PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HALVORSON)

The First Special Session of the 93rd General Assembly will please come to order. Will the Members please be at their desks? And will our guests in the galleries please rise? The invocation today will be given by Pastor Jerry Doss of Abundant Faith Christian Center in Springfield.

### PASTOR JERRY DOSS:

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HALVORSON)

Please remain standing for the Pledge. Senator Maloney.

### SENATOR MALONEY:

(Pledge of Allegiance, led by Senator Maloney)

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HALVORSON)

Madam Secretary, Reading and Approval of the Journal.

### SECRETARY HAWKER:

Senate Journal of Wednesday, July 14, 2004, from the First Special Session.

PRESIDING OFFICER: (SENATOR HALVORSON)

Senator Haine.

### SENATOR HAINE:
