PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right. Senator Rea.

## SENATOR REA:

Mr. President. I would move that Senate Joint Thank you, discharged from committee for Resolution 114 he And basically what this -- it is agreed on both consideration. sides of the aisle. Basically what it does is to request that the Governor and the Illinois Congressional Delegation be urged to request that the President and Congress move along with the appropriations from the Land and Water Conservation Fund to the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service. And this project is moving much rapidly -- much more rapidly than we had initially expected. I would move for its adoption.

## PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right. Is there discussion? Senator Donahue. All right. there discussion? All right. If not, Senator Rea has moved the adoption -- Senator Rea, we -- we had not yet assigned it So -- Senator Rea has moved the adoption of Senate Joint Resolution 114. SECRETARY HAWKER:

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right. Senator Rock moves the adoption of the Senate Resolutions Consent Calendar. Those in favor will indicate by saying Aye. Opposed, Nay. The Ayes have it. SECRETARY HAWKER:

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Rock.

SENATOR ROCK:

Thank -- thank you, Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. This is the adjournment resolution. It calls for us to return to Springfield next Wednesday at the hour of noon, and I would just like to reemphasize that the intent of both the Speaker and myself, and the Minority Leader, was to have joint committee hearings so that we can expedite the process. So that our -- from our side, Appropriations I and II will meet in joint -- in a joint effort with the House both on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday if necessary, for the purpose of coming to grips with this budget crisis; but I invite all Members to participate. This is the adjournment resolution - calls for us to return to Springfield next Wednesday at noon, and I would move to suspend the rules for its immediate consideration and adoption.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Is there discussion? Senator Rock has moved to suspend the rules for the immediate consideration and adoption of Senate Joint

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Resolution 115. Those in favor, indicate by saying Aye. Opposed, Nay. The Ayes have it. The rules are suspended. Senator Rock now moves the adoption of Senate Joint Resolution 115, which is the adjournment resolution. All in favor, indicate by saying Aye. Opposed, Nay. The Ayes have it. The -- Senate Joint Resolution 115 is adopted. We have one remaining item. Two resolutions have been filed. Resolutions, Madam Secretary. With leave of the Body.

## SENATOR HALL:

## PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Just a moment, Senator Hall. All right. Ladies and Gentlemen, we have a -- a death resolution. We would like to have all of our Members to please be in your seat. All unauthorized personnel please vacate. Will all Members please get in your seat? ... (machine cutoff)...Luft, it's to the right. Senator Jones, for what purpose do you arise?

## SENATOR JONES:

Yeah. Thank you, Mr. President. I move for the immediate consideration of Senate -- Senate Resolution 954 and ask for suspension of the rules.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

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All right. Senator Jones, do you wish to have that read? SENATOR JONES:

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Senator Jones.

## SENATOR JONES

Yeah. Thank you, Mr. President. Having had the opportunity to know the former Representative Otis Collins -- and he championed the cause, as it was so spoke in the resolution, on insurance redlining. He was elected from the west side of the City of Chicago. And coming to the General Assembly, I got to know him quite well, and those issues that he fought for are still issues that we still deal with today. He -- and he served with distinction. He was a very honorable person, and I move the adoption of this resolution.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

All right. Senator Jones has moved the adoption of Senate Resolution 954. Further discussion? Senator Hall.

#### SENATOR HALL:

Thank you, Mr. President and Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate. I can well remember back when we first came here - when I'm saying "we" first came here, that was Senator Vadalabene, Senator Savickas, Senator Pate Philip and the late Mayor Harold Washington of Chicago, and yours truly here - that he was a man of -- an outstanding gentleman. A man that bent over backwards to help all of the new people who had arrived. I'm talking about

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back almost twenty-six years ago. So I'd just like to make note that he was a fellow that -- we all were Members of the House in those times, and the big respect that all of us had for him - and especially to his people, and immediate family.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR DEMUZIO)

Further discussion? If not, Senator Jones has moved the adoption of Senate Resolution 954. All those in favor will please rise. Senate Joint -- Senate Resolution 954 is adopted. Further business to come before the Senate? Senator Rock now moves that the Senate stand adjourned till -- Senator Hall.
