PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

If I might have your attention, please. We will now go with...with leave to the Order of Senate Bills 2nd Reading. We have twelve pages of Second readings that we need to get through today. And, if we will be alert, we can handle those with dispatch. And, I will just read off the first five sponsors, we'll be getting to them, Senators Jerome Joyce, Jeremiah Joyce, Lenke, Watson and Collins. And, if you will be ready, we can go right on through those. There are a couple of announcements, however. Senator Friedland, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR FRIEDLAND:

Thank you...thank you, Mr. President. The Chairman of the Senate Committee on Judiciary I has asked that I make a motion to waive the Six-Day Posting Rules so that Senate Bill 790 can be heard in that committee tomorrow at 2:00 p.m. I understand that other bills of a similar nature are going to be heard. So, that's the reason for this motion. Thank you.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

The motion is to suspend the Six-Day Posting Notice as to Senate Bill 790, so it might be heard this week in Judiciary I. Is there leave? Leave is granted. The rule is suspended. Senator Sangmeister.

SENATOR SANGMEISTER:

Thank you, Mr. President. On the same order, Senator Watson has a...Senate Bill 567 in Judiciary II Committee. He asked the day after we had posted to get that bill posted, so we would also like to suspend the rules so that that can be heard tomorrow, also. So, I am requesting that the appropriate rule be suspended, so that Senate Bill 567 can be heard in Judiciary II tomorrow.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

You've heard the motion. Is there discussion? All in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it and the motion prevails. Senator Sangmeister.

SENATOR SANGMEISTER:

Further, three Senate Bills, 803, 804 and 805 have been assigned to the Executive Committee. Those bills were supposed to have been assigned to the Revenue Committee, and at this time, I would ask that Senate Bills 803, 804 and 805 be assigned to the Revenue Committee from the Executive Committee. I have talked with Senator Netsch and it is fine with her. Senator Egan is not here, but I am quite sure that he will have no objection. They properly belong in the Revenue Committee.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

The motion is to discharge Senate Executive Committee from further consideration of Senate Bills 803, 804 and 805 and that they be re-referred to the Committee on Revenue. On the motion, discussion? All in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. The bills are discharged and re-referred. For what purpose does Senator Vadalabene arise?

SENATOR VADALABENE:

Yes, thank you, Mr. President. Senate Bill 1353 is in the Committee on Executive Appointments and Veterans' Affairs, and I would like at this time to make a motion on the Table that bill, Senate Bill 1353.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

The motion is to Table Senate Bill 1353. All in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. We can Table it right in committee. The bill is Tabled. Senator Zito.

SENATOR ZITO:

Thank you, Mr. President. I would like leave of the Body to be added as a hyphenated chief sponsor of Senate Bill 305. I do have permission of the sponsor.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Would you repeat, Senator Zito?

SENATOR ZITO:

Yes, Mr. President. I would like leave of the Body to be added as a chief sponsor of Senate Bill 305. I have permission of the sponsor. Hyphenated chief sponsor.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Okay. Is there leave? Leave is granted. Senator Lemke.

SENATOR LEMKE:

I'd like to...I talked to Senator Egan and Senator Dawson and I would like to have Senate Bill 369...it should have been assigned to Executive, I'd like to have it transferred from Public Health to Executive Committee.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Have you spoke with Senator Savickas, Senator Lemke? The motion is to discharge the Committee on Public Health, Welfare and Corrections from further consideration of Senate Bill 369 and the bill be re-referred to Senate Committee on Executive. On the motion, discussion? All in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. The bill is discharged and re-referred. Senator Vadalabene.

SENATOR VALALABENE:

Yes, thank you, Mr. President. I would like to be shown as a hyphenated sponsor on Senate Bill 29. The bill is in the property of Senator Watson, and I do have his permission.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Is there leave? Leave is granted. Senator...Senator



Demuzic.

SENATOR DEMUZIC:

Yes, thank you, Mr. President. Last week I asked and was granted leave of the Body to be a hyphenated co-sponsor of Senate Bill 1081. That bill was in error and I would like to be removed as a...as a spncsr... a co-spncsr of Senate Bill 1081, and the proper number to be hyphenated, along with Senator Macdonald, is Senate Bill 815. And, I would ask leave of the Body to be added as a co-spncsr.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

Is there leave? Leave is granted. For what purpose does Senator Rock arise?

SENATOR ROCK:

Thank you, Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. As you know, next week is the final week for committee hearings and we have a rather hefty schedule both this and next week. I would like, Mr. President, with leave of the Body to suspend the posting requirement, the Six-Day Posting Requirement, and allow our committees to post through this Friday. Now, that will not affect any posting or any bills to be heard this week, but it's for the purpose of next week, so that every member will have an opportunity to have his bill heard. So, I would move, Mr. President, that we suspending the posting requirement for the Six-Day Notice and allow all the committees to post through this Friday for next week's committee.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

Alright. The motion is to suspend the Six-Day Posting Notice and that all bills that are to be heard next week will be posted by Friday. It is not to waive the posting requirement but only the Six-Day Notice, so the committee clerks should note that the posting requirement is in effect. It is the Six-Day Notice that is being waived. On the motion, is there discussion? Those in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The

Ayes have it and the rules are suspended, and the posting requirement is waived, and bills shall be posted by Friday to be heard next week. Senator D'Arco, for what purpose to you arise?

SENATOR D'ARCO:

Thank you, Mr. President. I would move to Table Senate Bill 45.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

The motion is to Table Senate Bill 45. Discussion? Is there leave? Leave is granted. The bill is Tabled. Senator Jerome Joyce.

SENATOR JEROME JOYCE:

Yes, thank you, Mr. President. Now, if I wanted to waive the Six-Day Rule to hear two bills this week, do I still...do I have to do that? Alright. I want to waive the Six-Day Rule on Senate Bill 815 and Senate Bill 800 to be heard in Ag the 28th.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

Once again, Mr. President, Amendment No. 3 includes the provision that limits financing of qualified entities to five times the equity of the business, not...not tax say ten million dollars, and I move, again, for its adoption.

The motion is to adopt. Discussion? Those in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. Amendment No. 3 is adopted. Further committee amendments?

Yeah, merely what this amendment does is eliminates Cook County because of problems that we had with the Assessor's Office and with the Board of Appeals, and the committee came to the conclusion we ought to exclude Cook county from this bill and that's acceptable to me.

Senator Lemke.

SENATOR LEMKE:

Okay. That's...that's Amendment No. 1. I ask for the adoption of that amendment.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

The motion is to adopt Amendment No. 1. Discussion of the motion? Those in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. Amendment No. 1 is adopted. Further amendments?

Senator Marovitz to explain Committee Amendment No. 1.

SENATOR MAROVITZ:

Committee Amendment No. 1 is the amendment requested by Commonwealth Edison. It takes out the potential real estate locations, because having to notify people of potential locations of facilities down the road would jack up the cost of those real estate parcels, and also the consumers would have to pay for that. We took that out of the bill at the request of Commonwealth Edison as an agreed amendment, and I would ask for the adoption of Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 201.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

The motion is to adopt Committee...Amendment No. 1. Discussion of the motion? Those in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. Committee Amendment No. 1 is adopted. Amendment No. 2, Senator Marovitz.

SENATOR MAROVITZ:

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Thank you, Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. Committee Amendment No. 2 adds the Department of Energy and Natural Resources to those that would have to be informed of the long-term energy plans. It's an agreed amendment. I would ask for the adoption of Committee Amendment No. 2 to Senate Bill 201.

The motion is to adopt. Discussion? Those in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. Amendment No. 2 is adopted. Are there further committee amendments?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

Are there amendments from the Floor?

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. FERNANDES)

No Floor amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

3rd reading. Senate Bill 204, Senator Gec-Karis. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary, please.

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. FERNANDES)

Senate Bill 204.

- (Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Judiciary I offers one amendment.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

Senator Gec-Karis.

SENATOR GEC-KARIS:

Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate, Amendment...the committee amendment is the one that's been approved by Senator Berman, who had some questions about the bill without it. And it...what it does is says that statements may be disclosed in trials for rape, deviate sexual assault, etcetera, and where written consent has not been given when they affect the...commission of the crime of rape,

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deviate sexual assault, indecent liberties and incest, and I  
move the adoption of this amendment.

PRESILING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

The motion is to adopt Committee Amendment No. 1.  
Discussion? Those in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes  
have it. Committee Amendment No. 1 is adopted. Further  
committee amendments?

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. FERNANDES)

No further committee amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

Are there amendments from the Floor?

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. FERNANDES)

No Floor amendments.

PRESILING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

3rd reading. Senate Bill 208, Senator Fawell. Read the  
bill, Mr. Secretary, please.

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. FERNANDES)

Senate Bill 208.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Local Government  
offers one amendment.

PRESILING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

Senator Fawell to explain Committee Amendment No. 1.

SENATOR FAWELL:

The...the amendment actually is the bill. It is the...we  
left the language for Cock County exactly as it was, and we  
have made the amendment the bill and I will explain the bill  
on 3rd reading.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

The motion is to adopt Committee Amendment No. 1. Those  
in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. Committee  
Amendment No. 1 is adopted. Further committee amendments?

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. FERNANDES)

No further committee amendments.



PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Are there amendments from the Floor?

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. FERNANDES)

Amendment No. 2 offered by Senator Fawell.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Senator Fawell.

SENATOR FAWELL:

I'm sorry, I...I think I withdrew Amendment No. 1 and No. 2 is the explanation.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Right. The Secretary's had Amendment No. 2 for some time and there was a committee amendment, perhaps you wish to table the committee amendment? Was that...Senator Kelly...

SENATOR FAWELL:

I want to table...table Amendment No. 1...

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

...okay.

SENATOR FAWELL:

...and No. 2 is the one that I would like to have adopted.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Senator Kelly.

SENATOR KELLY:

Thank you, Mr. President. I would certainly go along with the lady tabling Amendment No. 1 and then having Amendment No. 2. Possibly she could briefly mention what Amendment No. 2 was that we're...that the committee adopted.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Alright. Let's...let's get back to Committee Amendment No. 2 then. The motion is to reconsider the vote by which Committee Amendment No. 1 was adopted. On the motion to reconsider, those in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. The vote is reconsidered. Senator Fawell now moves to table Committee Amendment No. 1. On the motion to table, those in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it.

Amendment No. 1 is Tabled. Before us is now Amendment No. 2 and Senator Fawell moves the adoption of Amendment No. 2. Is there discussion? Senator Kelly.

SENATOR KELLY:

Possibly, she can just briefly explain what Committee Amendment No. 2 is.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

Senator Fawell.

SENATOR FAWELL:

All that Committee Amendment No. 2 is the language...basic language of the bill. It allows the counties to have...under a million, to have police protection in the unincorporated area, with a backdoor referendum.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

Further discussion? Senator Eock.

SENATOR EOCK:

Thank you, Mr. President. Does this, in fact, as amended, will it apply to the county of Cock?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

Senator Fawell.

SENATOR FAWELL:

No, Sir, you already have that authority without the referendum.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

Further discussion? Further discussion? On the motion to adopt Amendment No. 2, those in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. Amendment No. 2 is adopted. Further amendments?

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. FERNANDES)

No further amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

3rd reading. Senate Bill 209, Senator D'Arco. Senate Bill 211, Senator Vadalabene. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary, please, and, would the people in front of Senator

Vadalabene...alright.

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. FERNANDES)

Senate Bill 211.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Insurance, Pensions and Licensed Activities offers one amendment.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

Senator Vadalabene on Committee Amendment No. 1.

SENATOR VADALABENE:

Yes,...I believe this is a Floor amendment, isn't it, not a committee amendment?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

One committee, one Floor.

SENATOR VADALABENE:

Okay, well...what I want to do is adopt Committee Amendment No. 1, and then I am going to want to Table that for the Floor amendment.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

Alright. Senator Vadalabene, the committee amendment and the Floor amendment are identical.

SENATOR VADALABENE:

No, they're not.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

They have the same IRS number. Shall we take it out of the record so you might...

SENATOR VADALABENE:

Well, you can take it out of the record, but I offered one on the Floor of the Senate and one in committee.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

...alright. We can...the...the Secretary affirms that they are identical, but we can adopt the committee amendment, and then you can withdraw the Floor amendment and see if you need it later. Or we can adopt both of them, if you wish to proceed.

SENATOR VADALABENE:

Well, let's adopt the committee amendment and get that one out of the way, because I do want to Table that one, and I can't understand why they have the same number when I did it in two different times. I don't...

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Alright, Senator Vadalabene; they are not...they are not identical, so we'll...the motion is to Table Committee Amendment No. 1. Those in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. Committee Amendment No. 1 is Tabled. Any further committee amendments?

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. FERNANDES)

No further committee amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Are there amendments from the Floor?

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. FERNANDES)

Amendment No. 2 offered by Senator Vadalabene.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Senator Vadalabene.

SENATOR VADALABENE:

Yes, thank you, Mr. President and members of the Senate. Amendment No. 2...Floor Amendment No. 2, it requires the full employees' contribution, rather than beginning with the fourth year, as provided by the committee amendment. This was agreed on in committee and they requested that I do this on the Floor of the Senate, and I move for its adoption.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

The motion is to adopt Amendment No. 2. Discussion? Those in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. Amendment No. 2 is adopted. Further Floor amendments?

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. FERNANDES)

No further amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

3rd reading. For what purpose does Senator Macdonald

seek...oh...Senate Bill 220, Senator Macdonald. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary, please.

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. FERNANDES)

Senate Bill 220.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Agriculture, Conservation and Energy offers amendment...one amendment.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

Senator Macdonald on Committee Amendment No. 1.

SENATOR MACDONALD:

Yes, Committee Amendment No. 1 was merely a technical amendment wanted by the State Comptroller, which allows him to transfer the money to the Department of Conservation. I move for its adoption.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

The motion is to adopt Committee Amendment No. 1. Discussion? Those in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. Committee Amendment No. 1 is adopted. Further committee amendments?

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. FERNANDES)

No further committee amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

Are there amendments from the floor?

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. FERNANDES)

Amendment No. 2 offered by Senator Macdonald.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

Senator Macdonald.

SENATOR MACDONALD:

There was a Committee No. 1...I mean, Amendment No. 1, as well. There's Amendment No. 1 and Amendment No. 2.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

We're on...yes, we have adopted Committee Amendment No. 1 and this is No. 2. You...you numbered it, No. 1...

SENATOR MACDONALD:

Oh, I...I beg your pardon.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

...but...but the procedure over here is the committee amendment is No. 1, the Floor amendment will be No. 2.

SENATOR MACDONALD:

Thank you. Amendment No. 2 takes care of some objection that there was in the committee that there would not be the proper oversight of the funds that would be spent for protection of nongame wildlife; therefore, we have devised in Amendment No. 2...a special committee, an advisory council, to be composed of representatives from the Illinois...Wildlife Federation, Illinois Audubon Society, Illinois Environmental Council, and the Audubon Council of Illinois. And, they will oversee, along with the Great Lakes Chapter of Sierra Club and the Illinois Division of Isaac Walton League, and any other such representatives as the advisory council shall deem necessary will oversee the expenditure of the funds of...in the Department of Conservation. I move for the adoption of this amendment.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

The motion is to adopt. Discussion? Senator Rock.

SENATOR ROCK:

May we have some order, Mr. President?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Senator Rock.

SENATOR ROCK:

It seems to me this bill has been here before and it failed. Now we are adding an amendment, which I would direct the attention to the membership to, because I think it is a very, very dangerous precedent. We are suggesting or saying or mandating by virtue of Amendment No. 2 that this department of government, the Department of Conservation, before it can expend any money out of this fund has to consult with...would the Secretary read the amendment?

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. FERNANDES)

Amendment No. 2. Amends Senate Bill 220 on Page 2 by inserting immediately after Line 22 the following:

"The Department of Conservation before expending funds pursuant to this Act, shall consult with a nongame wildlife conservation advisory council, to be composed of elected representatives from the Illinois Wildlife Federation, the Illinois Audubon Society, the Illinois Environmental Council, the Audubon Council of Illinois, the Illinois Wildlife Society, the Great Lakes Chapter of the Sierra Club, the Illinois Division of the Isaac Walton League of America, and such other representatives as the advisory council deem necessary."

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Senator Rock.

SENATOR ROCK:

My question is, I'm sure these people are well intended, why are we doing this to ourselves? This just doesn't make any sense and I am opposed to Amendment No. 2.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Further discussion? Senator Macdonald may close.

SENATOR MACDONALD:

Yes, when this bill was presented in committee there was feeling from a number of the members of that committee that they would like to have some direction ...and advice to the Department of Conservation in terms of expenditures of the funds that would be generated by this voluntary check-off bill. Indeed, this bill has been before us twice before, has passed out substantially with...with overwhelming votes from both the House and the Senate, and it was through the amendment...the Amendatory Veto of the Governor that this bill was defeated two other times. As far as I am concerned, I...I have faith in the Department of Conservation, and it is up to the will of this Body what they want to do with this amend-

ment. I do feel that if there is some concern, that this was the only resolution that we could find to the problem. So I will leave it to the Body whether this amendment shall be adopted or not.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Alright. Further discussion? Senator Maitland. Senator Macdonald was closing, but I'm sure with the confusion she will not object to your...

SENATOR MAITLAND:

Well...well, my question is, the amendment on my desk, Mr. President, is Amendment No. 1 that relates to the issue that Senator Fock was addressing and...

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

No, if I might have the attention of the Body, and this will come up again and again. Senator Macdonald left the amendment with us and put the numeral one on. When you leave amendments with the Secretary, if you will not number them, the Secretary will take care of numbering them and we will not have any confusion. So, the amendment that is marked No. 1 is, in fact, Amendment No. 2. Further discussion? Is there a request for a roll call? There's been a request for a roll call. The motion is to adopt Amendment No. 2 to Senate Bill 220. Those in favor will vote Aye. Those opposed will vote Nay. The voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that question, the Ayes are 21, the Nays are 27. Amendment No. 2 is lost. Further amendments?

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. FERNANDES)

Amendment No. 3 offered by Senator Macdonald.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Senator Macdonald.

SENATOR MACDONALD:

Yes, Amendment No. 3 reads, "However, no amount appropriated for the Illinois Nongame Wildlife Conservation Fund



may...

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Senator...Senator Macdonald, we have a leprechaun that works in the system here, and every time we clear the board, it sometimes will turn off your microphone. We don't do it intentionally, the leprechaun does. Senator Macdonald.

SENATOR MACDONALD:

...fine. Before...this amendment reads and...as a protective amendment, "However, no amount appropriated from the Illinois Nongame Wildlife Conservation Fund may be used by the Department of Conservation to exercise its power of eminent domain." I would recommend that this is a good amendment and that it does be adopted by this body.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Discussion? The question is on the adoption of Amendment No. 3. Those in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. Amendment No. 3 is adopted. Further amendments?

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. FERNANDES)

No further amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

3rd reading. Senate Bill 223, Senator Luft. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary, please.

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. FERNANDES)

Senate Bill 223.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Finance and Credit Regulations offers one amendment.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Senator Luft to explain Committee Amendment No. 1.

SENATOR LUFT:

Thank you, Mr. President. Committee Amendment No. 1 simply makes this permissive.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

The motion is to adopt Amendment No. 1. Discussion?

Those in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it.  
Amendment No. 1 is adopted. Further committee amendments?

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. FERNANDES)

No further committee amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Are there amendments from the floor?

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. FERNANDES)

No floor amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

3rd reading. For what purpose does Senator Hudson arise?

SENATOR HUDSON:

Thank you, Mr. President, purpose of an introduction. To the gallery behind me...in the gallery behind me, to my right as I turn around, are a group of women from Kendall County, a group of Kendall County farm women...women here for the day to see our Senate and House in operation. Also, kind of led, I believe, by Doris Anderson, Mrs. Doris Anderson, who was recently elected as the Kendall County Farm Woman of the Year.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Insurance and Licensed Activity offers three amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Senator Berman on Committee Amendment No. 1.

SENATOR BERMAN:

Thank you, Mr. President. Committee Amendment No. 1 made part of the changes requested in this bill. The request was from the independent accountants. There will be a Floor Amendment No. 4 that completes the list of...of requests made by the independent accountants to conform this bill. So, now I move the adoption of Committee Amendment No. 1.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

The motion is to adopt Committee Amendment No. 1. Discussion? Those in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. Committee Amendment No. 1 is adopted. Senator Berman on Committee Amendment No. 2.

SENATOR BERMAN:

Committee Amendment No. 2, Mr. President, is changes requested by the Department of Registration and Education. It clarifies the administrative procedures in order for the department to enforce the Act more efficiently. I move the adoption of Committee Amendment No. 2.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BERMAN)

The motion is to adopt Committee Amendment No. 2. Is there discussion? Senator Grotherg.

SENATOR GROTHBERG:

Thank you, Mr. President. A question of the sponsor. Senator Berman, is this...I'm going to ask you a little bit more than about the amendment. If I get ruled out of order, please, I can accept that too. But...this is the bill...the CPA bill, and my personal accountant/bookkeeper is not a CPA and they are terrified that they were going to be put out of business with the original bill... (machine cutoff)...

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

Senator Berman.

SENATOR BERMAN:

Your...your accountant, since this is...after April 15th, you really don't have to worry about him, but everybody has been accommodated. Amendment 4 has got the language and I will specifically state it. Whatever they were able to do under the old law is what they're able to do now, and that's the accommodation that's been worked out.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

Senator Grotberg.

SENATOR GROTEBERG:

Senator Berman, are you speaking in terms of grandfathering in the old ones or from that...that they will be able to continue to have new non-CPA's doing the same work that they have been doing? Can you clarify that for me?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

Senator Berman.

SENATOR BERMAN:

If...if you'd just hold your question till I get to Amendment 4, I think it'll be relevant at that point.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

All right. The motion is to adopt Amendment No. 2. Is there discussion of that motion? Those in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. Committee Amendment No. 2 is adopted. Committee Amendment No. 3, Senator Berman.

SENATOR BERMAN:

Thank you. Amendment...Committee Amendment No. 3 is a grammatical correction. It changes...the definition regarding disclaimer which was eliminated in the amendment...Committee Amendment No. 1. I move to adopt Committee Amendment No. 3.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR ERUCE)

The motion is to adopt Amendment No. 3. Discussion?

Those in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. Committee Amendment No. 3 is adopted. Further committee amendments?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Are there amendments from the Floor?

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. FERNANDES)

Amendment No. 4 offered by Senator Berman.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Senator Berman.

SENATOR BERMAN:

All right. Committee Amendment No. 4, Mr. Clerk, that's a two page amendment?

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. FERNANDES)

Yes.

SENATOR BERMAN:

Okay. This, Senator Grothberg and other members, is the language that was discussed in committee and is being adopted in...in Floor Amendment No. 4. And let me read you the language...which was agreed upon between the CPA's and the independents and it's as follows. "Unlicensed accountants are not prohibited from performing any services that they may have performed prior to this Amending Act of 1983." Merely as a word of background, they were concerned that the proposed Act would take away opportunities for rendering services in accounting that they previously performed. Under the urging of Senator Bupp in committee, everybody got together and this is the language verbatim that they have agreed upon. I believe that takes care of your particular individual as well as many others.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Senator Grothberg.

SENATOR GROTHBERG:

It does in intent, but in words it indicates to me it's simply grandfathering in all existing accountants. It's vague as to whether all future accountants will be able to practice independently. And I...a nonlawyers' opinion of those few words.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Senator Berman.

SENATOR GROTHBERG:

It's...it's vague...to that.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Senator Berman.

SENATOR BERMAN:

Well, if it wasn't vague, the lawyers wouldn't have any business to do. Put aside from that...it's my understanding that with this language, unlicensed accountants that are...that start to practice the day after this bill...is put into law, will be able to do what they've always been able to do. That would be the legislative intent in response to Senator Grothberg's question.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Further discussion? Senator Berman moves the adoption of Amendment No. 4. On...on the motion, those in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. Amendment No. 4 is adopted. Further floor amendments?

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. FERNANDES)

Amendment No. 5 offered by Senator Berman.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Senator Berman.

SENATOR BERMAN:

Thank you, Mr. President. Floor Amendment No. 5 is requested by...Legislative Reference Bureau. There was a word, "applications" and it really should have been "applicants." And then there's some number changes, it's typographical corrections only. I move the adoption of Floor

Senator Rigney.

SENATOR RIGNEY:

Mr. President, the purpose of Senate Amendment No. is merely to clarify who may give temporary excuses from physical education classes. It spells out the right of the

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ents to do so, it also gives all of those covered under the Medical Practice Act such authority to grant excuses.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

The motion is to adopt Committee Amendment No. 1. Discussion? Those in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. Committee Amendment No. 1 is adopted. Further committee amendments?

SECRETARY:

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Jude I offers one amendment.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Senator Lemke on Amendment No. 1.

SENATOR LEMKE:

What this amendment does is makes the Statute of Limitation on Class X crimes, ten years after the...completion of the sentence. The way it was before, it was indefinite; this makes it ten years after completion of the sentence on a Class X Felony. I think it's a good amendment and I ask for its adoption.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Are there amendments from the Floor?

3rd reading. Senate Bill 292, Senator Welch. Senator Welch on the Floor? Senate Bill 297, Senator Carroll. Competitive bidding, data processing equipment. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary, please.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

3rd reading. Senate Bill...Senate Bill 304, Senator Demuzio. Senator Demuzio, there's been a request for a fiscal note. Okay. Senate Bill 305, Senator Dawson. Senate Bill 306, Senator Carroll. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary, please.

SECRETARY:

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendment.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Are there amendments from the Floor?

SECRETARY:

Amendment No. 1...Senator Carroll.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Senator Carroll.

SENATOR CARROLL:

Thank you, Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the

Senate. Amendment No. 1 was the request of the committee that consolidated what was otherwise known as Senate Bill 307 into 306. The purpose was the interest of the planning commission itself to create two additional seats from the suburban Cook County area, one north of Roosevelt Road and one south, in addition to the membership for transportation, bringing the total from twenty-five to twenty-eight, and to do that in one piece of legislation rather than two. So, pursuant to that request of the committee, this amendment so does. I would move adoption of Amendment No. 1.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

The motion is to adopt Amendment No. 1. Discussion? Those in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. Amendment No. 1 is adopted. Further amendments?

SECRETARY:

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

3rd reading. Senate Bill 313, Senator Vadalabene. For what purpose does Senator...Chew arise at Senator Nedza's desk?

SENATOR CHEW:

Mr. President, over the President's gallery there are students and faculty members from the Simian High School in

Chicago, which is now in the 16th District, and I'd like for the Senate to recognize them, please.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Would our guests in the galleries please stand and be recognized by the Senate. Senate Bill 313, Senator Vadalabene. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary, please.

SECRETARY:

Senate Bill 313.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Local Government offers one amendment.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Senator Vadalabene on Committee Amendment No. 1.

SENATOR VADALABENE:

Yes, thank you, Mr. President and members of the Senate. Committee Amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 313 provides that jurors may not receive more than forty dollars per day. Currently some counties hold a number of inquests in one day, and without the maximum dollar figure, counties could be required to pay as much as seventy, eighty or ninety dollars per day to each juror. It adds that the jurors may not receive more than forty dollars per day, and I move for its adoption.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

The motion is to adopt Committee Amendment No. 1. Discussion? Those in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. Amendment No. 1 is adopted. Further committee amendments..

SECRETARY:

No further committee amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Are there amendments from the Floor?

SECRETARY:

No Floor amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

3rd reading. Is there leave to return to Senate Bill 292, Senator Welch was off the Floor? Leave is granted. Senate Bill 292. Read the bill, Mr. Secretary, please.

SECRETARY:

Senate Bill 292.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Agriculture, Conservation and Energy offers two amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Senator Welch on Committee Amendment No. 1.

SENATOR WELCH:

Thank you, Mr. President. I would move, at this time, to Table Amendment No. 1.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

The motion is to adopt Committee Amendment No. 1 to...the motion is to Table Committee Amendment No. 1. Those in favor say Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it, and Committee Amendment No. 1 is Tabled. Amendment No. 2, Senator Welch.

SENATOR WELCH:

Mr. Chairman, Committee Amendment No. 2 is to clarify the terms of the bill. The purpose being to separate out the lease of the waterway as opposed to selling the land rights connected to the dam at the Starved Rock State Park and along the river which we are mainly addressing in this bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

The motion is to adopt Committee Amendment No. 2. Is there discussion? Senator Grotherg.

SENATOR GROTHEERG:

Thank you, Mr. President. A question of the sponsor if he will yield.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

Indicates he will yield. Senator Grotherg.

SENATOR GROTHEERG:

Senator Welch, knowing the territory rather well and been through numerous land agreements between the State of Illinois and municipalities, et cetera, would you elaborate on the...we don't have the amendment, you have the amendment, would you elaborate on the quid pro quo as to what the State gets for giving up the land for the fifty year term. Is there an annual rental? Is there a payback in any way or...explain the best you can 'cause we don't...I don't know anything about it.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR BRUCE)

All right. May we have some order, please. If we might have a little order, Senator Welch can be heard at least by Senator Grothberg. Senator Welch is recognized.

SENATOR WEICH:

Thank you, Mr. President. Senator Grothberg, the remuneration to the State will be based on negotiations with the Department of Transportation. It's a lease that can be negotiated, and the purpose of this bill is to state that they can negotiate for up to a fifty-year lease as opposed to the current law which limits a lease to five years. So, it depends on how well the department bargains for the remuneration. And the purpose of the bill basically, Senator Grothberg, is to allow the Municipality of Peru, which has shown an interest in hydroelectric power from the dam at Starved Rock, which is capable of allowing for hydroelectric power to be generated.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

Further discussion? Senator Grothberg.

SENATOR GROTHBERG:

Thank you. Is the bill restricted just to this site or are we preparing now so that the Hotel Baker in St. Charles...going to make a deal with the waterways to get my hydroplant going? Is the language specific to Starved Rock site?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

Senator Welch.

SENATOR WELCH:

No, Senator, it...it is specific though to the Illinois Waterway which includes from Lockport down to the Starved Rock Dam. So other municipalities along the Illinois River which are able to negotiate for hydroelectric power along that river can do so. It would be a matter of negotiation with the Department of...Transportation.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

Senator Grothberg.

SENATOR GROTHBERG:

Thank you. Would you care to accept an amendment to put the Fox in on it?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

Senator Welch.

SENATOR WELCH:

I...I don't think the Fox River is included under the Illinois Waterway Act. I believe it's specifically limited to the Illinois River between Lockport and Starved Rock Dam.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

Senator Grothberg.

SENATOR GROTHBERG:

I would ask the sponsor to take it out of the record while we talk about it to see if we could...in this same device not clutter the whole State of Illinois, but if somebody else has something that should be in it, now is the time to talk about it, Senator Welch. I'd be honored if you'd just hold it, or with your commitment to bring it back to 2nd, should it go to 3rd.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

Senator Welch.

SENATOR WELCH:

Senator, there...there is a...another bill coming to the

Ag Committee, I believe it's in the Agriculture Committee, sponsored by Senator Schuneman which talks about hydroelectric dams along the Rock River. Now, I think that's a separate waterway system from this Illinois Waterway Act, and I think that you would have to have a separate piece of legislation, is my impression. Perhaps Senator Schuneman is familiar with that as well.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

Senator...

SENATOR WELCH:

...Senator Grotberg, the reason I...I would like to move it to 3rd is that the people in my city are...are trying to get this bill out as soon as possible, and they've been putting some pressure on me to do so.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

Senator Grotberg.

SENATOR GROTEBERG:

Thank you, that's a good honest answer. What I would like to ask you, Senator Welch is, after you have moved it, would you make a commitment to bring it back to 2nd to allow me to add to it? We do that all the time over here...if it's appropriate; if it's not, we won't force it on you.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

Senator Welch.

SENATOR WELCH:

If we can do it within a...a week or ten days, Senator, I...I would be amenable to that.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

Further discussion? If not, 3rd reading. On...Committee Amendment No. 2, those in favor of adopting Committee Amendment No. 2 indicate by saying Aye. Those opposed. The Ayes have it. Committee Amendment No. 2 is adopted. Any further amendments?
