also broadens the definition of areas ... 12 where a snowmobile may not operate to include the areas, in corporate highways, in otherwords, cities or villages or unincorporated...in-3 4 corporated areas that they may adopt an ordiance that allows the snowmobile to operate within fifteen feet of the road if they would 5 so choose. Right now, they are not allowed to operate in those areas 6 by our State law. This gives the municipalities some...some leeway 7 and some power in how they would decide to operate. It's a pretty 8 9 simple bill. I'll answer any questions. I'd... appreciate a favorable 10 roll call.

12 Senator Roe.

13 SENATOR ROE:

14 ...Senator Morris, does this bill give the exclusive jurisdiction
15 to the Department of Conservation...for snowmobile offenses?

Not as I understand it. It leaves it up, if you'll look in lines twelve through twenty-five on page one, it is the duty of all Conservation Police Officers and other employees of the Department designated by the Director to enforce this Act and then leaving in the old language, it includes sheriffs, deputy sheriffs, and other police officers to arrest any person, etc. etc., so it doesn't take away the authority of the others.

15 I would just urge support of this and answer to what Senator 16 Latherow has said. It's true it does give the Director that authority, 17 but in the State of Illinois we don't have a great number of game 18 wardens, so to speak. I know in the area that I'm from, we have a 19 major State Park, and there are not just the horses, so to speak, in 20 the game warden's area to do this. By enforcement, it means getting the 21 people who are using the snowmobiles to tear up the ecology off of the 22 place they shouldn't be and it is a matter of getting them, and 23 getting them shaped up and off the land. Ι 14 think if there were some further defaults made, it could jeopardize their financial situation. I say that I don't necessarily oppose it, 15 16 but it is a new concept and I think maybe you ought to think twice 17 over it.

Mr. Chairman, this bill, which was requested by the Department of 32 Public Health, deals with the so-called ambulatory surgical treatment 33

(Secretary reads title of bill)

It authorizes the department on a twenty-four hour prior 1 centers. written notice to close one of the centers when it finds that they 2 have ... finds conditions of eminent and serious menance to the public 3 health or that there has been a conviction of a violation of the 4 5 license itself. There are provisions attempting to preserve the rights of those involved, for example, the...a hearing may be requested with-6 in a specified period of time, ten days, and when requested the depart-7 ment is required to respond within another specified period of time, 8 Q at seven days so that there is a possiblility, perhaps of eight days of closing before the hearing is finally held. Once that is...once that 1.0 occurs, the hearing proceeds in due course. It does grow out of what 11 has been a major problem for the department with respect to some of 12 these treatment centers where they have found conditions which are 13 unacceptable and have not been able to get quick enough action. It is 14 intended as a public health, a safety device and is very important 15 16 in the department's estimation.

17 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

18 Is there debate? Senator Chew.19 SENATOR CHEW:

Yeah, Mr. President. Rather than to take up a lot time with the 20 21 Senate, I...I certainly couldn't understand why this is necessary. To me it's discriminatory. I would just say that it's...it's a terrible 22 bill, it should not pass out of the Senate, it shouldn't have been 23 introduced. Now, she says the Department of Health requested it. Well, 24 if we were to give every agency that make requests what they want, they 25 all would be at home, you know, enjoying their pay. So, I am going ask 26 a No vote on 780, and I... 27

2 vote Yes. Let's close them.

Well the bill has language on line 13 that I would need some 6 explanation of before I could vote on it. It says that when a...an 7 inspector, that means one inspector, can determine that the center 8 constitutes an eminent and serious menance to the health or safety. 9 I do not know what an eminent or serious menance is and there does 10 not seem to be a definition in the bill of such a condition. Now. 11 this is a...a matter where a business is to be closed on the statement 12 of one person that it contains something that's not defined. ...A 13 lot of people work in these places and just to walk in... one guy 14 walk in to close it without any definition, I think is...something that 15 bothers me. 16

17 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

18 Senator Netsch. Senator Don Moore.19 SEANTOR DON MOORE:

Yes, I can only concur with what Senator Partee said. I, for one, 20 do not want to give the Department of Public Health, or an inspector 21 or an employee of it, the sole discretion to determine what quote 22 "an eminent and serious menance to the health or safety of the patients 23 thereof" close quote is. In addition to that, I am violently opposed 24 to the revocation without a hearing. I think that this is against 25 the principles that we've tried to establish that you're still 26 innocent until you are proven guilty. There should be a provision of 27 a hefring here, and I agree with Senator Chew, this bill never should 28 have been introduced. It's a bad bill and I urge a No vote. 29 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE) 30

31 Senator Harris.

32 SENATOR HARRIS:

33

Mr. President, as we've experienced the development of legislation

this Session, one thing that continues to express itself to me is the 1 2 reaching out for regulatory power and in this case, judicial decision making authority by the Department of Public Health. I respect the 3 professionals in that department, but I'm really concerned and perhaps 4 even disturbed by what I conclude is, is somewhat insidious growth and 5 6 reaching out by that department. Here is a case in the instant legislation where administrative personnel with no requirement for 7 8 legal training to make what I perceive to be a judicial determination q without the requirement for a hearing and I just think this is a 10 dangerous precedent. The membership ought to be on notice about it, 11 and vote accordingly, which insofar as my conclusion is concerned, will 12 be to vote No.

13 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Senator Howard Mohr.

15 SENATOR HOWARD MOHR:

Well, I would... I would echo, Mr. President the views that 16 were stated by the previous speakers, and I'm...I'm appalled, as some-17 one once said in this Chamber, that people that are talking about 18 protecting the poor consumer would come in with a bill, that, in fact, 19 is not going to give the consumer any protection. I think it is a bad 20 bill anytime you are able to close a place without a hearing. 21 I just think that...that should encourage us all to vote No on this particular 22 bill. 23

24 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

25 Is there further debate? Senator Netsch may close.26 SENATOR NETSCH:

Mr. President, I would call attention to what we are talking about in the context of this bill and these are basically the abortion clinics. There have been found in several of them, which have been newly opened, particularily in the Chicago area, some conditions which are totally inconsistent with the standards that were intended to be adopted by this General Assembly when we authorized the licensing of those abortion clinics. The Department has found that it must be able, in order to

1 protect human life, to move somewhat more quickly than the existing law permits it to do. I would point out very strongly that this does 2 ٦ not do away with the requirement for a hearing. What it does do is, in effect, to compress the time period. The department must still 4 5 serve a twenty-four hour prior written notice. It must still...offer 6 an opportunity for hearing. The only thing that it is permitted to do is to impose a temporary and short-lived closing while it has a 7 8 chance to reinspect and to provide for the hearing itself. There is 9 a very significant human factor involved in this. There have been 10 conditions which are unconscionable which have been found at some of 11 these abortion clinics, and this is the department's response to attempt 12 to prevent the danger to human life that has resulted from some of 13 those poorly operated clinics. I emphasize, it does not do away with 1.4 the requirement for a hearing. It simply compresses the time schedule. 15 PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

The question is, shall House Bill 780 pass. Those in favor vote Aye. Those opposed vote Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question, the Ayes are 23, the Nays are 13, 1 Voting Present. House Bill 780 having failed to receive a constitutional majority is declared lost. House Bill 784, Senator Vadalabene.
