Gentlemen of the Senate. Today we are indeed honored, because the first time before any Legislature in the United States, we indeed have one of our consulates, the Consulate of a Free Lithuania - a consulate which has been in existence in Chicago for many, many years in exile, but now is indeed a consulate in and of itself and rightfully so, as we have seen Lithuania emerge miraculously from under the Russian boot, has gone on to become a member of the United Nations, after many, many long years of trying to sustain the fight for freedom and democracy. Today I would like to present to you Vaclovas Kleiza, and his good wife, Asta. He was born in Lithuania. and received his BS from the University of Illinois in Urbana and his MSW from Lovola University in Chicago. So he has much in common with many of us here, and certainly has strong ties to the State of Illinois. He has been active in the Lithuanian-American community for many years, and was appointed Consul General of Lithuania on December 3rd, 1985. Considering the miracle of the Balkans, considering the miracle of Eastern Europe and democracy, which has indeed come to all of and as they try and -- and follow and become a -- a member of the community of nations and -- and hold -- hold true to many of the tenants that we indeed hold dear, please, if you will, welcome Consul General of Lithuania, Vaclovas Kleiza, and his good wife, Asta.

CONSUL GENERAL VACLOVAS KLEIZA:

Mr. President, the Honorable Judy Topinka, distinguished Members of the Senate, Ladies and Gentlemen - it is with great pleasure and honor that I address this outstanding Body of Legislators. Since the beginning of this century, Illinois - and more specifically, Chicago - has been the home of the largest Lithuanian community outside of Lithuania. This consular post was established on February 16th, 1924; therefore, we have been together for a long time, and Illinois has a very special place in

the hearts of Lithuanians. Throughout the years. the Governor's Office, the Senate and the House of Representatives continuously supported Lithuania's struggle for independence. All Lithuanians are very grateful to you, and today I would like to convey their appreciation, in person, to each and every one ٥f vou, Today, Lithuania is facing enormous individually. task ٥f spiritual, political and economic rebuilding. She's seeking participate in creation of sound business opportunities which will promote the interests of, and benefit, all parties. We hope that Illinois industrial, commercial and educational institutions, with the support of their State Government, can begin to form mutually productive relationships with the Republic of Lithuania. We are very delighted that the Honorable Michael Madigan, Speaker of House, has invited a group of Lithuanian parliamentarians who will be visiting with you during the week of October 21st. This type of cooperation and exchange is welcomed and encouraged. again express my sincere appreciation for this opportunity to address you, and I hope that we can reciprocate and invite you soon to visit our Supreme Council in Vilnius. Thank you very much.

SENATOR TOPINKA:

I would be remiss in not noting that one of our Members — although not present today — Senator Frank Savickas, is indeed of Lithuanian—American ancestry, and a very strong supporter of the Lithuanian community. Before I step down, too, we do have another guest who's with us — though she does not wish to speak to us because she's a little shy about her English — and that is Anna Roschova from Czechoslovakia, where she is a judge, a lawyer and a legislator, which is an interesting combination, folks. And she has been visiting. If you'll stand up, Anna, and we will welcome you indeed. She and some of her colleagues from the Czech Parliament — Czechoslovak Parliament — are here visiting for four

weeks and learning how Illinois runs. And I have to share with you that we will be making a copy of the Illinois State Statutes available to her and her colleagues as a jumping-off point for how Czechoslovakia looks at democracy. So if there are any mistakes in the future that -- that occur in Czechoslovakia, it's because they're using the law that we made in Illinois. So, Gentlemen and Ladies, let us do a good job. Thank you very much.
