Thank you, Mr. President. Floor Amendment No. 1 to House Bill 1585 puts this bill in the same form that the Senate bill was in and that is to add a minority or female as a member of the board. It also limits the state's share to two hundred and fifty thousand dollars per year...shall not exceed two hundred and fifty thousand. I urge its adoption. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

SENATOR RAICA:

Thank you, Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. The amendment that is being put on...first of all, it...addresses the definition of a master antenna television service and, secondly, it just requires that no person who owns a mobile home can be forced to remove or pay for the cable television service without their wishes, and that's basically what this amendment does.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LUFT)

Discussion? Senator Demuzio.

SENATOR DEMUZIO:

Well, thank you, Mr. President. I...I know we've got a lot of things going on on the floor here. I...I was wondering, perhaps, since we have not been apprised of this amendment...we haven't seen it, if Senator Raica would simply just explain it again for us if he would please.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR LUFT)

Senator Raica.

SENATOR RAICA:

Thank you. Senator, this was offered by my...or my Representative who thought there may be a problem with the...with the way the bill which originally put in. What this bill does...I just received it from LRB and I went over it with Representative O'Connell and he says this is...is exactly what they were looking for. The first part of it...the definition of master...antenna television service

means any of all services provided by or through the facilities of any closed circuit, coaxial cable television system. So, it basically identifies cable television in the first part and that's what the cable television people wanted in their part of it. The second aspect is what the... is what they needed in the bill also is that there are certain trailer camps that force the people who move into that camp to pay for cable television and this would eliminate that from occurring where they could not force a tenant or one of the mobile park owners to...to buy the cable network if they did not want to.

Senator Demuzio.

SENATOR DEMUZIO:

Well, again, I know there's a lot of confusion that's taking place here right now, but...this bill came out of the Executive Committee, Senator Raica, and our staff really hasn't had an opportunity to...to go through it. I...I don't want to do this as a dilatory move, but I would appreciate the fact if you would take this thing out of record and perhaps let our staffs get together and we won't have as much controversy on this thing.

SENATOR RAICA:

Mr. President, I have no problem with that request so long as I have the assurance that I can move this bill again.

SENATOR POSHARD:

Yes, thank you, Mr. President. Amendment No. 1 would allow the use of state helicopters for the transportation of state university medical personnel and for the development of alternative methods for the delivery of health care services in certain areas of the state in those medically underserved areas. We've had Southern Illinois University and now the University of Illinois that's working with us to try to develop ways to serve these medically underserved areas and at times they need to make use of the state helicopters for

their own reasons to get out to these areas and this would simply allow them to do that.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Poshard has moved the adoption of Committee Amendment No. 1 to House Bill 1955. Is there discussion? Senator Topinka.

SENATOR TOPINKA:

Yes, if I might ask the sponsor a question, please.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Sponsor indicates he will yield. Senator Topinka.

SENATOR TOPINKA:

Yes, I don't have a...a copy of the amendment and...I don't recall, you know, that we discussed it in Public Health. Could you tell me more about what this amendment intends to do?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Poshard.

SENATOR POSHARD:

Yes, thank you, Senator Topinka. There are considerable geographical areas of the state that are medically underserved...according to the Federal surveys that have been performed, meaning that presently we have a lack of obstetrician services. We have high teenage pregnancy areas in some of those geographical areas. We have a lack of appropriate ambulance services to serve the needs of the people in those areas. The University of Illinois and Southern Illinois University medical personnel who have been working with us to try to meet...develop a plan to meet the rural health care needs of these people have...have found a way use certain kinds of medical helicopters where emergency ambulance service is not available to go in and get people who have need of...of emergency services and they want to be able to utilize these helicopters for this particular reason. Sometimes the university personnel want to be able to go out on these emergency runs with the helicopter and they want to be able to fly in the helicopters with them.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Topinka.

SENATOR TOPINKA:

•••one more question•••would that be covered then under the university's budget or is that cost picked up somewhere else?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Poshard.

SENATOR POSHARD:

Well, we have an appropriation in the Department of Public Health's budget for two hundred thousand dollars for the development of emergency medical ambulance services and...it probably would come out of that appropriation.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right, further discussion? Senator Raica.

SENATOR RAICA:

Question of the sponsor, please.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Sponsor indicates he will yield. Senator Raica.

SENATOR RAICA:

Senator, in this particular bill, does it have anything to do with landing rights or landing privileges of that helicopter?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Poshard.

SENATOR POSHARD:

No, sir.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Raica.

SENATOR RAICA:

What this bill does is just...it strictly has to do with the transportation but not of landing of that helicopter

on...on a road or anything. Is...is that correct?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Poshard.

SENATOR POSHARD:

That's correct, sir.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Further discussion? If not, Senator Poshard has moved the adoption of Committee Amendment No. 1 to House Bill 1955. Those in favor will indicate by saying Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. Committee Amendment No. 1 is adopted. Further committee amendments?

SECRETARY:

Mr. President, this amendment would establish an...an International Commerce and Development Center at SIU—Carbondale for the purposes of utilizing the university personnel there and...and establishing a worldwide network for sharing information and particular to further the worldwide marketing of Illinois products to various parts of...of the world, including coal and wood, many of the things that we have a lot of in southern Illinois. Move for its adoption.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Poshard has moved the adoption of Amendment No. 2 to House Bill 1955. Is there discussion? Senator Haitland. SENATOR MAITLAND:

I'm...I'm sorry, Mr. President. Senator Poshard, I...have

we seen that amendment here? What's the...what are we creating here?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Poshard.

SENATOR POSHARD:

Yes, thank you, Senator Maitland. Let me...let me explain this to you. Representative Phelps had a bill in the House which was on the Consent Calendar ... Agreed Bill List, and it established an International Commerce and Development Center at SIU-Carbondale. SIU-Carbondale has one of the largest percentages of foreign students of any university in this nation. They have many university personnel which travel back and forth to these countries and different parts of the world from...whence these students come and...we're trying to establish a way that the university can make use of these contacts all over the world. Many of those graduate students go back and become governmental figures, they become figures in economic development in their country and so on, and we're trying to establish a center that would help the university go into these countries and somehow do a better job of marketing our coal, our wood, other resources that we have a lot of in the southern part of the state.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Maitland.

SENATOR MAITLAND:

Well, I...I. wondering, is there a coordination of this with any of the other universities? Other universities have major...numbers of...of foreign students, and I...I. wondering if we've coordinated this with the Board of Higher Education? What's the cost of this? Does anybody know what...what we're actually doing here? What have we got after we do it?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Poshard.

SENATOR POSHARD:

The cost will be approximately one hundred thousand dollars. As I understand it, there is an appropriation request that's in the House for this. There will be consultation from the University of Illinois and this will be coordinated with the Department of Commerce and Community Affairs and Energy and Natural Resources.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Maitland.

SENATOR MAITLAND:

Senator, does the...does the Board of Higher Education have a position on this? This is a new program.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Poshard.

SENATOR POSHARD:

I do not believe they have a position on it at this time.

Senator Maitland.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Further discussion? Senator Keats. Senator Keats. All right, any further discussion? If not, Senator Poshard has moved the adoption of Amendment No. 2 to House Bill 1955. Those in favor will vote...vote Aye. Those opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. Amendment No. 2 is adopted. Further amendments?

SENATOR NETSCH:

Thank you, Mr. President. The bill deals with the State Collection Act. It amends it to allow the hiring of professionals for accounts receivable in addition to attorneys which was previously permitted. There is a cap on the amount that can be paid out of the accounts receivable fund but there was not on the leftover fund. This capped the amendment, caps that at forty percent of the total collections per account and I would move the adoption of Committee Amendment No. 1 to House Bill 1956.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Netsch has moved the adoption of Committee Amendment No. 1 to House Bill 1956. Discussion? Senator Rigney.

SENATOR RIGNEY:

A question of the sponsor.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right, sponsor indicates...she will yield. Senator Rigney.

SENATOR RIGNEY:

I'm not exactly sure and maybe we went through it a little too quickly in committee, the forty percent cap...in that we're talking now about the amendment, would you explain again just exactly what that's doing?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Netsch.

SENATOR NETSCH:

Yeah, let me go back one step, Senator Rigney. The amendment and the bill as it passed the House and as it came into
the committee had provided that agencies, that is, state
agencies, may contract for collection assistance...I'm
skipping some of the language, "Agencies may utilize monies
in the accounts receivable fund to pay for such legal and

collection assistance, provided, however, that no more than twenty percent of the collections on an account may be paid from the accounts receivable fund as compensation on...for those...that assistance." And then the next sentence, "If the amount available for expenditure from the accounts receivable fund is insufficient to pay the cost of such services, the difference may be paid from such other monies which may be available to the agency." Now that was in the bill. What the amendment does is to limit that amount that may be paid from other funds for the legal or collection agency assistance and it limits it to forty percent of the total collections per account.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right, further discussion? Senator Rigney.

SENATOR RIGNEY:

Well, just so I'm clear on that. Then that means that we do not change the twenty percent that comes from the accounts receivable and the net effect is then we're limiting to twenty percent from other sources. Is that it? And if so, what are the other sources? I mean, where would you get the money?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right, can we have some order, please? Senator Netsch.

SENATOR NETSCH:

We are not changing the twenty percent that was already in the bill. That is the cap on the amount that could be taken from the accounts receivable fund. This adds a cap to any other funds that could be used to help pay for the collection assistance program...services, I should say.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Further discussion? Senator Woodyard.

SENATOR WOODYARD:

Thank you, Ar. President. Would the sponsor yield?

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PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Sponsor indicates she will yield...Senator...

SENATOR WOODYARD:

Senator Netsch,...I°m sorry, I missed part of the first part of your explanation of that amendment. Is this the bill that we had in Revenue Committee dealing with...I°m sorry, is that...

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Netsch.

SENATOR NETSCH:

Yes, the bill was in the Revenue Committee and it deals with amendments to the Illinois State Collection Act of 1986 and it was requested by the Comptroller's Office. It permits the state agencies to contract for what I will generically call professional services, that is, either legal or collection agency services to help them collect debts that are due to them; and this spells that kind of provision out somewhat more, added collection agencies, capped the amount that could be spent out of the money collected from the accounts receivable fund and now the amendment puts an additional cap on the amount that can be spent for that purpose, but it...the bill did come out of the Revenue Committee, right.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Woodyard.

SENATOR WOODYARD:

Thank you. Does it apply only to the Scholarship Commission or the student loans or does it apply across the board...as amended to all other...various loan programs and...and things like that where we would be hiring a collection agency to...with percentile fee?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Netsch.

SENATOR NETSCH:

No, the basic Act, which was passed I think last

Session,...the Illinois State Collection Act of 1986 applies to all state agencies and as originally enacted except the State Scholarship Commission. That was in the basic law. We did make in here a modest modification by saying that it will apply to all state agencies except that the debt collection and write-off provisions of the Act shall not apply to the State Scholarship Commission, and the reason for that is that...as I understand it, the Federal...the Federal Government has determined how we are to go about collecting that and we don't control it, that's the reason why the Scholarship Commission was originally excluded and we just clarified that language.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Further discussion? Senator Netsch has moved the adoption of Committee Amendment No. 1 to House Bill 1956. Those in favor will indicate by saying Aye. Those opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. Committee Amendment No. 1 is adopted. Further committee amendments?

SECRETARY:

No further committee amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Amendments from the Floor?

SECRETARY:

No Floor amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

3rd reading. Senator Brookins, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR BROOKINS:

Yes, Mr. President, I notice on the floor a House member, Jessie White, eating crow from the game yesterday. He's over there on the Republican side...ashamed to be over here with us big swingers.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

He looks like he's slipping around back there. 1959.

1968, Senator Hawkinson. On the Order of House Bills 2nd Reading is House Bill 1968.

SECRETARY:

House Bill 1968.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Any amendments from the Floor?

SECRETARY:

No Floor amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

3rd reading. 1969, Senator Collins. House bills 2nd reading, House Bill 1969, Madam Secretary.

SECRETARY:

House Bill 1969.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Any amendments from the Floor?

SECRETARY:

No Floor amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

3rd reading. Senator Netsch, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR NETSCH:

•••Mr• President, if I might have Representative White's attention, I just wanted to clarify something. There are rumors afloat that the Republican Caucus has unanimously agreed to make a trade that will be of interest to some members of this Body. Since Jessie White and I come from the same legislative district, it's Jessie White for Netsch. Now the only problem...yea...the only problem, guys, is they haven't figured out how much cash to throw in or on which side to throw it. As soon as that is determined, the trade

will be made.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Lechowicz. Senator Lechowicz.

SENATOR LECHOWICZ:

Jessie, just let us know what you need, Jessie, we'll raise it.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right, House bills 2nd reading, House Bill 1984, Senator Fawell. House bills 2nd reading is House Bill 1984, Madam Secretary.

SECRETARY:

House Bill 1984.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Any amendments from the Floor?

SECRETARY:

Senator Fawell offers Amendment No. 1.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Fawell.

SENATOR FAWELL:

Thank you, very much. This amendment allows...no munici pality to impose a tax or surcharge which is based on an added fee to a charge imposed by a park district.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right, Senator Fawell has moved adoption of Amendment

No. 1 to House Bill 1984. Is there discussion? Senator

Dudycz.

SENATOR DUDYCZ:

Thank you, Mr. President. I have a question for the sponsor.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Sponsor indicates she will yield. Senator Dudycz.

SENATOR DUDYCZ:

Senator, is this identical to Senate Bill 710?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Fawell.

SENATOR FAMELL:

I'm not sure.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Dudycz. Senator Dudycz, you have...all right, any further discussion? All right, Senator Fawell has moved the adoption of Amendment No. 1 to House Bill 1984. Those in favor will indicate by saying Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. Amendment No. 1 is adopted. Further amendments? SECRETARY:

No further amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

3rd reading. All right, House Bill 1992, Senator Geo-Karis. House...House bills 2nd reading, House Bill 1992, Madam Secretary.

SECRETARY:

House Bill 1992.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd reading of the bill. The...Committee on Public Health, Welfare and Corrections offers one committee amendment.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR NEWHOUSE)

Senator Geo-Karis.

SENATOR GEO-KARIS:

Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate, this is the amendment that was recommended by the Department of Mental Health and it was offered in committee and I move its passage.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR NEWHOUSE)

Senator Geo-Karis moves the adoption of Amendment No. 1 to House Bill 1992. Is there any discussion? If not, those all in favor say Aye. All those opposed say Nay. The amendment is adopted. Any more amendments?

SECRETARY:

No further committee amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR NEWHOUSE)

Amendments from the Floor?

SECRETARY:

No Floor amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR NEWHOUSE)

3rd reading. House Bill 1998, Senator Davidson. Read the bill, Miss Secretary.

SECRETARY:

House Bill 1998.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd reading of the bill. No committee amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR NEWHOUSE)

Any amendments from the Floor?

SECRETARY:

Senator Davidson offers Amendment No. 1.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR NEWHOUSE)

Senator Davidson.

SENATOR DAVIDSON:

Mr. President and members of the Senate. Amendment No. 1 becomes the bill and this is being put into this bill at...to take care of a problem where those not-for-profit private higher level colleges which are separate and free standing from a college that gives a baccalaureate degrees it would have an opportunity to appoint a campus police. This is particularly...would apply to medical schools and law schools and...this is a problem in one Representative's district and this...I understand came from the House member...the sponsor of the bill supports it and the Republican and Democrat staff in the House drafted the amendment. Move the adoption of Amendment No. 1.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR NEWHOUSE)

Senator Davidson moves the adoption of Amendment No. 1 to

House Bill 1998. Any discussion? Senator Demuzio.

SENATOR DEMUZIO:

Senator Davidson, can you tell us where the problem is? We've just now seen this amendment.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR NEWHOUSE)

Senator Davidson.

SENATOR DAVIDSON:

It's in Representative Stange's district and I understand presently it's Chicago Osteopathic College and then there's one law school which it also said they were having inability to do the same thing 'cause it's free standing, they got to have a baccalaureate degree to get to that professional level.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR NEWHOUSE)

Further discussion? Senator Welch.

SENATOR WELCH:

A question of the sponsor. Senator....

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR NEWHOUSE)

Sponsor indicates he'll yield.

SENATOR WELCH:

•••Senator Davidson, did you say that this strips the original bill totally?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR NEWHOUSE)

Senator Davidson.

SENATOR DAVIDSON:

Totally.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR NEWHOUSE)

Senator Welch.

SENATOR WELCH:

Well. I thought that the original bill was to correct the problem within the Board of Regent's system. Has that problem been alleviated or why are you eliminating the entire bill?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR NEWHOUSE)

Senator Davidson.

SENATOR DAVIDSON:

I stand corrected, Senator Welch. It deletes the...title and inserts this on page 1 of 27. The bill originally was a vehicle bill for the Board of Regents. This was ran past the Board of Regents and they had no objection to the amendment. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR NEWHOUSE)

Senator Welch. Further discussion? Then Senator Davidson moves the adoption of Amendment No. 1 to House Bill 1998. Is there any discussion? If not, all those in favor say Aye. Those opposed say Nay. The amendment is adopted. Any further amendments?

No further amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR NEWHOUSE)

3rd reading. House Bill 2006, Senator Savickas. House Bill 2007, Senator Degnan. Read the bill, Madam Secretary.

END OF REEL

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SECRETARY:

House Bill 2007.

(Secretary reads title of bill)

2nd reading of the bill. The Committee on Insurance, Pensions and Licensed Activities reports...offers Amendment No.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR NEWHOUSE)

Amendment No. 1, Senator Degnan.

SENATOR DEGNAN:

Thank you, Ar. President. Amendment No. 1 as addressed in committee removes the objections of the auto manufacturers, the insurance companies and the Auto Repairer's Association. I move its adoption.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR NEWHOUSE)

Senator Degnan moves the adoption of Amendment No. 1 to House Bill 2007. Is there any discussion? If not, all those in favor say Aye. All opposed say Nay. Senator Schuneman. SENATOR SCHUNEMAN:

Question of the sponsor, Mr. President.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR NEWHOUSE)

Senator Degnan.

SENATOR SCHUNEMAN:

Senator, since our...our meeting...our committee meeting, I've had a chance to review this amendment and...and this bill a little bit and I'm not sure whether I'm talking to the amendment, frankly, or to the bill but I've got a couple of questions if you would respond. The bill calls for the establishment...or rather the requirement that...that crash parts must be tested by some testing laboratory. Can you give me an example of a...of a testing laboratory that's set

up for that purpose now?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR NEWHOUSE)

Senator Degnan.

SENATOR DEGNAN:

No, I can't, Senator. I...I am led to believe that some of these parts are...are tested by the Federal Government.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR NEWHOUSE)

Senator Schuneman.

SENATOR SCHUNEMAN:

On page 3 in line 16, the...I believe this is the amendment, it says that the manufacturer or the manufacturer's representative warrants that replacement parts meet the safety and damageability standards established by the United States Department of Transportation. Has the department published standards?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR NEWHOUSE)

Senator Degnan.

SENATOR DEGNAN:

There are apparently some standards that are published. If you read further to line 70, it says "if any." So some parts do have standards, others do not have standards.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR NEWHOUSE)

Senator Schuneman.

SENATOR SCHUNEMAN:

Well, it seems to me that the effect of this amendment may be to indicate that crash parts other than original equipment manufacturer's crash parts could continue to be used, but it seems to me that with this language in there, there is a...a reasonable question as to whether or not any of those parts could be used, because it's my understanding that the Department of Transportation has, in fact, not established standards for damageability and that nobody could meet that criteria except the original equipment manufacturers. And if we do this, I'm wondering if we're going to

be left with a bill under which only original equipment manufacturer's parts could be available to fix cars and, if so, there would be an apparent monopoly on the parts.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR NEWHOUSE)

Senator Degnan.

SENATOR DEGNAN:

Well, again, I refer you to "if any." If there are no standards, then there is nothing that applies to that particular part. I was led to believe that bumpers, for instance, have standards.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR NEWHOUSE)

Senator Schuneman.

SENATOR SCHUNEMAN:

Well, I...I really think that whole...that whole issue is surrounded with questions, Senator, and I...and I know you've tried to...to...to deal in good faith on this and I know the insurance industry has been involved in it and I'm not sure that they...they know for sure what we're going to have if we finally pass this bill, and I simply wanted to raise the issue on 2nd reading. I assume we're probably going to approve the amendment, but I think the membership ought to be aware that...what we, in fact, may be doing here is eliminating competition in the sale of crash parts for automobiles.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR NEWHOUSE)

Senator Degnan moves the adoption of Amendment No. 1 to House Bill 2007. Is there any...further discussion? If not, all those in favor say Aye. Senator Davidson.

SENATOR DAVIDSON:

I don't have the committee amendment in front of me, Senator Degnan, but reading the bill that came over as it was amended in the House, does your amendment remove all this language 'cause as I read this presently, you're going to put a lot of people out of business in the salvage business that

buy wrecked cars and take off the good parts and resell them to other people, the way I read this amendment, and that...those people in that kind of business are going to be prohibited from doing that. Is that correct?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR NEWHOUSE)

Senator Degnan.

SENATOR DEGNAN:

As we discussed in committee, my understanding is, this amendment removes the objection of the following people, the insurance industry, the automobile manufacturers, the Auto Repairer's Association. In committee, the Auto Wholesalers of Illinois, who I think you are referring to, still had a problem with the bill as amended.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR NEWHOUSE)

Senator Davidson.

SENATOR DAVIDSON:

Well,...I don't have the committee amendment so I'm unable to address that and I maybe talking out of the wrong plate. Let me ask you this, with your amendment, does this now open up a window so that...

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR NEWHOUSE)

Senator, this appears to be controversial. Shall we take it out of the record?

SENATOR DAVIDSON:

No, go ahead, we'll...let's finish up. I just want to ask him one more question.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR NEWHOUSE)

Senator Davidson.

SENATOR DAVIDSON:

Does this open up a window now that...that by removing those objections, does this open a window that people who are in the chop shop business would...would be allowed to take those good parts and sell them to someone who is repairing a

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR NEWHOUSE)

Senator Degnan.

SENATOR DEGNAN:

I can assure you it does not do that and I would suggest we might debate the bill in its watered down state on 3rd reading in its entirety.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR NEWHOUSE)

Senator Degnan moves the adoption of Amendment No. 1 to House Bill 2007. Is there any further discussion? If not, all those in favor say Aye. All those opposed say Nay. The motion is adopted. Any further amendments?

SECRETARY:

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR NEWHOUSE)

No...the amendment actually deletes the language that was added by the bill...and puts it back where only authorized manufacturers can put these seat backs in the school buses. The bill as it left the House actually included authorized dealers to install these. Vince, I don't know who is against this amendment, but I sure don't know who's for it. I got the amendment from Department of Transportation and the contract bus people.

Senator Collins.

SENATOR COLLINS:

Question...question of the sponsor.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

He indicates he'll yield.

SENATOR COLLINS:

When...when the bill passed out of the...the committee, it had...no, when the bill came to the committee from the House, it...it would allow for persons other than the manufacturers to put...to install the...the...the...the windows in...in...in the...in the buses. Now why do we want to just limit it to the manufacturers?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR SAVICKAS)

Senator Woodyard.

SENATOR WOODYARD:

Senator Collins, I totally agree with you, I have no idea. I've talked to the House sponsor on this thing,

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because by this amendment, the bill does nothing. What the bill attempted to do was to allow an authorized dealer to install the seat backs that previously by law could only be installed by a manufacturer. Now, it's my understanding, some of these dealers were concerned about their liability if they installed these seat backs and, thus, they wanted to...to introduce this amendment to just totally wipe them out of the bill. So, actually with this amendment, the bill does nothing.

Then why do we need the bill? Are you...are you then going to just leave it on 3rd reading?

Now, you know, all of us love our universities, we do all we can for education and we like to do what we can for our districts back home, but we veterans do not like to be referred to any administration that it is Nazilike. And think that Representative Wyvetter Younge should apologize to the presidents and to all of us in the Legislature for those kind of remarks, and I resent it very deeply and I thought you ought to know about it over here in the Senate. Wyvetter Younge should be censored for that kind of a remark that our

university system at Edwardsville is Nazilike.

Senator DeAngelis. Senator DeAngelis.

SENATOR DEANGELIS:

Thank you, Ar. President. Committee Amendment No. 1 just simply makes some technical changes at the request of the Department of Mental Health and...Development Disabilities. PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right. Senator DeAngelis has moved adoption of Committee Amendment No. 1 to House Bill 2808. Is there discussion? If not, those in favor will indicate by saying Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. Committee Amendment No. 1 is adopted. Further committee amendments?

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. HARRY)

No further committee amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Amendments from the Floor?

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. HARRY)

Amendment No. 2 offered by Senator DeAngelis.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator DeAngelis on Amendment No. 2...to file with Senator DeAngelis so we can keep moving.

SENATOR DEANGELIS:

Yes, No. 2, the ... SBAM, the last three?

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. HARRY)

Yes, sir.

SENATOR DEANGELIS:

Okay, that amendment is at the request of the Auditor General who would like to delete the language that forces them to do a particular kind of audit and it deletes lines number 16. 17 and 18.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator DeAngelis has moved adoption of Amendment No. 2 to House Bill 2808. Is there discussion? If not, those in favor will indicate by saying Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. Amendment No. 2 is adopted. Further amendments? ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. HARRY)

Amendment No. 3 offered by Senator DeAngelis.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator DeAngelis.

SENATOR DeANGELIS:

Okay. Amendment No. 3 includes in the crime of aggravated battery those types of offenses against the severely and profoundly mentally retarded adults...

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Is...Senator DeAngelis has...had you concluded?
SENATOR DeANGELIS:

Yeah, I've already said it, let's adopt it.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Oh. Senator DeAngelis has moved adoption of Amendment
No. 3 to House Bill 2808. Discussion? Senator Dunn.
SENATOR THOMAS DUNN;

Thank you, Ar. President. It was my understanding that between the House Judiciary Committee and the Senate Judiciary Committee that any aggravated situations would go into the subcommittee.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator DeAngelis.

SENATOR DEANGELIS:

I...I don*t...if that were the agreement, then how did this bill get out of the House? Because this amendment is House Bill 2722 which I did not attend the Judiciary meeting on?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Dunn.

SENATOR THOMAS DUNN:

The reason it got out of the House was because the agreement was made subsequent to it getting out of the House.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator DeAngelis.

SENATOR DEANGELIS:

You mean it's a retroactive agreement?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Dunn...Thomas Dunn.

SENATOR THOMAS DUNN:

I always thought an agreement was an agreement.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Hawkinson, can you shed any light on this? Senator Hawkinson.

SENATOR HAWKINSON:

Thank you, Mr. President. Only that we had a good number of bills in Senate Committee of House bills that dealt with the subject of aggravated battery and enhanced penalties,

other than this one, and the...the agreement of...in the committee was to hold all of those bills, which we did. Had Senator DeAngelis appeared before the committee, this bill also would have been held in committee for work by that subcommittee. The categories have been so expanded and...and now we're into the even new generation of penalties in this area that it was felt that...that we ought to have some uniformity, see what we could do to restore the balance in uniformity to the Aggravated Battery Act, and had this bill been called in committee, I'm sure that it would have been held in committee as all the other bills were.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator DeAngelis, perhaps you...

SENATOR DeANGELIS:

Well, I...I apologize to the members of the committee, but...and I don't know if I'm hearing right 'cause I've got about three people talking to me at the same time. When you're sitting...when you're trying to argue something between two lawyers, you know you're at a handicap. But, essentially, what this is doing is including in that category the mentally retarded. Perhaps, some of you may not know, I have a mental health facility in my district, Senator Mahar has two in his and we recently have had some incidences there and there really has been nothing that can be done other than working through the so-called process within the institutions. And...and there are some people that feel rather strongly that this ought to be included, including myself, and...because many of these severely and profoundly retarded children...adults really have the IQ of children.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right. I'm sorry, I was momentarily...wasn't paying any attention. Senator Marovitz.

SENATOR MAROVITZ:

Thank you, very much, Mr. President. Hell, I think that

Senator Dunn and Senator Hawkinson have pretty well explained what's...and, I'm sure, Senator Barkhausen will probably verify this, what's going on in the Judiciary Committee. also had a discussion with the chairman of the Judiciary Committee in the House...the Criminal Judiciary Committee and agreed to do all this...to do this uniformity with the ag. battery section. People came in...who are...regarding the...the handicapped and we had bills for the handicapped and...and we agreed not to kill this stuff but to take a good look at it across the board over the summer and early fall. come back in the fall and pass out this legislation on agreed basis after we look at the whole thing and rather than do it on a piecemeal basis, do it uniformly so that we know exactly what we're doing. And I would request that the sponsor take this amendment...actually withdraw this amendment and...I don't think anybody here wants to vote against the mentally disabled and I don't think anybody wants to be recorded that way. But the fact is, we have reached the entire committee agreement and operated that way...whether it was a Democratic bill, a Republican the...the majority leader in the House had a bill that was very important to him, House Bill 330, which I handled for him and was not moved out for that very...very same reason. I had a bill, Senator Barkhausen had a bill, we...we did the same thing with those bills and have treated every bill, Democrat or Republican sponsored, House or Senate, in the same manner and I would request he withdraw the amendment.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Well, there are...are numerous lights. Senator DeAngelis.

SENATOR DeANGELIS:

My light is not on.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

It is now.

SENATOR DEANGELIS:

Well, let's hear from the people whose lights are on.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right. Senator Barkhausen.

SENATOR BARKHAUSEN:

I...I don't really mean to contradict what's been said before, but...the agreement, such as it was, was not entirely an agreement. I...I think it was largely...sort of a...an understanding or feeling on the part of the two Judiciary Committee chairmen in...in both Houses, and in some cases, I, as a minority spokesman, agreed with them on those...those bills that maybe were the most wide ranging and would have affected the highest number of ... of cases. But in this particular case, I must say that on this particular bill, Senator DeAngelis did ask me to...to handle it and I brought the bill up and I could see that there weren't the votes and the majority wanted to put it in...in the subcommittee where some of these other bills are to be considered, but...because it is...is a serious problem and doesn't affect that many cases, I would like to support Senator DeAngelis on his motion to adopt this particular amendment; and, you know, if we don't have the votes, we don't have the votes, but I... I don't think it was an across the board agreement, although I don't mean to...to say that the other side is misrepresenting the situation.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Okay. Well, let's hear from...from some more lights.

SENATOR NETSCH:

Well,...my question seems a little bit incongruent at the moment, but I...I am looking at what I...have as an amendment that eliminates the Auditor General's auditing of the funds of this severely retarded group and I can't understand why we would be doing that. If the...if they are, indeed, as

described by Senator DeAngelis, why would we not have the Auditor General audit the funds that are kept on their behalf?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

•••all right• Senator DeAngelis• even though your light is not on• Senator DeAngelis•

SENATOR DEANGELIS:

Well, Senator Netsch, that amendment has been adopted.

We're on a different one.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Netsch.

SENATOR NETSCH:

But...but...

SENATOR DEANGELIS:

I got enough problems with this one...I...

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEAUZIO)

Well, come on. Now, there...there are...there are...there are two hundred bills left...I mean,...if you want to stay here all night, it's...it's...it's fine with me. So let's...let's either get on with it. Senator Netsch.

SENATOR NETSCH:

Mell, my question still stands. I think it relates to the way you...at least that you have described this group of people for whom this...this current amendment is being proposed.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right. Further discussion? Senator Smith.

SENATOR SMITH:

Thank you, Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. I would like...in regards to Senate Bill 2808, I'd like to respond inasmuch as this bill came through the Health...Public Health and Welfare Committee. I understand...Senator DeAngelis...Senator DeAngelis, you were not able to be in committee and you asked Senator Topinka to

handle this for you. There was merely a technical amendment that was placed on in committee and this is the only reason why we released this. Now, this Amendment No. 2 that you have submitted here, we are completely ignorant about that and I would advise...or what I would suggest, if you would be kind enough, to just let this Amendment No. 2 die.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator DeAngelis.

SENATOR DEANGELIS:

Well, you know, I am finding out all kinds of new agreements that were made that I have absolutely no knowledge whatsoever, and from now on, I'm going to ask...instead of filing amendments on my bill, we will file agreements on my bill and that way we won't...somebody says there's an agreement to retroactively go back and not let these bills...this bill passed 116 to nothing out of the House, then you guys tell me that you cut a deal that said, well, we're not going to have those kind of bills this Session. Now, what kind of cockamamie stuff is that for Christ sake?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right. Now...now we have...we have four or five additional lights that are on and, you know, it just seems to me, I don't know what we're doing here, we're just...Senator DeAngelis.

SENATOR DEANGELIS:

Well, okay, I will relieve everybody of their problem. This is an administration bill for the Department of Mental Health and Developmental Disability. I do not want to mess up their bill by adding something on it, but I really do believe, Senator Marovitz, and whoever else is on that Judiciary Committee that...well, I think sometimes you've developed little smaller consensus rather than total consensus but, you know, this dominion of...we're not going to hear these kinds of bills or that kind of bills, I don't

think any other committee does that, I really don't. And I...I think that when you get to that...and I know that the lawyers are kind of an elitist group, but...but those of us here have as much respect for the law and respect for our constituents to submit what we consider to be sound proposals so the super intelligensia of the General Assembly, even though they operate of a cockamamie procedures...I will withdraw this because I...I want the Mental Health to carry their bill through, but I would...really would like an opportunity to discuss this further with the members of that committee, 'cause...let's not make ground rules that are retroactive.

Senator...Senator DeAngelis, are you withdrawing the total bill or just this amendment?

SENATOR DeANGELIS:

Oh, no, I'm just withdrawing this...

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Oh, just the...just the amendment? All right. Senator DeAngelis seeks leave of the Body to withdraw Amendment No. 3. Is...Amendment No. 3 is withdrawn. Further amendments?

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. HARRY)

No further amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

3rd reading. 2810, Senator Geo-Karis. House bills...House bills 2nd reading is House Bill 2810.

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. HARRY)

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. HARRY)

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Geo-Karis.

SENATOR GEO-KARIS:

Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate, to clarify the confusion that was caused last week and may I speak directly to the President of the Senate. I withdrew those two amendments that we had the questions about and we had an agreed amendment that was agreed to by your staff and our staff and I move for the passage of this amendment.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right. Senator Geo-Karis has moved adoption of Amendment No. 1 to House Dill 2810. Is there discussion? If not...if not, those in favor will indicate by saying Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. Amendment No. 1 is adopted. Further amendments?

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. HARRY)

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

SENATOR GEO-KARIS:

That's not the number, Mr. President, the number is 2276.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right, here we go. Senator Hall, what's the number of the bill that you...sought...you sought leave to...

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Barkhausen, this is Amendment No. 1...the first amendment was withdrawn. Senator Barkhausen.

SENATOR BARKHAUSEN:

Amendment No. 1, I'm sorry, to House Bill 2825 incorporates the provisions of Senate Bill 297 which I think and believe is...is unobjectionable but which never had a hearing the first time around in...in the Senate Judiciary Committee. It is meant to accomplish what we thought we were accomplishing either last year or two years ago in dealing with the Deceptive Practices Act in the area of bad checks. It dealt with checks issued to satisfy a credit obligation of one kind or another and what actually happened was that...was that the checks issued for credit transactions and in...not honored. in other words, bad checks were added to the criminal provisions of the Deceptive Practices Act but were not covered under the civil liability provisions of the Deceptive Practices Act. It was thought by the Retail Herchants Association, which had been the main proponent of this measure that that had been accomplished earlier and that, therefore, this bill was unnecessary; but when they took a closer look at it, they realized that the civil liability provisions that apply to...to other bad checks were for some reason omitted from...from this particular area involving checks issued to satisfy credit obligations and that's the reason for this particular amendment.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right. Senator Barkhausen has moved adoption of Amendment No. 1. Is there discussion? Senator...Senator Marovitz.

SENATOR MAROVITZ:

Well, first of all, has this amendment been distributed?

Well, I guess I, unfortunately, would ask that you take it out of the record so we can take a look at what it does. The bill didn't get a hearing, as you say, in Judiciary, I'm not sure why, is there some reason why it didn't get a hearing?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Barkhausen.

SENATOR BARKHAUSEN:

...yes, Chairman Marovitz, it was one of the...one of the several bills that didn't get a hearing the first time around and not for any particular reason other than lack of time. It's...it's a two-line amendment, I'd be...I will take it out of the record, if you want, but it's just a...a two-line amendment that adds this subsection to the...to the Deceptive Practices Act.

Senator Jacobs seeks leave of the Body to return House Bill 65 to the Order of 2nd Reading for the purpose of an amendment. Is leave granted? Leave is granted. On the Order of House Bills 2nd Reading is House Bill 65, Madam Secretary. SECRETARY:

Amendment No. 1 offered by Senator Jacobs.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Jacobs.

SENATOR JACOBS:

This amendment to House Bill 65 clarifies the original intent of the bill. This amendment was presented by the Department of Transportation. It keeps it in line with the

Federal guidelines; otherwise, we're in the process of perhaps losing some money if it went through in the...other vein and this clarifies that language to where it's fifty-five miles per hour except in the interstate system outside an...an urbanized area of fifty thousand population or more. The maximum speed limit is sixty-five miles per hour and still allows for sixty-five for trucks and I ask for its adoption.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right. Senator Jacobs has moved adoption of Amendment No. 1 to House Bill 65. Is there discussion? If not, those in favor will indicate by saying Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. Amendment No. 1 is adopted. Further amendments?

Thank you. Mr. President. Amendment No. 1 authorizes municipalities to establish a system of administrative adjudication for...municipal parking tickets or standing viola-This permits the municipality to file a certified report with the Secretary of State that an owner of a registered vehicle has ten or more unpaid parking tickets. After the municipality files the certified report, the Secretary of State shall suspend the driving privileges of such person owning the vehicle. There is an administrative procedure mechanism in the bill so that each municipality can establish by ordinance the procedure to implement the adjudication of parking ticket violations. Once the ordinance is in place, there are numerous...there are five notice provisions in the bill, a total of five, so that if a person does receive a ticket and he claims he...did not receive notice, a second notice is sent to that person and he can't come into court...I'm sorry, strike that, he can't come into this adjudication procedure where a hearing officer will preside and he can claim no liability on his part for the violation. Once he...once the...second notice is sent and he adjudicates the matter, upon the...adjudication of ten or more violations, the Secretary of State in a certification procedure at which another notice is sent to the person who is in violation in order for him to request a hearing on the suspension of his drivers license, at that point, a hearing is had and he can contest the matter at the Secretary of State's Office. There are numerous procedural safeguards in this bill and I would ask to adopt Amendment No. 1.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right. Senator D*Arco has moved the adoption of Amendment No. 1. Discussion? Senator Dudycz.

SENATOR DUDYCZ:

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator D'Arco.

SENATOR D'ARCO:

Well, what I'm saying is any time any person receives a parking ticket, not ten, receives one parking ticket, he has the opportunity to go before a hearing officer in an administrative procedure. Right now, as you know, the circuit court of the county is the repository of...of this adjudicatory procedure. We are changing that so...so a judge no longer is involved and the municipality gets involved so that we...we're trying to make it a very informal procedure. If you've got a parking ticket, you can...go from eight to five

on any given day of the week before somebody in some municipal building and say, I want to pay my fine, I didn*t...it is not my car that received this ticket, it belongs to somebody else, you made a mistake, you got the wrong license plate, whatever reason you suggest and the hearing officer makes a determination on the merits whether to vacate a finding or to find for the city and enter a judgment.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Dudycz.

SENATOR DUDYCZ:

Well, I still don't understand, Senator. Who would be...the administrative hearing officer on this, who would be appointed? Will this be a clerk, a police officer or just a...an appointee of the mayor or...of the courts or...or who? PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator D'Arco.

SENATOR D'ARCO:

I don't know maybe...no, I'm just kidding. It would a lawyer under Amendment No. 4, I believe or...Amendment No. 4 provides that...which we didn't get to yet, provides that the hearing officer will be appointed by the chief legal officer of the municipality and he must be a lawyer.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Dudycz.

SENATOR DUDYCZ:

So there are additional amendments that you're going file...or you're going to offer right away, this is not the only one.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator D'Arco.

SENATOR D'ARCO:

Yeah, if you let me get there, I will.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right. Further discussion? Senator Fawell.

SENATOR FAWELL:

Thank you, very much. Will the sponsor yield for a question? Senator, what you're really talking about is...is going back to the old JP system, isn't it? I mean, isn't that...you know, I...my former husband was a JP so I know something about it.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

I'm sorry...Senator D'Arco.

SENATOR D'ARCO:

Well, what we're trying to...we're trying to make it an informal procedure and, I guess, in that sense, it's...it's similar to the JP procedure.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Fawell.

SENATOR FAMELL:

Well, you know, in...in 1970, because unfortunately the JP system wasn't working, we passed a Constitutional Amendment which...which threw it out and I'm not saying that it didn't work all the time, but on the whole, the voters of the State of Illinois said, this is a lousy system. We are...are not happy with it, we should have associate judges which is what we went into. It's the associate judges that are hearing these tickets now. The associate judges are also appointed, they are also lawyers. You know, if you need more associate judges, I suppose you could do that, but I...I don't...you know, it's really going right back to where we were twenty years ago and I think you know that.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator ... Senator D'Arco.

SENATOR D'ARCO:

What...did she say I think I know it? What did you say?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Fawell.

SENATOR FAWELL:

Maybe you're not that old, I am. I think...you know, let me assure you that's what the JP system was.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEAUZIO)

All right. Further discussion? If not, Senator D'Arco has moved the...Senator D'Arco.

SENATOR D'ARCO:

...what I said was, it was similar in the sense that it...it would be an informal procedure. I didn't say it was like the JP system was. I said in that one respect it might be like the...JP system was. This is an entirely different procedure. This procedure provides for complete access of people to go into a hearing room at any time. Now, as you know. they...they get a date from the policeman to appear court thirty days hence. This...under this system. they can go in the day after they get a ticket and adjudicate the matter before a hearing officer. We're trying to expedite this situation. In reality, a judge will refuse to issue a warrant for people that have accumulated parking tickets, that's part of the problem. We want to get that money flowing into the municipality and scare people a little bit who have accumulated unpaid parking tickets into paying those tickets. So.... I move to adopt Amendment No. 1.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right. Further discussion? If not, Senator D*Arco has moved the adoption of Committee Amendment No. 1 to House Bill 213. Those in favor will indicate by saying Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. Senator Fawell has requested a roll call. Senator Fawell.

SENATOR FAHELL:

Yes.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

No, we were real...we were doing real good till we

SENATOR D'ARCO:

All right. Go ahead.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator D'Arco has moved...the adoption of Amendment No.

1...committee...the committee amendment...to

number...Committee Amendment No. 1 to House Eill 213. Those
in favor will vote Aye. Those opposed will vote Nay. The

voting is open. Have all voted who wish? Have all voted who

wish? Have all voted who wish? Take the record. On that

question, the Ayes are 31, the Nays are 13, 1 voting Present.

Amendment...Committee Amendment No. 1 is adopted. Further

committee amendments?

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. HARRY)

No further committee amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Any amendments from the Floor?

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. HARRY)

Amendment No. 2 offered by Senator D'Arco.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator D'Arco.

SENATOR D'ARCO:

Mr. President, there was some question raised by nonresidents of ... of municipalities on how the municipality would deal with that issue, and that's what Amendment No. 2 does. It says that "The municipality will set up a procedure by which nonresidents of the municipality may contest the merits of the violation without attending a hearing." You know, ... if ... if a downstater gets a ticket, it could be a problem in Chicago or somewhere else, and this is going to expedite that situation. I move to adopt Amendment No. 2.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator D'Arco has moved the adoption of Amendment No. 2. Discussion? Senator Dudycz.

SENATOR DUDYCZ:

Thank you, Mr. President. I think I understand what Senator D'Arco is trying to do and he explained it in Amend-ment No. 1. But he...during the debate on Amendment No. 1 he

mentioned that there will be several amendments offered on the Floor and nobody on this side has seen any of the Floor amendments. I'd just like to know, have any of them been distributed?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator D'Arco.

SENATOR D'ARCO:

No, we haven't distributed the amendments. I mean, if...if...we'd like to expedite...what...can we just distribute them to you, I mean, would that satisfy everybody or what?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator ... Senator Dudycz.

SENATOR DUDYCZ:

We'd like for them to be distributed to everybody.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Well, Senator Dudycz, are you joined by five members? More than five members. Senator D*Arco.

SENATOR D'ARCO:

All right. Is it six o'clock yet? Why don't we adjourn and...we'll do this tomorrow, how's that?

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

...all right. Mait a minute. All right. We have already adopted the committee amendment and therefore we will just...we will just leave it right where it is in a nice comfortable spot, and we will take it up again sometime in the future. All right. This is a very good place to stop. We're at the bottom of the page...we do have some more business. Senator Donahue.

SENATOR DONAHUE:

Thank you, Mr. President. I think there...we adopted an amendment on House Bill 47 that was incorrect.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right. Before...before anybody gets away, we're

going to be starting tomorrow morning, ten o'clock on the button, ten o'clock sharp. Now...Senator Donahue.

SENATOR DONAHUE:

Would like to seek leave to move House Bill 47 from 3rd reading back to 2nd for the purposes of Tabling an amend-ment.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right. Now, there was an error earlier in the day by virtue of the explanation of amendment...Committee Amendment No. 2 and, therefore, for the enrolling and the engrossing part of this we ought to conclude this today. Senator Donahue, we will...with leave of the Body, we will go to the Order of House Bills 3rd Reading. Senator Donahue seeks leave of the Body to return House Bill 47 to the Order of 2nd Reading for the purpose of Tabling a committee amendment. Is leave granted? Leave is granted. On the Order of House Bills 2nd Reading, Mr. Secretary, do we physically have the bill here? 47? All right. House Bill 47. On the Order of House Bills 2nd Reading is House Bill 47. Senator Donahue. SENATOR DONAHUE:

Well, thank you, Mr. President. It's my understanding that an amendment that actually failed in committee was brought through...by...through the clerk's office, and there was an error made in that amendment, in fact, was never adopted in committee.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Donahue moves to Table Committee Amendment No. 2 to House Bill 47. Is there...discussion on this motion? All right. I beg your pardon. That is the proper motion. Senator Donahue having voting on the prevailing side moves to reconsider the vote by which Committee Amendment No. 2 was adopted. Those in favor will indicate by saying Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. The vote is reconsidered. Senator Donahue now moves to Table Committee Amendment No. 2

to House Bill 47. Those in favor will indicate by saying Aye. Opposed Nay. The Ayes have it. Committee Amendment No. 2 is Tabled. Further committee amendments?

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. HARRY)

No further amendments.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

3rd reading. Now, Senator Geo-Karis, for what purpose do you have your light on again?

SENATOR GEO-KARIS:

Well, I'll tell you, this is...the Chair had agreed with Senator Hall that 2276 would be brought...you know, you would call it now so I can put an amendment on it. And this has been an agreement with Senator Hall.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Well, we...we.ve skipped over several other bills besides this one; you know, if we get to this one, we ought to get to every one. So, we'll get to that right off the bat in the morning. Is there further business to come before the Senate? Senator Marovitz.

SENATOR MAROVITZ:

Thank you, very much, Mr. President. I'd ask leave to be listed as a hyphenated principal sponsor on Senate Bill 958.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senate bill?

SENATOR MAROVITZ:

Senate bill.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right. Senator Harovitz seeks leave of the Body to be added as a hyphenated cosponsor of Senate Bill 958. Is leave granted? Leave is granted. So ordered. Now, tomorrow morning at ten o'clock when we begin, we will go directly to the Order of Recalls. We'll start on recalls, there will be a new...a new recall list that will be passed out. Further business to come before the Senate? All right. Resolutions.

ACTING SECRETARY: (MR. HARRY)

Senate Joint Resolution 70 offered by Senator Schaffer.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEHUZIO)

Consent Calendar. Senator Severns, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR SEVERNS:

Thank you, Ar. President, members of the Senate. I would like to request leave of the Body for three...items; one to have Senators Madigan, Luft and Woodyard added as hyphenated cosponsors to House 3ill 706. Also...

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)
